It is my pleasure to appoint Ms. Dianne Harnell-Cohen as Commissioner for the Department of Parks, Recreation and Cultural Affairs. As you know, Ms. Harnell-Cohen has served as Acting Commissioner for the past eight months, done an excellent job and has been an asset to our administration. Ms. Harnell-Cohen has over 18 years of senior management and supervisory experience.
