


A Resolution
By Councilmembers Debi Starnes and Clair Muller

A Resolution stating the City Council's position regarding the millage rate set by the Atlanta Public School System which does not neutralize the tax re-appraisals for approximately 50% of the taxes due the Atlanta Public School System.

WHEREAS, the City of Atlanta set the millage rate for property taxes at a lower rate for 2003 in order to neutralize the tax re-appraisals for approximately 25% of taxes due the City of Atlanta ;and

WHEREAS, Fulton County Commission set the millage rate for property taxes at a lower rate for 2003 in order to neutralize the tax re-appraisals for approximately 30% of taxes due the County of Fulton; and

WHEREAS, the Atlanta Public School System set its millage rate for property taxes at a rate that does not neutralize the tax re-appraisals for approximately 50% of taxes due the Atlanta Public Schools.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Atlanta City Council is disappointed in the above decision by the Atlanta Board of Education and feel the millage rate set by them is not in the best interest of the citizens of Atlanta;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if we had the legal option of not approving the millage rate set by the Atlanta Board of Education, we would have not.
