



A strong and involved Atlanta community leader, Loretta W. Green moved to Atlanta in 1971 when her job with Southern Company transferred her to the City. Following her employment with the Southern Company, she enjoyed a distinguished career with several major communications companies, including Honeywell and Digital. She retired from Verizon in 2002.

Ms. Green moved to the Meadowbrook Forrest Community in Southwest Atlanta in 1974. Seeing the need to promote family and cohesive neighborhood values, she helped organize the Meadowbrook Forrest Community. She served as President for 15 consecutive years. Her neighbors and friends know her as a staunch aggressive leader; always demanding and expecting personal responsibility from neighbors and a high delivery of basic city services.

As a result of her tenaciousness and leadership, the Meadowbrook Forrest Community has remained safe and stable at a time when many Southwest Atlanta neighborhoods have experienced transition and rising crime rates. Under Ms. Green's leadership, the community has held many, many clean-up campaigns which involved the support of the local business community.

Ms. Green was praised by Neighborhood Planning Unit "R" and received city-wide recognition for her aggressive and successful campaign to rid Southwest Atlanta of the blight, embarrassment, and health and safety issues created by the unsightly, boarded-up King's Ridge Apartment complex. Under Ms. Green leadership, neighbors picketed focusing the attention and public scrutiny of television stations and other major media outlets. To the joy of the larger community, the abandon apartment complex was finally demolished in 1999. Today, the beautiful Cascade Parc subdivision has been built on the land adding value and welcoming hundreds of new residents to the community.

Mr. Green became active within Neighborhood Planning Unit "R" shortly after moving into Southwest Atlanta. The leadership teams with the NPU have always looked to her for advice, counsel and support for a variety of sensitive community issues; including transportation, economic development, public education and crime and safety. Within the NPU, Ms. Green has served as Vice President, APAB Representative, chair of the Land Use and Public Safety Committees. She has also served the larger Southwest Atlanta Community as a member of the Citizens Advisory Council for the Atlanta Police Department's Zone 4.

A member of the Olivet Baptist Church of Christ in Fayetteville, Ms. Green is the proud mother of an adult daughter who teaches within the Fulton County Public School System. Still involved and actively engaged in community building activities,
