AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING BUSINESS TRAVELER SERVICES, INC. TO PROVIDE, AND THE CITY TO ACCEPT, AIRPORT BUSINESS SERVICES AT HARTSFIELD-JACKSON ATLANTA INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT UNDER THE TERMS SET FORTH IN CONTRACT FC-6215-95, BEGINNING FEBRUARY 1, 2008 AND CONTINUING UNTIL THE CITY PROCURES AND EXECUTES A NEW AGREEMENT FOR AIRPORT BUSINESS SERVICES, BUT NOT TO EXTEND BEYOND APRIL 30, 2008; AUTHORIZING THE CITY TO WAIVE THE COMPETITIVE SOURCE SELECTION REQUIREMENTS CONTAINED IN SECTION 2-1187, 2-1188, AND 2-1189 OF ARTICLE X, PROCUREMENT AND REAL ESTATE CODE, AS WELL AS ANY OTHER CONFLICTING PROVISIONS OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA CODE OF ORDINANCES; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the City of Atlanta (the "City"), as owner and operator of the Hartsfield Jackson Atlanta International Airport (the "Airport") entered into Concession Agreement FC-6215-95 (the "Lease") with Business Traveler Services, Inc. ("BTS"), which became effective on January 31, 1996, for the establishment and operation of Airport business services concessions in designated locations in the Central Passenger Terminal Complex at the Airport; and

WHEREAS, by Ordinance 07-O-1798, the City Council approved the extension of the Lease, on a month-to-month basis, through January 31, 2008; and

WHEREAS, efforts to complete the procurement of business services are ongoing, and the Department of Aviation believes that the process will be completed by April 30, 2008; and

WHEREAS, it is in the City's best interest to provide for the continuation of Airport business services until such time as the procurement of a new business services agreement has been completed; and

WHEREAS, the Aviation General Manager and Chief Procurement Officer have recommended that BTS be authorized to continue providing airport business services, uninterrupted, and the City be authorized to accept such services, under the terms set forth in Contract FC-6215-95, until such time as a new contract for airport business services has been procured and executed.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA, GEORGIA, HEREBY ORDAINS:

SECTION 1: That Business Traveler Services, Inc. is authorized to provide Airport business services, and the City is authorized to accept such services, under the terms set

forth in Contract FC-6215-95, beginning on February 1, 2008 and continuing until the earlier of: 1) the date the City executes a new agreement for Airport business services; or 2) April 30, 2008.

SECTION 2: That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance, including, but not limited to Section 2-1187, 2-1188 and 2-1189 of the City of Atlanta Code of Ordinances, are waived to the extent of the conflict.

Example: The task force of homelessness conducted a study regarding homelessness, its impact and consequences on the City. This resolution reflects the Mayor's desire to open a twenty-four hour center that will respond to the needs of the homelessness in Atlanta.

The City of Atlanta (the "City"), as owner and operator of the Hartsfield Jackson Atlanta International Airport (the "Airport") has hereto entered into Concession Agreement (FC-6215-95) with Business Traveler Services, Inc. incorporating Amendments No. 1, No. 2, and No. 3 (" Lease Agreement") for the establishment and operation of a business services concessions in designated locations in the Central Passenger Terminal Complex at the Airport for a term of five years commencing April 1, 1996, with the City having the option to extend the term for an additional five year period; and

Resolution No. 96-R-0205 adopted February 19-27, 1996 and approved March 3, 1996 established the commencement date of the Lease Agreement as April 30, 1996 and increased the term of the Lease Agreement by six months to account for unanticipated pre-Olympic construction cost (Amendment No.1) and Resolution No. 01-R-0217 adopted February 19, 2001 and approved February 24, 2001 authorized the Mayor to exercise the City's option to extend the Lease Agreement an additional five year term as set forth in Section 2.2 of the Lease Agreement (Amendment No. 2); and

Resolution No. 04-R-1896 adopted November 01, 2004 and approved November 05, 2004 added approximately 127.34 square feet of space on the boarding level of Concourse C (Amendment No. 3); and

Amendment No.1 and Amendment No. 2 incorporating the Lease Agreement established a ten year and six month term which determines the Lease Agreement expiration date as October 31, 2006; and

The Chief Procurement Officer on October 18, 2006 authorized a ninety day extension establishing the expiration date as January 31, 2007; and

Ordinance 06-O-2703 established August 31, 2007 as the expiration date.

Ordinance 07-O-1998 approved by City Council September 4, 2007 extending the term of the Lease month to month through January 31, 2008.

The City of Atlanta, and Hartsfield Air Ventures (HAV) entered into an Agreement and Lease of Premises dated June 1, 1996, incorporating Amendments No. 1 through No. 2 (hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Lease Agreement"), and uses certain premises and facilities in the Terminal Building and Concourses of the Central Passenger Terminal Complex at Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport;

Resolution No. 96-R-0205 adopted February 19-27, 1996 and approved March 3, 1996 established the commencement date of the Lease Agreement as April 30, 1996 and increased the term of the Lease Agreement 354 days to account for unanticipated pre-Olympic construction cost (Amendment No. 1);

Ordinance No. 00-O-0983 adopted August 7, 2000 and approved August 13, 2000 extended the lease agreement for one additional period of five (5) years and adjusted the method of calculating the Minimum Annual Guarantee (MAG) using the tenant's 1999 MAG as a base (Amendment No. 2);

Amendment No.1 and Amendment No.2 incorporating the Lease Agreement established a ten year and 354 day term which determines the Lease Agreement expiration date as April 15, 2007;

Ordinance No 06-O2704 established the contract expiration date as August 31, 2007;

Ordinance 07-O-1999 approved by City Council September 4, 2007 extended the term of the Lease month to month through January 31, 2008, increased the percentage rental fee for all news and gift stores to 17% and 15% for all other stores with the exception of electronic which will remain at 11% and also decrease the minimum annual guarantee to \$4.2 million.
