

**AN ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE TO REPEAL CHAPTER 30, ARTICLE VII, DOOR TO DOOR SALES, OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA CODE OF ORDINANCES, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, Article VII of Chapter 30 (Code Sections 30-596 through 30-619) of the Code of Ordinances (“Code”) of the City of Atlanta (“City”) requires that all persons or businesses engaged in door to door sales in the City must first obtain a permit from the City; and

WHEREAS, the door to door sales permitting process requires that application be made to the mayor, and further requires that each such application shall be fully investigated by the mayor who shall then make a determination as to whether to approve such application; and

WHEREAS, to the extent that persons or businesses that are engaged in door to door sales, such persons and businesses do not file such applications with the mayor; and

WHEREAS, there is no effective method of ensuring that such persons and businesses comply with the requirements of Article VII of Chapter 30 of the Code.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA, GEORGIA, HEREBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: That Code Sections 30-596 through 30-619 which comprise Article VII of Chapter 30 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Atlanta, pertaining to the establishment of processes and requirements for the issuance and reissuance of door to door sales permits are hereby repealed in their entirety, with said sections to be hereby redesignated as “Reserved”.

SECTION 2: That all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of the conflict.
