WHEREAS, On February 1, 1960, four African American college students sat down at a lunch counter at the Woolworth's in Greensboro, North Carolina, and helped ignite a youth-led movement to challenge racial inequality throughout the South; and

WHEREAS, As a direct result of these actions, students at the Atlanta University Center (AUC) Colleges (Morehouse College, Spelman College, Clark College, Atlanta University, Morris Brown College and the Interdenominational Theological Center) created the Committee for the Appeal for Human Rights (COAHR); and

WHEREAS, Lonnie King, Julian Bond, Carolyn Long, Marian Wright Edelman among others students, formed the original Committee, and published An Appeal for Human Rights on March 9, 1960, which advocated for an end to racial segregation through non-violent means; and

WHEREAS, The Appeal stated, "We do not intend to wait placidly for those rights which are already legally ours . . . We must say in all candor that we plan to use every legal and nonviolent means at our disposal to secure full citizenship rights as members of this great Democracy of ours."; and

WHEREAS, Two hundred AUC students launched the Atlanta Student Movement and participated in sit-ins beginning on March 15, 1960 targeting facilities at government buildings and interstate bus and train terminals; and

WHEREAS, the actions of these courageous students grew into a movement that would change the face of the South, the United States and the world.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA, GEORGIA, as follows:

Section 1: That a Commission of nineteen individuals is impaneled to determine an honor memorializing the Atlanta Student Movement in the City of Atlanta.



Section 2: The Commission composition would be as follows:

- One member appointed by the Mayor;
- One member appointed by the President of Council;
- Three members appointed by the paired Council Groupings;
- One member appointed by Concerned Black Clergy;
- One member appointed by the Atlanta chapter of The National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP);
- One member appointed by the Atlanta chapter of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC);
- One member each appointed by the Presidents of the Atlanta University Center (Morehouse College, Spelman College, Clark Atlanta University, Morris Brown College, the Interdenominational Theological Center);
- One member appointed by the Student Non Violent Coordinating Committee (SNCC);
- One member appointed by the Coalition for the People's Agenda;
- One member appointed by Rush Memorial Congregational Church;
- One member appointed by the King Center;
- One member appointed by the Atlanta-North Georgia Labor Council;
- One member appointed by the Atlanta Black-Jewish Coalition;

Section 3: Upon adoption and approval of this resolution, the Municipal Clerk is hereby directed to contact the individuals and organizations listed above requesting that they submit the names of their appointees along with a copy of each person's resume no later than June 28, 2010.

Section 4: All resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby rescinded.
