


Carolyn Long Banks

Carolyn Long Banks has served on the Atlanta City Council since 1980 when members of Council elected her to fill a vacancy, making her the first African-American woman to serve on the Council.

Councilmember Banks has gained national recognition for her involvement with the National League of Cities, one of the nation's preeminent leadership organizations. In 1995, she became the first Atlanta City Councilmember to serve as president of the NLC. As the spokesperson for 200,000 local elected officials in 17,000 cities and towns across the nation, Councilmember Banks shapes NLC's legislative agenda, testifies before Congress on behalf of the nation's cities and meets frequently with President Bill Clinton and members of

Congress. Bank's service with NLC extends from the board of directors to various committees, including past president of Women in Municipal Government and National Black Caucus of Local Elected Officials.

A fourth generation Atlantan, Carolyn was one of the organizers of the 1960's student movement in Atlanta which ultimately led to the integration of the city's public facilities. She is a graduate of Henry McNeil Turner High School, Clark College and Georgia State University.

Her state affiliations include membership on the Board of Directors of the Georgia Municipal Association (GMA) and a longterm member of the Georgia Association of Black Elected Officials (GABEO). She has served as president of the GMA's Fifth District and chair of the GMA's Public Safety and Criminal Justice Committee and Violence Task Force on Racism, Bigotry and Prejudice.

Councilwoman Banks is a member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., the Atlanta Business League, the National Business League, the Atlanta Regional Minority Purchasing Council, the Atlanta Chamber of

Commerce and 100 Black Women of Atlanta. She is also a graduate of Leadership Atlanta and of the University of Georgia Municipal Leadership Institute.

Councilmember Banks has also been the recipient of numerous awards and honors, including a Presidential Citation from the National Business League, the United Way's Outstanding Achievement Award and appointment as a member of the Board of Directors of the United States Department of Justice Conference Award.

Professionally, Carolyn has taught high school English, worked as a buyer for Rich's Department Store, served as Chief Operating Officer of Minority Training and Assistance Partnership, Inc. and most recently served as the Director of Community Affairs at Clark Atlanta University.

Carolyn is a member of St. Paul of the Cross Catholic Church. Members of her immediate family are her father, Mr. Ralph A. Long, Sr.; daughter and son in-law, April and Horace Wyatt and son, James H. Banks, Jr.
