



## **Alethea W. Boone**

Mrs. Alethea W. Boone, Chief Executive Officer and co-founder of the Joseph E. Boone Memorial Foundation, has committed the greater portion of her life to serving humanity through religious, educational and community involvement.

Mrs. Boone was reared in Selma, Alabama where she completed her high school education at the Alabama Lutheran Academy. While in high school, she taught free piano lessons to students who desired to learn this skill. She was an accompanist for youth at many church conferences as well as youth talent shows that were sponsored by the Elks.

While matriculating at Talladega College, Mrs. Boone enhanced her innate leadership and language talents through an array of experiences. These experiences included president of the Foster Hall House Council; secretary of Chi Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated; secretary to the Dean of Women, College Marshall; YWCA and Little Theater. As a Foreign Language major, Mrs. Boone studied the French language and culture on the island of Martinique, French West Indies. For her outstanding academic achievement, she was named and maintained the honor of being a Sumner Scholar upon graduation.

The highlights of Mrs. Boone's career were many while serving the students at Booker T. Washington High School. In 1962, she received the NDEA Level I Institute Award for study at Rutgers, the State University, New Brunswick, New Jersey. She received the Level II NDEA Institute Award in 1963 from Emory University. The latter award enabled her to study and travel throughout France.

In 1970, public school desegregation resulted in staff reassignments. Mrs. Boone was transferred to John F. Kennedy Middle School where she taught for the next twenty-eight years. She traveled with her students to Washington, District of Columbia; Asheville, North Carolina; Memphis and Nashville, Tennessee. For more than twelve years, Kennedy students received awards for maintaining the status of most outstanding middle school in foreign languages.

Mrs. Boone serves the metropolitan Atlanta community as a Fulton County poll worker, a deputy registrar, a volunteer for seventeen years with Youthfest and as a member of the Boulder Park Community Club. She is a member of the Talladega Alumni Club, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated, the NAACP and the League of Women Voters. Mrs. Boone is a member of the Rush Memorial Church where she is organist, parliamentarian for church meetings and president of the Women's Fellowship.

Mrs. Boone is an accomplished entrepreneur who served as the Chief Executive Officer of Paragon Plastics from 1994 until 2001. This company supplied carryout bags to Kmart stores throughout the southeastern region of the United States. As a thirty year Avon representative, Mrs. Boone achieved the goal of McConnell Club.
