Brief Bio

Charles A. Black

Charles is a professional actor on stage, screen and television, a Special Correspondent for *The Atlanta Inquirer* newspaper, and a Public Involvement Consultant for DW & Associates. He serves on the Executive Committee of the Atlanta NAACP and on the boards of Hammonds House Museum, Peachtree Hope Charter School (Vice Chairman), and Illian Adoptions International (Chairman). He is a volunteer with a number of community service groups.

Charles serves on the board of a national peace advocacy non-profit organization, PeaceActs, which held a national Peace forum at the Carter Center in May 2008 for which he was Moderator. He was also Moderator for a National Urban Fellows leadership forum at the Carter Center in 2008, and a Leadership Atlanta forum on Affirmative Action at the center several years earlier. He is a 1971 alumnus of Leadership Atlanta.

A native of Miami, Florida, Black declined an Early Admission scholarship to Morehouse College to remain at Miami Northwestern Senior High School to serve as President of the student government. Entering Morehouse in 1958, he served as Editor of the school newspaper, member of the varsity debate team, senior class President, and succeeded Lonnie King Jr. as Chairman of the Atlanta Student Movement.

Black's past work includes service as Editor of *The Atlanta Inquirer*, manager with Economic Opportunity Atlanta, U. S. Dept. of HEW, FEMA, and Mathis Dairy, CEO of a national consulting firm, Frontiers Unlimited, and as organizer and advisor on numerous political and civic campaigns. He is often sought as a speaker for programs on Africa, Peace, Civil Rights, Leadership, and other matters of civic import.
