**WHEREAS**, the City is required to submit to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development Atlanta's 2011 Annual Action Plan for the 2010-2014 Consolidated Plan; and

**WHEREAS**, the Annual Action Plan includes project allocations for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG); Emergency Shelter Grant (ESG); HOME Investment Partnership Program (HOME); and the Housing Opportunities For Persons With AIDS (HOPWA).

**NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA, GEORGIA, HEREBY RESOLVES** that the Mayor or designee is hereby authorized to submit to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development Atlanta's 2011 Annual Action Plan of the 2010-2014 Consolidated Plan which includes the Year 2011 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program in the amount of \$8,393,411.00, the Year 2011 Emergency Shelter Grant (ESG) Program in the amount of \$370,000.00, the Year 2011 HOME Investment Partnership Program (HOME) in the amount of \$3,893,806.00, and the Year 2011 Housing Opportunities For Persons With AIDS (HOPWA) Program in the amount of \$9,389,079.00.


