


A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO SUBMIT TO THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT THE CITY OF ATLANTA'S 2012 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN FOR THE 2010-2014 CONSOLIDATED PLAN TO INCLUDE APPLICATIONS FOR THE 2012 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) PROGRAM, 2012 EMERGENCY SOLUTIONS GRANT (ESG) PROGRAM, 2012 HOME INVESTMENT PARTNERSHIP (HOME) PROGRAM, AND THE 2012 HOUSING OPPORTUNITIES FOR PERSONS WITH AIDS (HOPWA) PROGRAM; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

WHEREAS, in order to receive federal funding, the City of Atlanta (the "City") is required to submit to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development Atlanta's 2012 Annual Action Plan for the 2010-2014 Consolidated Plan; and

WHEREAS, the 2012 Annual Action Plan includes project allocations for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG); Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG); HOME Investment Partnership Program (HOME); and the Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA).


NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA, GEORGIA, HEREBY RESOLVES, that the Mayor or designee is hereby authorized to submit to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development Atlanta's 2012 Annual Action Plan (AAP) of the 2010-2014 Consolidated Plan which includes the Year 2012 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program in the amount of Five Million, Nine Hundred Sixty Five Thousand, Fifty One Dollars and No Cents (\$5,965,051.00), the Year 2012 Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) Program in the amount of Four Hundred Seventy Two Thousand Four Hundred Seventy Dollars and No Cents (\$472,470.00), the Year 2012 HOME Investment Partnership Program (HOME) in the amount of Three Million Ninety Thousand, Six Hundred Ninety Three Dollars and No Cents (\$3,090,693.00), and the Year 2012 Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) Program in the amount of Nine Million, Seven Hundred and Four Thousand, Seven Hundred and Ninety One Dollars and No Cents (\$9,704,791.00).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor or designee is hereby authorized to accept upon receipt and execute the appropriate grant agreements for the 2012 Community Development Block (CDBG) grant, 2012 Emergency Solutions (ESG) grant, 2012 HOME Investment Partnership (HOME) grant and the 2012 Housing Opportunities for Persons With AIDS (HOPWA) grant.


