**A RESOLUTION URGING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS AND EXECUTIVE BRANCH TO CREATE AND IMPLEMENT FEDERAL EDUCATION AND JOB TRAINING PROGRAMS WHICH ARE DESIGNED TO DEVELOP A WORKFORCE WITH THE SKILLS TO BE COMPETITIVE AND PRODUCTIVE IN TODAY'S WORKPLACE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.**

**WHEREAS**, federal education and job training programs are an important resource in contributing in efforts by citizens to obtain a quality education and become productive employees whose skills match those needed by employers; and

**WHEREAS**, the Elementary and Secondary Education Act and the Workforce Investment Act no longer provide education and job training systems with the tools to respond to recent changes in the workplace; and

**WHEREAS**, workers will need to respond rapidly to changing technological and intellectual demand, educators and job trainers will need the tools to instruct and train them; and

**WHEREAS**, programs need to ensure that all students have equal access to education programs by making additional investment in after-school programs, 21<sup>st</sup> Century Learning Centers and technical education programs in low income communities.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA, GEORGIA**, urges the Congress of the United States and the Executive Branch to develop policies to modernize federal education and job training program to provide educators and job trainers with the tools needed to assist citizens in becoming and remaining competitive and productive employees.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that programs should provide training needed to respond to recent and dramatic changes in the workplace.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that federal policy makers should engage local officials in the policy process to ensure that education and job training programs are responsive to national and local needs.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Municipal Clerk is hereby directed to provide a true copy of this resolution to the National League of Cities and all members of the Georgia Congressional Delegation.

**FINALLY, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that all resolutions and parts of resolutions in conflict herewith, be and the same are hereby rescinded.
