

People TV Board of Directors

AUTHORITY:

The Territory of People TV, Inc.

PURPOSE:

This is a non-profit corporation responsible for the day-to-day operation of public access in Atlanta. Under a contract with the City of Atlanta, the Board makes TV equipment, facilities, and cablecasting time available to residents of the City at no cost on a non-discriminatory, first-come, first served basis. They also offer low-cost video training at their studios on Fourteenth Street. The Board is funded primarily by the City's cable television franchise and fund raising.

COMPOSITION & QUALIFICATIONS:

The Board shall consist of **four (4) directors** who shall be **appointed by the Mayor**, three (3) appointed by City Council, one (1) ex-officio appointed by the cable franchisee, and up to four (4) elected by the Board. At **NO** time shall the Board consist of fewer than seven (7) members.

- **Mayor and City Council appointments must remain resident of the City of Atlanta.**
- Board-elected and cable franchisee members may be non-residents of the City of Atlanta if they are executives of organizations or corporations domiciled within the City of Atlanta.
- The Board shall develop its own rules and procedures for performing its duties and functions and shall develop and maintain qualifications for selection as a member of the Board of Directors.
- Each member of the Board of Directors shall be responsible for an annual contribution, shall attend functions, and shall attend and represent the Corporations at selected events, meetings and gatherings.

TERM:

The initial term of office of a Member of the Board of Directors shall be two (2) years. Upon completion of an initial term of office, a Board Member may be elected or appointed for an additional two (2) year term of office.

COMPENSATION:

Directors shall not receive any stated salaries for their services, no compensations for any governing and/or advisory services rendered to the Corporation in their role as a Board Member. Compensation to a Board Member for services or pursuant to contract shall be subject to Board approval.
