AN ORDINANCE BY PUBLIC SAFETY AND LEGAL ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE TO ACCEPT A SUB-GRANT FROM THE GEORGIA EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY (“GEMA”), TO AID THE CITY OF ATLANTA’S ONGOING EFFORTS TO PROTECT ITSELF FROM TERRORIST ATTACKS, FOR THE PURCHASE OF LISTED SPECIALIZED EQUIPMENT (“WORKSHEET #3005”), FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF POLICE (“DEPARTMENT”), AND TO AMEND THE 2013 (INTERGOVERNMENTAL GRANT FUND) DEPARTMENT OF POLICE BUDGET, BY ADDING TO ANTICIPATIONS AND APPROPRIATIONS IN THE AMOUNT OF ONE HUNDRED ELEVEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$111,000); AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Homeland Security (“DHS”), through the Georgia Emergency Management Agency (“GEMA”), provides state and local governments with the vital funding they require to participate in the national effort to combat terrorism; and

WHEREAS, GEMA provides sub-grant funding directly to selected jurisdictions to address their unique equipment, training, planning and exercise needs without a formal written grant application; and

WHEREAS, GEMA has awarded the City of Atlanta (“City”) such a sub-grant from the Department of Homeland Security’s (DHS) Fiscal Year 2012 State Homeland Security Grant Program in the amount of one hundred eleven thousand dollars (\$111,000) for the purchase of listed specialized equipment (“worksheet #3005”) for the Department of Police (“Department”) in order to protect the City from terrorist bomb attack; and

WHEREAS, the Department wishes to enter into the grant to support its ongoing efforts to protect the City from terrorist attack; and

WHEREAS, this grant does not require a local match.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA, GEORGIA, HEREBY ORDAINS, as follows:

SECTION 1: That the Mayor is hereby authorized to accept a sub-grant from the Georgia Emergency Management Agency (“GEMA”), from the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Grant from the Fiscal Year 2012 State Homeland Security Grant Program in the amount of one hundred eleven thousand dollars (\$111,000) for the purchase of listed specialized equipment (“worksheet #3005”), for the Department of Police, to protect the City from terrorist bomb attack.

SECTION 2: That the 2013 (Intergovernmental Grant Fund) Budget, Department of Police is hereby amended as follows:
