A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO SUBMIT TO THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT THE CITY OF ATLANTA'S 2014 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN FOR THE 2010-2014 CONSOLIDATED PLAN TO INCLUDE APPLICATIONS FOR THE 2014 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) PROGRAM, 2014 EMERGENCY SOLUTIONS GRANT (ESG) PROGRAM, 2014 HOME INVESTMENT PARTNERSHIP (HOME) PROGRAM, AND THE 2014 HOUSING OPPORTUNITIES FOR PERSONS WITH AIDS (HOPWA) PROGRAM; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

WHEREAS, in order to receive federal funding, the City of Atlanta (the "City") is required to submit to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development Atlanta's 2014 Annual Action Plan for the 2010-2014 Consolidated Plan; and

WHEREAS, the 2014 Annual Action Plan includes project allocations for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG); Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG); HOME Investment Partnership Program (HOME); and the Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA).

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA, GEORGIA, HEREBY RESOLVES, that the Mayor or his designee is hereby authorized to submit to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development Atlanta's 2014 Annual Action Plan (AAP) of the 2010-2014 Consolidated Plan which includes the Year 2014 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program in the amount of Eight Million, Five Hundred Seventy Eight Thousand, Two Hundred Ninety Six Dollars and No Cents (\$8,578,296.00), which includes Seven Million, One Hundred Twenty-Nine Thousand, Four Hundred Sixty-Six Dollars and No Cents (\$7,129,466.00) in entitlement and One Million Four Hundred Forty Eight Thousand, Eight Hundred Thirty Dollars and No Cents (\$1,448,830.00) in reprogrammed funds, the Year 2014 Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) Program in the amount of Five Hundred Sixty Seven Thousand Three Hundred Seventy One Dollars and No Cents (\$567,371.00), the Year 2014 HOME Investment Partnership Program (HOME) in the amount of One Million Six Hundred Two Thousand and Eleven Dollars and No Cents (\$1,602,011.00), and the Year 2014 Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) Program in the amount of Six Million, Six Hundred Sixty Three Thousand Five Hundred Fifty Seven Dollars and No Cents (\$6,663,557.00).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor or his designee is hereby authorized to accept upon receipt and execute the appropriate grant agreements for the 2014 Community Development Block (CDBG) grant, 2014 Emergency Solutions (ESG) grant, 2014 HOME Investment Partnership (HOME) grant and the 2014 Housing Opportunities for Persons With AIDS (HOPWA) grant.
