AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER TO AMEND THE FY 2015 WATER AND WASTEWATER RENEWAL AND EXTENSION FUND (5052) BUDGET IN THE AMOUNT OF ELEVEN MILLION THREE HUNDRED THIRTY THOUSAND DOLLARS AND ZERO CENTS (\$11,330,000.00) TO TRANSFER FUNDS FROM THE WATERSHED RESERVE FOR APPROPRIATIONS AND ADD FUNDS TO THE RAW WATER DELIVERY, AND PROGRAM MANAGEMENT SERVICES PROJECT AND TASKS ISSUED UNDER THE PMT CONTRACT EXTENSION; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the City of Atlanta owns and operates a water and wastewater system; and

WHEREAS, the City of Atlanta, Department of Watershed Management (“Department”) has identified, in connection with the Capital Improvement Program, the need to fund certain costs from the Watershed Reserves; and

WHEREAS, the Raw Water Delivery project will assist with the City’s drinking water system, to provide a reliable and secure raw water conveyance system to move raw water from the Chattahoochee River to the City’s water treatment plants and storage facilities by creating alternative conveyances to water mains that remain in service beyond their design life; and

WHEREAS, the scope of the program includes, but is not limited to, drinking water system renewal by the construction of secure raw water conveyance in deep rock tunnels, constructing pump stations, developing an additional raw water storage facility at a city-owned quarry site, acquiring required easements and permits, collecting geotechnical data through deep rock borings, performing pilot plant studies and preliminary design for an alternative treatment facility at the RM Clayton plant, and performing enhanced oversight of the program; and

WHEREAS, Program Management Services will support the Department in delivery of its capital program and other obligations by providing technical resources, project controls and construction management personnel as well as access to experts in the areas of finance, bonding, and grant acquisition; and

WHEREAS, the Department requires funding for the tasks associated with the extension of the current Program Management contract until the new program management contract is executed.

WHEREAS, these funds should be transferred from the Watershed Reserves for Appropriations to facilitate the use of the funds for the Raw Water Delivery Project and Program Management Services project and tasks issued under the PMT contract extension.



REVEREND DR. GERALD L. DURLEY

Dr. Gerald L. Durley was born in Wichita, Kansas. He grew up in California and graduated from high school in Denver, Colorado. Being endowed with exceptional basketball skills and a deep interest in improving the civil and human rights of African Americans, Dr. Durley chose to leave the west and venture south to Tennessee State University in Nashville, Tennessee.



While earning a Bachelor of Science Degree in Psychology, playing on a championship basketball team, and serving as student government president, he became very active in the civil rights movement. After graduating, Dr. Durley became one of the first Peace Corp volunteers to enter Nigeria, West Africa. From Africa he ventured to Switzerland where he enrolled in postgraduate studies at the University of Neuchâtel. While there, he was invited to play for one of the Swiss National basketball teams.

When he returned to the United States, Dr. Durley enrolled in Northern Illinois University where he again became intensely involved in the struggle for human dignity, and earned one of the first Masters Degrees in Community Mental Health. He assisted in the founding of the Afro-American Cultural Organization whose goal was to teach minorities about their heritage. Upon graduation, he remained in Dekalb, Illinois as an administrator, counselor, professor, recruiter, Director of Black Studies and liaison between Black students on campus and in the town of Dekalb. Recognizing his sincerity for positive change, the U.S. Office of Education invited him to move to Washington, D.C. and become Assistant Branch Chief of Pupil Personnel Services. A compelling desire to be even better prepared dictated that Dr. Durley enter the University of Massachusetts and earn a Doctorate Degree in Urban Education and Psychology.


The Institute for Services to Education, Inc. invited Dr. Durley to direct many of its major projects working with historically black colleges and universities. He later founded and became president and CEO of Perspectives International, Inc. to produce positive, constructive programs for African Americans and other minority's communities.

Having been a dedicated educator, an effective psychologist, a nationally sought after motivational speaker, Dr. Durley was gravely disturbed by the decaying moral, social and family value systems throughout the nation. He enrolled at Howard University and earned a Master of Divinity Degree.

Combining the disciplines of psychology and religion, Dr. Durley moved to Atlanta, Georgia and accepted the position as Director of the Counseling Center at Clark College (now Clark Atlanta University). He later became Dean of Student Affairs at Clark Atlanta University. His concern for families and children encouraged him to accept the Executive Directorship of the Head Start Program for Fulton and Douglas Counties in Georgia. Realizing that the spirit and mind must work in concert with the physical body, Dr. Durley joined the faculty at the Morehouse School of Medicine as the Director of the Health Promotion Resource Center.

Dr. Durley has been intricately involved in the global warming climate change discussions across the country. He was invited to a Climate Leadership Retreat at the Garrison Institute to share with scientists, clergy, and environmentalists. He has been asked to serve on the Conservation Fund's National Forum on Children. Dr. Durley appears in the film *The Great Warming* where he is discussing climate change with urban youngsters at the YMCA. Recently he was asked to testify before the Environmental Protection Agency. On April 22, Dr. Durley orchestrated, among the clergy of Atlanta, Georgia, for them to speak about religion and science on Earth Day. 



AN ORDINANCE BY COUNCILMEMBER MICHAEL JULIAN BOND AS SUBSTITUTED BY THE FULL COUNCIL TO AMEND ATLANTA, GEORGIA CODE OF ORDINANCES, PART II CODE OF ORDINANCES GENERAL ORDINANCES (GENERAL ORDINANCES), CHAPTER 2 (ADMINISTRATION), ARTICLE II (COUNCIL), DIVISION 1 (GENERALLY), SEC. 2-39 (COUNCILMEMBER EXPENSE ACCOUNTS; COUNCIL DISTRICT APPROPRIATIONS; FUNDS) SO AS TO ALLOW COUNCILMEMBER EXPENSE ACCOUNTS TO BE USED TO PAY CONTRIBUTIONS AND/OR DONATIONS TO CHARITABLE ORGANIZATIONS FOR CHARITABLE PURPOSES; TO WAIVE CONFLICTING ORDINANCES AND CODE SECTIONS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.(REFERRED BACK BY COUNCIL ON SUBSTITUTE 4/21/14) (HELD 5/5/14)

WHEREAS, Councilmembers desire to be able to use their councilmember expense accounts to pay contributions and/or donations for charitable purposes and;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA, as follows:

Section 1: That Part III, Chapter 2, Article II, Division 1, Section 2-39 (a) of the City of Atlanta Code of Ordinances which currently reads:

Sec.2-39.Councilmember expense accounts; council district appropriations; funding.

- (a) The chief financial officer is authorized and directed to establish within the city's standard chart of accounts, within the category of other current operating expenses, an expense account entitled "councilmember expense." The account shall be charged for expenses relating to official city business of the councilmember, to include but not be limited to business travel; convention and training; newsletter and other publication or correspondence production and distribution; office and operating supplies; service, maintenance or repair contracts; and subscriptions to publications. Should councilmembers desire to utilize a portion of their expense accounts to fund projects for the public good within their districts or citywide, they may by ordinance establish a separate account from which to fund such projects which are outside the scope of regular office expenses. At-large councilmembers may utilize funds from said accounts for projects in any district within the city.

Shall be amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2-39. Councilmember expense accounts; council district appropriations; funding.

- (a) The chief financial officer is authorized and directed to establish within the city's standard chart of accounts, within the category of other current operating expenses, an expense account entitled "councilmember expense." The account shall be charged for expenses relating to official city business of the councilmember, to include but not be limited to business travel; convention and training; newsletter and other publication or correspondence production and distribution; office and operating supplies; service, maintenance or repair contracts; subscriptions to publications. Said expense accounts may also be used to pay contributions and/or donations to charitable

organizations for charitable purposes. For purposes of this subsection, *charitable purposes* shall be as defined in O.C.G.A. § 43-17-2 (3) such that "charitable purpose" means any charitable, benevolent, philanthropic, patriotic, or eleemosynary purpose for religion, health, education, social welfare, arts and humanities, environment, civic, or public interest. Should councilmembers desire to utilize a portion of their expense accounts to fund projects for charitable purposes within their districts or citywide, they shall by ordinance establish a separate account from which to fund such projects which are outside the scope of regular office expenses.

Section 2: All ordinances and code sections or parts of ordinances and code sections in conflict herewith are hereby waived to the extent of any such conflict.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ATLANTA, GEORGIA CODE OF ORDINANCES, PART II CODE OF ORDINANCES GENERAL ORDINANCES (GENERAL ORDINANCES), CHAPTER 2 (ADMINISTRATION), ARTICLE II (COUNCIL), DIVISION 1 (GENERALLY), SEC. 2-39 (COUNCILMEMBER EXPENSE ACCOUNTS; COUNCIL DISTRICT APPROPRIATIONS; FUNDS) SO AS TO ALLOW COUNCILMEMBER EXPENSE ACCOUNTS TO BE USED TO PAY CONTRIBUTIONS AND/OR DONATIONS TO CHARITABLE ORGANIZATIONS FOR CHARITABLE PURPOSES; TO WAIVE CONFLICTING ORDINANCES AND CODE SECTIONS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, Councilmembers desire to be able to use their councilmember expense accounts to pay contributions and/or donations for charitable purposes and;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA, as follows:

Section 1: That Part III, Chapter 2, Article II, Division 1, Section 2-39 (a) of the City of Atlanta Code of Ordinances which currently reads:

Sec. 2-39. Councilmember expense accounts; council district appropriations; funding.

- (a) The chief financial officer is authorized and directed to establish within the city's standard chart of accounts, within the category of other current operating expenses, an expense account entitled "councilmember expense." The account shall be charged for expenses relating to official city business of the councilmember, to include but not be limited to business travel; convention and training; newsletter and other publication or correspondence production and distribution; office and operating supplies; service, maintenance or repair contracts; and subscriptions to publications. Should councilmembers desire to utilize a portion of their expense accounts to fund projects for the public good within their districts or citywide, they may by ordinance establish a separate account from which to fund such projects which are outside the scope of regular office expenses. At-large councilmembers may utilize funds from said accounts for projects in any district within the city.

Shall be amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2-39. Councilmember expense accounts; council district appropriations; funding.

(a) The chief financial officer is authorized and directed to establish within the city's standard chart of accounts, within the category of other current operating expenses, an expense account entitled "councilmember expense." The account shall be charged for expenses relating to official city business of the councilmember, to include but not be limited to business travel; convention and training; newsletter and other publication or correspondence production and distribution; office and operating supplies; service, maintenance or repair contracts; subscriptions to publications. **Said expense accounts may also be used to pay contributions and/or donations to charitable organizations for charitable purposes. For purposes of this subsection, *charitable purposes* shall be as defined in O.C.G.A. § 43-17-2 (3) such that "charitable purpose" means any charitable, benevolent, philanthropic, patriotic, or eleemosynary purpose for religion, health, education, social welfare, arts and humanities, environment, civic, or public interest.** Should councilmembers desire to utilize a portion of their expense accounts to fund projects for charitable purposes within their districts or citywide, they shall by ordinance establish a separate account from which to fund such projects which are outside the scope of regular office expenses.

Section 2: All ordinances and code sections or parts of ordinances and code sections in conflict herewith are hereby waived to the extent of any such conflict.

The powers and duties of the Commission are as follows:

- (a)(1) To determine the scope and nature of the studies and research to be undertaken by the commission, including, but not limited to:
 - a. Educational needs of and opportunities for women;
 - b. Social security and tax laws as they affect women;
 - c. Women's health issues;
 - d. Political, legal, civil, property, and social rights of women;
 - e. Employment policies in the public and private sector and their impact on the wage earning capacity of women;
 - f. Child care issues;
 - g. Domestic violence and public safety;
 - h. Employee and wage equity;
 - i. Traditional public housing;
 - j. Equity in recreation and sports services; and
 - k. Aging issues.
-
- (2) To collect and disseminate information regarding the state of women in the city;
- (3) To review and analyze the laws of the city and their impact on the lives of the women of the city;
- (4) To consult with and advise the city council and any agency, board, commission or authority on matters pertaining to women;
- (5) To promote, encourage, and provide advisory assistance to other state, local and community women's professional, business and civic organizations;
- (6) To propose to the city through the appropriate city department the application for and acceptance of public or private grants, devices and bequests; and
- (7) To hold public hearings, conduct studies or take any other action the commission deems necessary to fulfill its responsibilities.
- (b) All executive departments, agencies, boards, commissions and authorities shall cooperate with the commission in the performance of its duties.
- (c) The commission on women shall provide a preliminary report to the mayor, president of council and members of Atlanta City Council within 90 days outlining its mission statement and initial areas of focus which shall be related to those issues which are in the purview of the city government.
- (d) The commission shall publish an annual report summarizing its activities, findings, and recommendations of the commission. The report shall be submitted to the president of council and the members of the city council.
