AN ORDINANCE BY PUBLIC SAFETY AND LEGAL ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, ON BEHALF OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA MUNICIPAL COURT, COMMUNITY COURT DIVISION, TO AMEND THE FY2017 INTERGOVERNMENTAL FUND BUDGET IN THE AMOUNT OF ONE HUNDRED TWENTY SIX THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED EIGHTY DOLLARS (\$126,980.00), TO ANTICIPATE AND APPROPRIATE GRANT FUNDS FROM THE GEORGIA DEPARTMENT OF BEHAVIORAL HEALTH AND DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES (“DBHDD”) FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONTINUING CLINICAL ASSESSMENT SERVICES FOR CRIMINAL DEFENDANTS PARTICIPANTS IN THE COMMUNITY COURT; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the City of Atlanta (“City”) implemented the Community Court in 2000 to address “quality of life crimes” such as prostitution, disorderly conduct, panhandling, and low level drug offenses; and

WHEREAS, the Community Court takes a non-traditional approach to working with criminal offenders who have addiction problems, mental illness, family dysfunction, and homelessness, by using alternative sentencing and legal sanctions to promote rehabilitation and address the underlying causes of criminal behavior; and

WHEREAS, the effectiveness of the Community Court continues to require licensed clinicians to provide criminal offender assessment services to support the appropriate judicial dispositions; and

WHEREAS, the Georgia Department of Behavioral Development Disabilities has awarded the Community Court a grant in the amount of one hundred twenty six thousand nine hundred eighty dollars (\$126,980) (the Grant Funds) for FY17 (July 1, 2016 - Jun 30, 2017) in order to continue providing clinical assessment services; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA, GEORGIA as follows:

SECTION 1: Chapter 30 (“Business”), Article III (“Occupation Tax”), Division 1 (“Generally”) is hereby amended to activation Subsection 30-87 as follows (new language in bold):

Section 30-87. Convenience Stores/Service Stations with Numerous Incidents of Violent Crime

Convenience stores and service stations with more than \$500,000.00 of taxable revenue, that have experienced more than two violent crimes within a calendar year on their premises, shall be required to hire a POST-certified peace officer at all times during operating hours at their own costs and expense. POST-certified peace officers on the premises shall be required as a condition of obtaining an Occupational Tax Registration Certificate in all subsequent years. Violent crimes

shall be defined as crimes defined under the Federal Bureau of Investigation's Uniform Crime Reporting Program, such as murder and non-negligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery and aggravated assault, and shall also include larcenies.

SECTION 2: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby waived.



THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA, GEORGIA HEREBY ORDAINS, as follows:

Section 1: That Chapter 78, Article III, Section 78-57, of the City of Atlanta Code of Ordinances, shall be replaced in its entirety such that it shall read:

Sec. 78-57. - Fire prevention code adopted, incorporated by reference; amendments.

- (a) For the purpose of establishing rules and regulations for the safeguarding to a reasonable degree of life and property from hazards of fire and explosion arising from the storage, handling and use of hazardous substances, materials and devices and from conditions hazardous to life or property in the use or occupancy of buildings or premises, the most recent edition of the International Fire Code, including Appendices B, C and D thereto, as currently adopted by the State of Georgia and amended by Chapter 120-3-3 of GA Safety

Attachment: 35 AMEND THE CODE TO INCLUDE EDIT TO FIRE CODE (16-O-1701 : AMEND CODE SECTION 78-57 INTERNATIONAL FIRE CODE)

Fire Commissioner Rules and Regulations, and the whole thereof, save and except such portions as are altered, amended or repealed in this article, is incorporated in this article by reference as the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta.

- (b) The Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta, (being also the most recent edition of the International Fire Code, as currently adopted and amended by the State of Georgia) is amended to apply within the City of Atlanta in the following respects:

- (1) Sub-Paragraph 104.6.3 (Fire Records), Paragraph 104.6 (Official Records), Section 104 (General Authority and Responsibilities) in the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta shall read as follows:

“104.6.3 Fire Records.

The chief of the fire rescue department shall keep in the office of the fire safety division a record of all fires and all facts concerning the same, including statistics as to the extent of such fires and the damage caused thereby, and whether such losses are covered by insurance, and if so, in what amount. Such records shall be made daily from the reports made by the fire department officers and inspectors. All such records shall be public.”

- (2) Paragraph 104.9 (Alternative materials and methods), Section 104 (General Authority and Responsibilities) in the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta shall read as follows:

“104.9 Alternative materials and methods.

The fire chief or his designee (fire marshal) shall have the power to accept use of alternative materials or alternative methods of construction upon application in writing by the owner or lessee or his/her duly authorized agent, when there are practical difficulties in the way of carrying out the strict letter of the Code. The fire chief shall require that sufficient evidence or proof be submitted to substantiate any claim made regarding the alternate. Approved alternate shall be at least the equivalent of that prescribed in the Code in quality, fire resistance, durability and safety. The particulars of such alternate when granted shall be entered upon the records of the department and a signed copy shall be furnished to the applicant.”

- (3) Sub-Paragraph 104.9.3 (New material processes, or occupancies which may require permits), Paragraph 104.9 (Alternative materials and methods), Section 104 (General Authority and Responsibilities) in the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta shall be added to read as follows:

“104.9.3 New material processes, or occupancies which may require permits.

The chief of the fire rescue department and the fire marshal shall determine and specify, after giving affected persons an opportunity to be heard, that new materials, processes, or occupancies shall require permits, in addition to those now enumerated in said code. The fire marshal shall post such list in a conspicuous place in his office and distribute copies thereof to interested persons.”

- (4) Paragraph 105.4 (Construction Plans Approval), Section 105 (Permits) in the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta shall read as follows:

“105.4 Construction Plans Approval.

It shall be unlawful to construct, erect, or alter any commercial building without construction documents approval by the fire chief or his designee for fire department accessibility, fire hydrant requirements, Life Safety Code requirements for assembly occupancies and flammable and combustible liquid tank installations.”

- (5) Sub-Paragraph 105.6.8 (Compressed gases), Paragraph 105.6 (Required Operational Permits), Section 105 (Permits) in the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta shall read as follows:

“105.6.8 Compressed gases.

A permit shall be required for the storage, handling, or use at normal temperature and pressure of more than 200 cubic feet of flammable compressed gas or 6,000 cubic feet of nonflammable compressed gas.”

- (6) Sub-Paragraph 105.6.25 (Lumber yards, woodworking plants and or any other type of wood working operations an operational permit is required), Paragraph 105.6 (Required Operational Permits), Section 105 (Permits) in the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta shall read as follows:

“105.6.25 Lumber yards, woodworking plants and or any other type of wood working operations an operational permit is required.

No person shall store in excess of 50,000 board feet of lumber without a permit.”

- (7) Sub-Paragraph 105.6.27 (LP [Liquid Propane] Gas), Paragraph 105.6 (Required Operational Permits), Section 105 (Permits) in the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta shall read as follows:

“105.6.27 LP (Liquid Propane) Gas.

No person shall install or maintain any LP Gas container without a permit. Where a single container or the aggregate of interconnected containers is over 200-gallon water capacity, the installer shall submit plans to the fire official. A permit shall not be required for the installation or maintenance of portable containers of less than 120-gallon water capacity.

EXCEPTION: A permit shall not be required for individual containers with a 500-gallon water capacity or less serving occupancies in Group R-3, which are located outside the Fire District as outlined in Section 8-2074 of the City of Atlanta Code of Ordinances.”

- (8) Sub-Paragraph 105.6.30 (Open Burning), Paragraph 105.6 (Required Operational Permits), Section 105 (Permits) in the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta shall read as follows:

“105.6.30 Open Burning.

The burning of construction debris, organic debris from stumps, branches, and other land clearing efforts and any and all other outdoor burning, other than cooking fires, is prohibited within the city limits.”

- (9) Sub-Paragraph 105.6.39 (Repair garages and motor fuel-dispensing facilities), Paragraph 105.6 (Required Operational Permits), Section 105 (Permits) in the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta shall read as follows:

“Section 105.6.39 Repair garages and motor fuel-dispensing facilities.

No person shall use any building, shed or enclosure as a place of business for purpose of repair, maintenance or service of any motor vehicle, marine or fleet motor fuel-dispensing facilities therein, without a permit.”

- (10) Sub-Paragraph 105.6.39.1 (Repair garages and motor fuel-dispensing facilities, prohibited areas), Paragraph 105.6 (Required Operational Permits), Section 105 (Permits) in the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta shall be added to read as follows:

“Section 105.6.30.1 Repair garages and motor fuel-dispensing facilities, prohibited areas.

No person shall use any public way, street, alley, or portion of an airport ramp, or apron as a place of business for the purpose of: repair, maintenance or service of any motor vehicle, marine or fleet motor fuel-dispensing facilities therein.”

- (11) Sub-Paragraph 105.6.47 (Fire Inspection and Operational Permit Fees), Paragraph 105.6 (Required Operational Permits), Section 105 (Permits) in the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta shall be added to read as follows:

“Section 105.6.47 Fire Inspection and Operational Permit Fees.

- (a) The Fire Chief of the Atlanta Fire Rescue Department or his designee is authorized to charge and collect fees, on a yearly, one time or location basis for the issuance of permits or activities including storing of certain materials that constitute fire hazards for which permits are required by the Fire Prevention Code, and certain activities not requiring a fire permit shall be in accordance with the following schedule of charges.

In addition to the annual fees described in city ordinance § 105.6.47, a \$25.00 processing fee shall be charged.

(1) FIRE SAFETY INSPECTION FEES:

- (A) Existing Occupancies. In accordance with O.C.G.A. § 25-2-12 (2) fire inspection shall be performed in order to issue permits or authorize occupancy as required.

The annual fees therefore shall be as follows:

- i. There shall be an inspection fee of \$200.00 for a business having up to 3,000 square feet.
- ii. There shall be an inspection fee of \$250.00 for a business having 3,001 square feet to 10,000 square feet.
- iii. There shall be an inspection fee of \$350.00 for a business having more than 10,000 square feet.
- v. There shall be an inspection fee of \$450.00 for high-rise structures up to 70,000 square feet.
- vi. There shall be an inspection fee of \$650.00 for high-rise structures of more than 70,001 square feet.

(B) OPERATIONAL PERMITS: Operational permits are required to conduct certain operations or businesses. In addition to Fire inspection fees, operational fees may be required for certain activities as listed. Multiple operations performed at the same location shall be charged a single inspection fee pursuant to § 105.6.47(a)(1). However, each operation shall be individually accessed permit fees and may incur cumulative fees.

These fees shall not apply to structures that are exempt pursuant to O.C.G.A. 25-2-12(2).

Permit approvals subject to site inspection. The minimum fee for any activity not listed shall be \$50.00.

(b) A re-inspection fee of \$200.00 shall be imposed for each re-inspection if a violation stated in the initial written notice has not been corrected.”

(11) Paragraph 107.6 (Maintenance of exit ways in public assembly occupancies), Section 107 (Maintenance) in the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta shall be added to read as follows:

“107.6 Maintenance of exit ways in public assembly occupancies.

Every aisle shall lead to an exit door or to a cross aisle running parallel to the seats and leading directly to an exit and shall not be obstructed by persons, chairs, tables, or any objects.”

(12) Paragraph 107.7 (Public Assembly Occupant Load Accountability), Section 107 (Maintenance) in the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta shall be added to read as follows:

“107.7 Public Assembly Occupant Load Accountability.
107.7.1

Any place of public assembly with any number of persons beyond that previously approved by the fire chief, or his designee, in the occupancy permit that is issued prior to opening, shall be deemed to be an overcrowded condition. The owner shall not permit an overcrowded condition to exist, nor shall he/she allow the admittance of any person beyond that number of persons previously approved by the fire chief, or his designee.

107.7.2

Signs stating the maximum occupant content shall be conspicuously posted by the owner of the building in each assembly room, auditorium or room used for a similar purpose. It shall be unlawful to remove or deface such notice. This number shall be determined by the fire chief or his designee and shall be based on the capacity of the exits provided and area of the space under consideration.

107.7.3

Where standing room is permitted, the capacity of the standing area should be determined on the basis of seven square feet per person.

107.7.4

Owners and operators of public assembly facilities where alcoholic beverages are consumed shall be able to provide an immediate accountability of the number of occupants in said facility at any given time.

107.7.5

The use of numeric counting devices, such as but not limited to numeric clickers or means of accountability acceptable to the fire official, shall be utilized to meet the requirement of section 107.7.4.

107.7.6

Individual(s) responsible for occupant load accountability shall be stationed at each entrance of the facility and shall be equipped with a minimum of two numeric counting devices. One numeric counting device shall be designated to account for the number of patrons entering the facility and the other numeric counting device shall be designated to account for the number of patrons exiting the facility.”

- (12) Section 108 (Appeals) in the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta shall read as follows:

“Section 108 Appeals.

Whenever the fire marshal disapproves an application or refuses to grant a permit applied for, or when it is claimed that the provisions of the code do not apply, or that the true intent and meaning of the code has been misconstrued or wrongly interpreted, the applicant may appeal the decision of the fire marshal to the fire chief or his designee within five days of the fire marshal's decision. The fire chief shall respond in writing within ten days.”

- (13) Paragraph 109.4 (Violation Penalties), Section 109 (Violations) in the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta shall read as follows:

“109.4 Violation Penalties.

Any person who shall violate any provisions of the Code, or fail to comply with this or any other provisions made there under, or who shall build in violation of any detailed statement of specifications or plans submitted or approved there under, or any certificate or permit issued there under, and from which no appeal has been taken, or who shall fail to comply with such an order as affirmed by a court of competent Jurisdiction, within the time fixed herein, shall severely, for each and every violation and noncompliance respectively, being guilty of an offense, punishable by a fine of not less than \$500.00 for the first offense, not less than \$1,000.00 for the second offense, and not less than \$1,500.00 for the third offense. The maximum fine shall be \$5,000.00. All fines may carry imprisonment of not more than six months, or work on the public streets or public works of the city for not more than six months, or by any one or more of these punishments. The imposition of one penalty for any violation shall not excuse a violation or permit it to continue; and all such persons shall be required to remedy such violations or defects within a reasonable time; and when not otherwise specified, each ten days that prohibited conditions are maintained shall constitute a separate offense.”

- (14) Section 202 (General Definitions) in the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta is amended to include the following definitions:

FIRE CODE OFFICIAL. Whenever the words fire code official is used in the International Fire Code, they shall be held to mean the fire marshal or a duly authorized representative(s).

ASPHALT/TAR KETTLE or ROOFING KETTLE shall mean any portable equipment either with or without wheels, or any portable fueled heating devices such as, but not limited to MAPP, Butane, and LP- Gas fueled torches, used for heating tar, pitch, asphalt, or other similar substance for application or the repair of roofs, floors, pipes, or other objects.

- (15) Section 303 (Asphalt/Tar Kettles) in the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta shall read as follows:

“Section 303 Asphalt/Tar Kettles.

(a) *Permit required.*

- (1) No roofing kettle, tar kettle or any other heating devices used in the application or repair process of applying roofing materials shall be operated without a permit from the fire chief or his designee
- (2) An annual roofing kettle or tar kettle permit shall be displayed at the job site. If more than one job is performed at one time, a copy shall be made so that each job site has a copy.

- (b) It shall be the responsibility of each company to notify the fire safety division (by telephone) as to the location and type of work being performed before the job is started.

(c) *Location:*

- (1) No roofing or tar kettle shall be operated on or inside any building without written permission from the fire chief or his designee.

- (2) No roofing kettle or tar kettle shall be operated within 25 feet of any combustible material or substance.
- (d) *Street protection.* All improved streets shall be protected from burning by use of sand or noncombustible materials under roofing kettles or tar kettles. The street shall be cleaned of excess tar and other debris upon completion of the work
- (e) There shall be a portable fire extinguisher complying with section 906 and with a minimum 3A: 40B:C rating within 25 feet (7,620mm) of each asphalt (tar) kettle during the period such kettle is being utilized, and one additional portable fire extinguisher with a minimum 3A: 40B:C rating on the roof being covered.
- (f) *Precautions against fires.*
- (1) No more than 600 pounds of combustible material or substance to be heated shall be stored within 25 feet of any kettle while same is in operation.
 - (2) No kettle using flammable liquid for fuel shall be refueled while in operation and any flammable liquid placed within 25 feet of a kettle shall be stored in an approved safety container where it shall be kept sealed or closed at all times while the kettle is in operation.
 - (3) No mop or other applicator which has been used or submerged in tar, pitch, asphalt or other similar substance in the process of black roofing, waterproofing, or insulating shall be left overnight in or within 25 feet of any building structure or combustible material or substance.
 - (4) A kettle operator, experienced with the equipment involved and familiar with the fire hazards, the precautions to be observed, and the use of the fire extinguisher facility, shall be required to be in attendance at the kettle at all times the kettle is being fired or heated and so remain until the temperature of the kettle and the contents does not exceed 350 degrees Fahrenheit, as may be determined by a thermometer that shall be provided and maintained at or near the kettle at all times.
- (g) *Roofing or tar kettles in transit.*
- (1) Open flame in a roofing or tar kettle while in transit is prohibited.
 - (2) Kettle doors or lids shall be closed and secured while in transit.
 - (3) Kettle not equipped with wheels shall not be fired or used when mounted on a truck, except if the truck body is of all metal construction and the kettle is securely attached to the truck.
 - (4) Firing of a small patch kettle while located in the bed of a truck is prohibited.
- (h) *Hi-boys.* Hi-boys shall be constructed of noncombustible materials. Hi-boys shall be limited to a capacity of 55 gallons (208L). Fuel sources or heating elements shall not be allowed as part of a hi-boy.
- (i) Fuel containers under air pressure and Fuel containers that operate under air pressure shall not exceed 20 gallons (76L) in capacity and shall be approved.

- (j) *Location of fuel containers.* Fuel containers shall be located at least 10 feet (3,048mm) from the burner.

EXCEPTION: Containers properly insulated from heat or flames are allowed to be within two feet (610mm) of the burner.”

- (16) Paragraph 311.5 (Placards), Section 311 (Vacant Premises) in the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta shall read as follows:

“311.5 Placards.

311.5.1 Placard Specifications.

Any building or structure determined to be unsafe, shall be placarded. This structure has been determined by the fire marshal of the City of Atlanta to be dangerous, unsafe, unsound and unfit for human habitation or occupancy and in violation of City of the Atlanta Fire Prevention Code and/or the Atlanta Housing Code or Commercial Institutional and Industrial Building Maintenance Code. The fire marshal shall notify the owner, operator or agent of the property by certified mail, return receipt requested, to his/her last known address that the building has been placarded and the reason therefore.

311.5.1.1 Placard location.

Placards shall be applied on the front of the structure. All placards shall be placed a minimum of ten feet above grade and be visible from the street. Additional placards shall be applied to the side of each entrance to the structure and on penthouses.

311.5.1.2 Placard size and color.

Placards shall be a minimum of 18 inches by 12 inches and a maximum of 24 inches by 24 inches in size with a red or green background, and a white reflective border. The border shall be a minimum 0.25 inch stroke and maximum of 0.5-inch stroke. All lettering on the placard shall be white reflective.

311.5.2 Placard legend.

The color designation of the placards shall have the following meanings:

311.5.2.1

Green placards shall indicate that firefighters should proceed with caution and state the following:

WARNING!

BY ORDER OF THE FIRE MARSHAL, THIS STRUCTURE IS DANGEROUS AND UNSAFE.

SECTION 78-57 OF THE ATLANTA FIRE PREVENTION CODE.

311.5.2.2

Red placards shall indicate that firefighters should not enter property (unless for life safety) and conduct defensive operations and state the following:

WARNING!

BY ORDER OF THE FIRE MARSHAL, THIS STRUCTURE IS DANGEROUS AND UNSAFE.

SECTION 78-57 OF THE ATLANTA FIRE PREVENTION CODE.

311.5.3 Placard Lettering:

311.5.3.1

The lettering for the word "WARNING" shall be a minimum of 1.75 inch in height with a 0.5 inch stroke of white reflective type.

311.5.3.2

The lettering for "BY ORDER OF THE FIRE MARSHAL, THIS STRUCTURE IS DANGEROUS AND UNSAFE" shall be a minimum of 0.5 inch in height with a minimum stroke 1/16-inch stroke.

311.5.3.3

The lettering for the" SECTION 78-57 OF THE ATLANTA FIRE PREVENTION CODE" shall be a minimum of 3/8-inch in height with a 1/16-inch stroke.

311.5.4 Unlawful Entry.

It shall be unlawful for any person to enter upon this property other than an authorized governmental licensee, the owner or his designated agent or contractor (upon written verification). It shall also be unlawful to occupy or to allow the occupancy of this property until rendered fit for human habitation or occupancy in a manner satisfactory to and approved by the bureau of buildings and/or the bureau of code compliance. Mutilation, unauthorized removal or defacing of this placard shall be an offense punishable by fine and/or imprisonment.”

(17) Paragraph 403.1 (Fire Watch Personnel), Section 403 (Public Assemblages and Events) in the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta shall read as follows:

“403.1 Fire watch personnel.

Whenever in the opinion of the fire chief or his designee it is essential for public safety in any place of public assembly or any other place where people congregate, due to the number of persons, or the nature of the performance, exhibition, display, contest, or activity, the owner, agent, or lessee shall, at his expense, employ one or more experienced firefighters employed by Atlanta Fire Rescue Department as required and approved by the chief to be on duty at such place. Said firefighters shall be subject to the

chiefs orders at all times when so employed, and shall be in uniform and remain on duty during the time such places are open to the public, or when such activity is being conducted. Before each such activity, said firefighter shall inspect the fire appliances provided to see that they are in proper place and in proper working order and shall keep diligent watch for fires, obstructions to means of egress and other hazards during the time such place is open to the public or such activity is being conducted and take prompt measures for extinguishment of fires that may occur and assist in the evacuation of the public from structures. The firefighters shall not be required or permitted while on duty to perform any other duties than those herein specified.”

(18) Paragraph 404.2 (Approved Fire Safety and Evacuation Plan), Section 404 (Fire Safety and Evacuation Plans) in the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta shall read as follows:

“404.2 Approved Fire Safety and Evacuation Plan.

An approved fire and evacuation plan shall be prepared and maintained for the following occupancies and buildings:

1. Group A, other than group occupancies used exclusively for purposes of religious worship that have an occupant load less than 2,000.
2. Group B buildings having an occupant load of 500 or more persons or more than 100 persons above or below the lowest level of exit discharge.
3. Group E.
4. Group H.
5. Group I.
6. Group R-1.
7. Group R-2 college and university buildings. 8. Group R-4.
9. High-rise buildings.
10. Group M buildings having an occupant load of 500 or more persons or more than 100 persons above or below the lowest level of exit discharge.
11. Covered malls exceeding 50,000 square feet (4,645 m²) in aggregate floor area.
12. Underground buildings.
13. Buildings with an atrium and having occupancy in Group A, E or M.”

(19) Sub-Paragraph 408.2.3 (Crowd Manager Certification) is added to Paragraph 408.2 (Group A Occupancies), Section 408 (Use and Occupancy-Related Requirements) of the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta and shall read as follows:

“408.2.3 Crowd Manager Certification.


Each qualified crowd manager supervisor shall be required to carry on his/her person an identification card issued by Atlanta Fire Rescue Department certifying his/her minimum training in life and fire safety.”

(20) Sub-Paragraph 503.3.1 is added to Paragraph 503.3 (Marking), Section 503 (Fire Apparatus Access Roads) of the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta and shall read as follows:

“503.3.1

A fire department access sign shall be installed at all required secondary fire department access points of a property. The sign shall state: Fire Dept. Access, name of the business/property, property address, and emergency contact information.

(21) Section 505 (Premises Identification) in the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta shall read as follows:

“Section 505 Fire Department Address Guide for All Properties.

505.1 Single-family homes.

Address shall be a minimum four inches high, with a 5/8-inch stroke and contrasting numbers.

505.2 Multi-family communities (apartments, condos, townhouses).

Multi family communities (apartments, condos, townhouses) and street address numbers shall comply with the following:

505.2.1 Street Address Numbers.

Street address shall be a minimum 12-inch high numbers with a two-inch stroke with contrasting background.

- (a) Twelve-inch high numbers with a two-inch stroke are only acceptable when placed within approximately 75 feet of the road in which the property is addressed.

505.2.2 Building Numbers.

Building numbers shall be:

- (a) Minimum 18 inches high numbers with a three-inch stroke with contrasting background.
- (b) Buildings under 100 feet long: a minimum of one number per building.
- (c) Buildings over 100 feet in length require a minimum of two numbers per building.

505.3 Apartment Spread Numbers/ Corridor Spread Numbers.


Apartment spread numbers/ corridor spread numbers shall be:

- (a) Apartment spread numbers shall be a minimum of seven-inch high numbers with a one-inch stroke with contrasting background.
- (b) Corridor spread numbers shall be a minimum four-inch high number with a 5/8-inch brush stroke with a contrasting background.



505.5 Large office and warehouse buildings.

Large office and warehouse building addresses shall comply with the following:

- (a) Address shall be a minimum of 24-inch high numbers with a four-inch stroke with contrasting background.
- (b) Address must be visible from all access directions.
- (c) Buildings over 500 feet long shall have two address locations if more than one access point is visible.
- (d) Suite numbers are required for multi tenant complexes and shall be located over the front door and on the rear door with a six-inch high by one-inch brush stroke.





505.6 Shopping Centers, High Rise Buildings and Other Applications.

Shopping centers, high rise buildings and other applications address numbers shall be:

- (a) Minimum 12 inches high numbers with a two-inch stroke with contrasting background. Be visible from all access directions. Suite numbers are required over the door with a six inches high by one-inch brush stroke.
- (b) Buildings beyond 100 feet from the street and 10,000 square feet or more would need to install 18-inch by three-inch address numbers.

505.7 Marquee and Monument.


Addresses installed on a marquee or monument located next to the street will require numbers 12 inches high by two-inch brush stroke to be located a minimum of three feet above grade. Numbers shall contrast with the background.

505.8 Self Storage Buildings Facilities Signs.

505.8.1 Self Storage Buildings Facilities Signs shall comply with the following:

- (1) The sign plate shall be 12 inches by 18 inches with a thickness of .080 aluminum construction.

- (2) The sign face shall have a Brown reflective background with a white legend, using the standard 3M Scotchlite sign face number R7-32 or equivalent, with white screen printed lettering.
- (3) The font style shall be Handel Gothic BT capital fonts.
- (4) Signs are to be used for commercial applications only.



505.9 Address directory. General.

An approved address directory shall be installed at properties with more than one principal building each building shall have building unit identification numbers, or when, in the opinion of the chief, emergency response may be delayed due to the physical layout of the complex.

505.9.1 Prior to construction, an address directory plan shall be submitted to the Atlanta Fire Rescue Fire Marshal's Office for approval via the City of Atlanta Building Department's plan submission process.

505.9.1.1 Dimensions.

The number of buildings in the complex shall determine the dimensions of the directory.

- (1) Complexes containing 12 or fewer buildings require three feet × three feet
- (2) Complexes containing 13 to 30 buildings require four feet × four feet (16 square feet) site directory.

- (3) Complexes containing 31 or more buildings require five feet by five feet (25 square feet) site directory.

505.10 Framing.

Framing materials shall not encroach upon the face to the directory by more than one and one-half inches. Stanchions or supports shall not be included in the required size of the directory.

505.11 Protection.

The directory shall be protected against vandalism and disfigurement by a clear polycarbonate cover, with a minimum one-eighth inch thickness, sealed to protect from weather.


505.12 Illumination.

Address directories shall be internally illuminated utilizing white light. The directory must be illuminated from dusk to dawn.

505.13 Installation requirements.

Support posts or stanchions shall be set on concrete. Directories with dimensions of three feet by three feet (nine square feet) shall be 36 inches above grade.

505.13.1 Directories with dimensions of four feet by four feet (16 square feet) and five feet by five feet (25 square feet) shall be 24 inches above grade.



505.14 Depictions.

All depictions must be clear, easily understood and legible at a distance of eight feet. The directory shall depict structures, building numbers, units, apartment space numbers, tennis courts, swimming pools, canals, waterfronts, driveways, streets, laundry rooms, fire hydrants, and other areas determined by the chief.

505.15 Depictions shall comply with the following:

1. Directories shall be a dark print on a contrasting light background.
2. The name and address of the complex are required, but shall not exceed ten percent of the total size of the site directory.
3. Swimming pools, canals, and waterway areas shall be translucent blue.
4. Tennis courts shall be translucent green.

5. Fire hydrants shall be a ¼-inch diameter black circle filled with a translucent yellow center. The abbreviation "HYD" must be affixed by the location of the hydrant on the directory.
6. The directory shall be properly oriented to the viewer with a red symbol one inch in diameter, with the words "you are here" affixed at the appropriate location on the directory.
7. There must be a north directional arrow affixed to the directory. This arrow must be a minimum of three inches in size.
8. The building numbers must be one inch in diameter, located directly adjacent to the building on the driveway side.
9. The colors used on site directory may not be duplicated to represent more than one item.

505.16 Setbacks.




1. The directory shall be set back from the street or curbing at least 25 feet to allow emergency vehicles to clear the public right of way.
2. Shall not exceed a distance of four feet from the edge of the property driveway facing the direction of oncoming traffic.
3. Shall not conflict with traffic visibility zones as provided for by other ordinances.
4. Shall be immediately visible and free from obstructions including architectural design and landscaping.

505.17 Prohibition.

Information such as advertising or additional artwork shall not be allowed on the address directory.

- (22) Sub-Paragraph 507.5.4.1 is added to Sub-Paragraph 507.5.4 (Obstruction), Paragraph 507.5 (Fire Hydrant Systems), Section 507 (Fire Protection Water Supplies) of the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta and shall read as follows:

“507.5.4.1

No person shall stop, park, or leave any vehicle within a 15-foot radius of a fire hydrant.”

- (23) Sub-Paragraph 901.6.2.2 is added to Sub-Paragraph 901.6.2 (Records), Paragraph 901.6 (Inspection, testing and maintenance), Section 901 (General) of the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta and shall read as follows:

“901.6.2.2

Medical First Aid Equipment - Automated External Defibrillator (AED).

- (A) Cabinets containing automated external defibrillators shall not be blocked from use or obstructed from view of the public.

- (B) Cabinets Identification. - Cabinets shall be identified in an approved manner by a permanently attached sign.
- (C) Tampering with AEDs. It shall be unlawful for any person to remove or tamper with an AED or other Life Safety device, except for the purpose of training, recharging or making necessary repair, or when approved by the Fire Code Official.
- (D) The owner of the AEDs shall be responsible for the maintenance, inspection and testing of the AEDs per manufacturers requirements. Written records of the maintenance, inspection and testing of all AEDs shall be kept on file for review by the fire code official.
- (E) AEDs shall be operational at all times.”

(24) Sub-Paragraphs 912.2.1.1 and 912.2.1.2 are added to Sub-Paragraph 912.2.1 (Visible Location), Paragraph 912.2 (Location), Section 912 (Fire Department Connections) of the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta and shall read as follows:

“912.2.1.1

A fire hydrant shall be located within 100 feet of a fire department connection (FDC) and or Standpipe connection on all new commercial construction.

912.2.1.2

No transformer shall be located within a 20-foot radius of the following water connections: fire department, standpipe, sprinkler, test header, or a fire hydrant on all new commercial construction.

EXCEPTION: The separation distance shall be reduced to ten feet when the transformer is separated by a non-combustible six-foot high wall on three sides, with the open side facing away from the water supply and or connection. A minimum three-foot clearance shall be provided between the transformer and the non-combustible wall on all sides, for maintenance, inspection, and testing functions.”

(25) Sub-Paragraphs 1030.3.1 and 1030.3.2 are added to Paragraph 1030.3 (Obstructions), Section 1030 (Maintenance of the Means of Egress) of the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta and shall read as follows:

“1030.3.1 Exit Doors.

During the period of occupancy, no exit door shall be locked, bolted or otherwise fastened or obstructed by any means so that the door cannot be opened from the inside by the use of: a latch, knob, or by direct pressure applied to the door or to a panic release device.

1030.3.2 Hold Open Devices.

The use of a hold open device on an exit door(s) shall not be used, unless the hold open device is tied directly into the building's fire alarm system. The hold open device shall automatically release the exit door(s) upon activation of the building's fire alarm system.”

- (26) Sub-Paragraph 2006.5.3 (Training), Paragraph 2006.5 (Fueling and Defueling), Section 2006 (Aircraft Fueling) in the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta shall read as follows:

“2006.5.3 Training.

Aircraft refueler apparatus shall be attended and operated only by persons instructed in methods of proper use and operation and who are qualified to use such refueler apparatus in accordance with minimum safety requirements. Each qualified operator shall be required to carry on his/her person an identification card issued by Atlanta Fire Rescue Department certifying his/her minimum training in fire safety.”

- (27) Sub-Paragraph 2006.5.6 (Leaving Fueling Vehicles Unattended) shall be added to Paragraph 2006.5 (Fueling and Defueling), Section 2006 (Aircraft Fueling) in the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta and shall read as follows:

“2006.5.6 Leaving Fueling Vehicles Unattended.

The driver, operator or attendant of a fueling apparatus shall not leave the fueling apparatus unattended, while it is connected to the aircraft, ground support equipment or the hydrant fueling system. The connection of a fueling apparatus to an aircraft, ground support equipment or the hydrant fueling system shall be considered as fueling process.”

- (28) Paragraph 2803.3 of Section 2803 (General Requirements) in the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta shall read as follows:

“2803.3 Waste Removal.

Saw mills, planning mills and other woodworking plants shall be equipped with refuse removal systems which will collect and remove sawdust and shavings as produced. Blower and exhaust systems shall be installed in accordance with the provisions of NFPA 91.”

- (29) Section 3316 (Motorized Construction Equipment) in the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta shall read as follows:

“SECTION 3316 Motorized Construction Equipment

3316.1 Conditions of use.

Internal-combustion-powered construction equipment shall be used in accordance with all of the following conditions:

1. Equipment shall be located so that exhausts do not discharge against combustible material.
2. Exhausts shall be piped to the outside of the building.
3. Equipment shall not be refueled while in operation.
4. Fuel for equipment shall be stored in an *approved* area outside of the building.
5. Bonding and grounding precautions shall be utilized during all fueling operations of motorized equipment.”

- (30) Paragraph 3501.2 (Permits) of Section 3501 (General) in the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta shall read as follows:

“3501.2 Permits.

- (a) A permit shall be required of each company, corporation, partnership or owner operator performing welding or cutting operations except as provided in paragraph (b) of this section. This permit shall not be required for each welding or cutting job location. The company, corporation, partnership, or owner operator shall notify the fire safety division in advance where such work is taking place, except when such work is done in response to an emergency call that does not allow for the fire safety division to be notified in advance of the work.
- (b) A permit shall not be required of any company, corporation, partnership, or owner-operator:
 - (1) Where the welding or cutting is performed in areas approved for the purpose, or
 - (2) Where an approved permit system is established for control of the hazards involved.
- (c) Application for a permit required by this article shall be made by the company, corporation, partnership, or owner-operator performing the welding or cutting operations or by his duly authorized agent.
- (d) A permit for welding or cutting operations shall not be issued unless the individuals performing such operations are capable of doing such work in a safe manner. Demonstration of a working knowledge of the provisions of this article shall constitute acceptable evidence of compliance with this requirement.
- (e) Companies, corporations, partnerships, and owner-operators required to have a permit shall maintain a record of all locations where welding or cutting operations are performed and have it available for inspection by the fire safety division.”

- (31) Paragraph 3509.8 (Hose and Hose Connections) in Section 3509 (Piping Manifolds and Hose Systems for Fuel Gases and Oxygen) in the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta shall be added to read as follows:

“3509.8 Hose and Hose connections.

An approved listed flame arrester check valve shall be installed in every fuel gas hose not more than six inches (152mm) downstream from the point of connection to a cylinder or other fuel supply, preferably at the regulator. Any such flame arrester shall be approved for the specific gas used.”

- (32) Sub-Paragraph 5604.1.1 is added to Paragraph 5604.1(General), Section 5604 (Explosive Materials Storage and Handling) of the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta and shall read as follows:

“5604.1.1 Prohibitions.

The storage of explosive and blasting agents is prohibited within the fire limits as established by section 8-2074 of the City of Atlanta Code of Ordinances except for temporary storage for use in connection with approved blasting operations; provided,

however, this prohibition shall not apply to Wholesale and retail stocks of small arms ammunition, explosive bolts, explosive rivets or cartridges or explosive-actuated power tools in quantities involving less than 500 pounds of, explosive material.”

- (33) Sub-Paragraph 5704.2.9.5, Sub-Paragraph 5704.2.9 (Aboveground Tanks), Paragraph 5704.2 (Tanks Storage), Section 5704 (Storage), Chapter 57 (Flammable and Combustible Liquids) of the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta shall read as follows:

“5704.2.9.5 Aboveground tanks inside of buildings.

- (1) Tanks storing Class II and III liquids inside buildings shall be equipped with a device or other means to prevent overflow into the building including, but not limited to: a float valve, a preset meter on the fill line; a valve actuated by weight of the tank content; a low head pump which is incapable of producing overflow; or a liquid-tight overflow pipe at least one size larger than the fill pipe and discharging by gravity back to the outside source of liquid or to an approved location.
- (2) Flammable or combustible liquids storage tanks in buildings shall be installed in accordance with NFPA standards adopted in GA Safety Fire Commissioner Rules and Regulations.
- (3) Flammable and combustible liquids storage and day tanks which are utilized for buildings life safety systems emergency back-up shall be installed inside buildings located within the fire limits as established by the City of Atlanta Code of Ordinances, Section 8-2074 in accordance with the following regulations:
 - (a) Tanks installed inside of a building shall be a secondary containment type tank, as defined in NFPA 30.
 - (b) All storage or day tanks in a building shall be located in the lowest story, cellar or basement.
 - (c) Installation of flammable or combustible liquid storage or day tanks on a roof of a building is prohibited.
 - (d) The aggregate capacity of all flammable or combustible liquid storage or day tanks in a building shall not exceed 15,000 gallons.
 - (e) A flammable or combustible liquid storage tank - 12,000-gallon maximum capacity - shall be located in a vault constructed in accordance with Section 3404.2.8 or inside a tank room constructed in accordance with the following regulations:
 1. Tank room shall be constructed of walls, floor and top having a fire-resistive rating of not less than four hours with the walls bonded to the floor.
 2. Tank room shall contain 100 percent of the total capacity of all tanks, and provided with a liquid-tight noncombustible sill raised not less than six inches above the floor.

3. There shall be three feet clearance around the tank and between the top of the tank and ceiling of the tank room for movement of fire-fighting personnel and fire protection equipment.
4. Tank room shall be provided with ventilation system per NFPA 30.
5. Tank room shall be provided with a leak-detection system providing audible and visual alarm.
6. Tank room containing tanks with an aggregate capacity of more than 500 gallons of flammable or combustible liquids shall be protected with an automatic suppression system designed in accordance with one of the following standards:
 - (a) NFPA 11, Standard for Low Expansion Foam;
 - (b) NFPA 12, Standard for Carbon Dioxide Extinguisher System;
 - (c) Automatic Suppression System approved by the Fire Marshal
7. The individual capacity of any tank in a tank building shall not exceed 12,000.gallons.
8. Warning placard shall be conspicuously posted on the door entering the tank room. The sign shall read 'Flammable Liquids, No Smoking or Open Flame'.
9. Spill containment shall be provided for the fuel delivery vehicle. The delivery vehicle's spill containment shall be able to contain 110 percent of the vehicle's largest compartment."

(34) Sub-Paragraph 5704.2.9.6.1, Sub-Paragraph 5704.2.9.6 (Aboveground Tanks Outside of Buildings), Sub-Paragraph 5704.2.9 (Aboveground Tanks), Paragraph 5704.2 (Tanks Storage), Section 5704 (Storage), Chapter 57 (Flammable and Combustible Liquids) of the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta shall read as follows:

"5704.2.9.6.1 Special requirements for aboveground tanks located outside of buildings.

The storage of flammable and combustible liquids in aboveground tanks located outside of buildings within the fire limits as established by Section 8-2074 of the City of Atlanta Code of Ordinances shall be in accordance with the following regulations:

- a) Flammable or combustible liquid storage tanks shall be located at the level of fire department vehicle access.
- b) A storage or a day tank shall be a secondary containment type tank as defined in NFPA 30.
- c) A flammable or combustible liquid storage tank, 12,000 gallon maximum capacity, shall be located inside a vault constructed in accordance with Section 3404.2.8 or inside a tank building constructed in accordance with the following regulations:
 1. Tank building shall be constructed of walls, floor and top having a fire-resistive rating of not less than four hours with the walls bonded to the floor.

2. Tank building shall contain 100 percent of the total capacity of all tanks, and provided with a liquid-tight noncombustible sill raised not less than six inches above the floor.
3. There shall be three feet clearance around the tank and between the top of the tank and ceiling of the tank room for movement of fire-fighting personnel and fire protection equipment.
4. Tank building shall be provided with a ventilation system per NFPA 30.
5. Tank building shall be provided with a leak-detection system providing audible and visual alarm.
6. Tank building containing tanks with an aggregate capacity of more than 500 gallons of flammable or combustible liquids shall be protected with an automatic suppression system designed in accordance with one of the following standards:
 - a) NFPA 11, Standard for Low Expansion Foam;
 - b) NFPA 12, Standard for Carbon Dioxide Extinguisher System;
 - c) Automatic suppression system approved by the fire marshal.
7. The individual capacity of any tank in a tank building shall not exceed 12,000 gallons.
8. Warning placard shall be conspicuously posted on the door into the tank room. The sign shall read "Flammable Liquids, No Smoking or Open Flame".
9. Spill containment shall be provided for the fuel delivery vehicle. The fuel delivery vehicle's spill containment shall be able to contain 110 percent of the vehicle's largest compartment.

EXCEPTION: Aboveground storage tanks shall be permitted at new commercial construction sites within the fire limits as established by Section 8-2074 of the City of Atlanta Code of Ordinances shall be in accordance with the following regulations:

- a) The design, construction and capacities of containers for the storage of Class I, II and Class IIIA liquids shall be in accordance with NFPA 30 and dispensing operations shall be in accordance with NFPA 30A.
- b) Aboveground storage tanks containing Class I, II and Class IIIA liquids, shall not exceed 660 gallons (2498L) individual capacity. The aggregate capacity of the aboveground storage tanks shall not exceed 1320 gallons (4996 L) at any construction site.
- c) Aboveground storage tanks at new commercial construction sites shall be double walled type or single walled with a dike.
- d) Aboveground storage tanks at new commercial construction sites shall not be required to be in a vault.
- e) A permit shall be required for the temporary storage and use of the aboveground storage tanks at construction sites.

- f) Plans submission shall be required for the installation of any aboveground storage tank at a construction site, and the aboveground storage tanks shall not be installed until plans have been approved by the Atlanta Fire Rescue department.
- g) Aboveground storage tanks shall be approved for aboveground storage of flammable and combustible liquids.
- h) Skid tanks shall be prohibited within the City of Atlanta limits.
- i) Spill containment shall be provided for the fuel delivery vehicle.”

(35) Paragraph 5706.4 (Bulk Plants or Terminals), Section 5706 (Special Operations) in Chapter 57 (Flammable and Combustible Liquids) of the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta shall read as follows:

“Section 5706.4 Bulk plants or terminals.

- (1) Portions of properties where flammable or combustible liquids are received by tank vessels, pipelines, tank cars, or tank vehicles and which are stored or blended in bulk for the purpose of distributing such liquids by tank vessels, pipelines, tank cars, tank vehicles or containers shall be in accordance with Sections 5706.4.1 through 5706.4.10.4.
- (2) No new bulk plant shall be constructed within 300 feet of any school, church amusement, instruction, religious worship or other meetings. Separation limits for other occupancy types shall be set by the authority having jurisdiction. No new bulk plant shall be constructed within the fire limits established by section 8-2074 of the City of Atlanta Code of Ordinances.”

(36) Paragraph 6104.2 (Maximum capacity within established limits), Section 6104 (Location of LP-Gas containers) in Chapter 57 (Liquefied Petroleum Gases) of the Fire Prevention Code of the City of Atlanta shall read as follows:

“6104.2 Maximum capacity within established limits.

Within the fire limits as established by section 8-2074 of Code of Ordinances, the aggregate capacity of any one installation for storage of liquefied petroleum gas shall not exceed 200 gallons water capacity; except that in particular installations this capacity may be altered at the discretion of the fire official, after considerations of special features such as topographical conditions, nature of occupancy and proximity to buildings, capacity of proposed tanks, and degree of private fire protection to be provided.”

CITY OF ATLANTA, CIVIL ACTION FILE NO. 15-EV-000514, FULTON COUNTY STATE COURT, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$7,500.00; AUTHORIZING SAID AMOUNT TO BE PAID FROM 1001 (GENERAL FUND) CENTER NUMBER 200101 (NON-DEPARTMENTAL) ACCOUNT 5212005 (LITIGATION EXPENSES); AND 1512000 (FUNCTIONAL ACTIVITY NUMBER); AUTHORIZING THE CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER TO DISTRIBUTE THE TOTAL SETTLEMENT AMOUNT; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, Plaintiffs, Joseph Hampton and Quita Hampton, filed a lawsuit, *Joseph Hampton and Quita Hampton vs. City of Atlanta*, alleging injuries as result of Plaintiff Joseph Hampton's slip and fall on a catch basin while walking on the sidewalk on William H. Borders Drive in Atlanta, Georgia;

WHEREAS, Plaintiffs allege that due to the City's failure to properly maintain its catch basins, Plaintiff Joseph Hampton sustained personal injuries resulting from the fall on a catch basin; and that Plaintiff Quita Hampton suffered a loss of consortium.

WHEREAS, the City Attorney has done an extensive review of the facts and the law, and has determined that the City of Atlanta's potential financial exposure in defending Plaintiffs' claims is in excess of the settlement amount;

WHEREAS, Plaintiffs Joseph Hampton and Quita Hampton have agreed to accept \$7,500.00 in full settlement of all claims against the City of Atlanta including interest and attorney's fees;



WHEREAS, the City of Atlanta is a community that lives in harmony with nature and wildlife while developing the area to accommodate a growing economy and population; and

WHEREAS, as such, the City of Atlanta acknowledges the Wildlife Habitat Conservation Program as advocated by the National Wildlife Federation; and

WHEREAS, the City of Atlanta seeks to become an even more wildlife friendly community NOW, THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA HEREBY ORDAINS as follows:

Section 1: §158-12 (currently reserved) of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Atlanta, Georgia, is hereby activated and shall provide as follows:

§158-12. Properties exempt from vegetative growth, weed, grass and nuisance ordinances and regulations.

(a) All properties and parcels of land certified by the National Wildlife Federation as wildlife habitats shall be exempt from all vegetative growth, weed, grass and nuisance ordinances and regulations of the city.

(b) To be eligible for certification, a property must have a food source, water source, cover for animals and places to raise young animals.





WHEREAS, the City desires to add Section 62-48 to Part II, Chapter 62 Courts, Article II Municipal Court, Division 1 of the City of Atlanta Code of Ordinances setting forth hours of operation for the Municipal Court.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA, GEORGIA, as follows:

SECTION 1: That Section 62-48 titled Hours of Operation is hereby added to Part II, Chapter 62 Courts, Article II Municipal Court, Division 1 of the City of Atlanta Code of Ordinances which shall read as follows:

Section 62-48. Hours of operation.

Standard operating hours of the Municipal Court are weekdays from 8:00 a.m. to 5:30 pm. Each Municipal Court Judge must preside over a regularly scheduled Municipal Court calendar at least 5 days each week.

SECTION 2: This Ordinance shall take effect 90 days from the date of approval.

SECTION 3: All ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby waived for purposes of this Ordinance only, and only to the extent of said conflict.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CITY OF ATLANTA CODE OF ORDINANCES ADDING SECTION 62-48 TO PART II, CHAPTER 62 COURTS, ARTICLE II MUNICIPAL COURT, DIVISION 1 OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA CODE OF ORDINANCES FOR THE PURPOSE OF ESTABLISHING MUNICIPAL COURT HOURS OF OPERATION; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, due to the City of Atlanta’s (“City”) financial constraints in Fiscal Year 2009 the City’s Municipal Court went to a four-day work week; and

WHEREAS, the City’s improved financial condition and the demands of the general public now require the Municipal Court to operate at least five days per week; and

WHEREAS, the Municipal Court hours of operation had previously been set by the Chief Judge pursuant to Charter Subpart A, Article 4, Courts, Section 4-105(b); and

WHEREAS, the City desires to add Section 62-48 to Part II, Chapter 62 Courts, Article II Municipal Court, Division 1 of the City of Atlanta Code of Ordinances setting forth hours of operation for the Municipal Court.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA, GEORGIA, as follows:

SECTION 1: That Section 62-48 titled Hours of Operation is hereby added to Part II, Chapter 62 Courts, Article II Municipal Court, Division 1 of the City of Atlanta Code of Ordinances which shall read as follows:

Section 62-48. Hours of operation.

Standard operating hours of the Municipal Court are weekdays from 8:00 a.m. to 5:30 pm. Each Municipal Court Judge must preside over a regularly scheduled Municipal Court calendar at least 5 days each week.

SECTION 2: This Ordinance shall take effect 90 days from the date of approval.

SECTION 3: All ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby waived for purposes of this Ordinance only, and only to the extent of said conflict.

IN COMMITTEE ROOM #2)

WHEREAS, due to the City of Atlanta's ("City") financial constraints in Fiscal Year 2009 the City's Municipal Court went to a four-day work week; and

WHEREAS, the City's improved financial condition and the demands of the general public now require the Municipal Court operate at least five days per week; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the City of Atlanta Charter, 1996 Ga. Laws P. 4469, et seq. (the Charter) Subpart A, Article 4, Courts, Section 4-105(b) ("Section 4-105") the Municipal Court hours of operation are set by the Chief Judge and the City desires to amend Section 4-105 to remove that responsibility; and

WHEREAS, the City, by separate legislation, has added Section 62-48 to Part II, Chapter 62 Courts, Article II Municipal Court, Division 1 of the City of Atlanta Code of Ordinances setting forth hours of operation for the Municipal Court; and

WHEREAS, the Charter Subpart A, Article 4, Courts, Section 4-104 (g) ("Section 4-104") establishes Judge compensation; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to amend Section 4-104 to better align Judge compensation with the newly established Municipal Court hours of operation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA, GEORGIA, as follows:

SECTION 1: That the City of Atlanta Charter Subpart A, Article 4, Courts, Section 4-

105(b) is hereby amended by removing the stricken language as shown below:

(b) *Duties.* The chief judge shall be responsible for the general supervision of the municipal court and shall promulgate all rules necessary for the supervision, conduct, and administration of the court, including but not limited to the number of divisions into which the court is divided and the assignment of judges to duty therein; the hours ~~of operation of the court~~; the preparation of calendars deemed necessary and proper; and a system for keeping court records and shall require such reports from the judges, solicitor, public defender, clerk/administrator, and other court personnel as deemed necessary and proper. Such rules so promulgated shall be reduced to writing. The chief judge shall be responsible also for the preparation and submittal of budgets of said court to the mayor and city council and appropriate departments, committees, and agencies. He or she shall further perform other duties as the council may provide by ordinance or as required by law.

SECTION 2: That City of Atlanta Charter Subpart A, Article 4, Courts, Section 4-104 (g) which currently reads:

Compensation. The municipal court judges shall be paid an annual salary no less than 90 percent of the total annual compensation of the judges of the Superior Court within the territorial jurisdiction of said court.

Is hereby amended to read:

(g) *Compensation.*

(1) The municipal court judges presiding over a court calendar at least five days per week shall be paid an annual salary no less than 90 percent of the total annual compensation of the judges of the State Court within the territorial jurisdiction of said court.

(2) The municipal court judges presiding over a court calendar four days or less per week shall be paid an annual salary no less than 80 percent of the total annual compensation of the judges of the State Court within the territorial jurisdiction of said court.

SECTION 3: That a copy of this proposed amendment to the Charter of the City of

Atlanta, Georgia 1996 Ga. L., et seq. as amended, shall be filed in the Office of the Municipal Clerk of the City of Atlanta and in the Offices of the Clerks of the Superior Courts of Fulton and DeKalb Counties and that a "Notice of Proposed Amendment to the Charter of the City of Atlanta, Georgia," attached hereto and marked Exhibit "A" and made a part of this ordinance, be published in the official organ of the county of the legal situs of the City of Atlanta or in a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Atlanta once a week for three weeks within a period of 60 days immediately preceding its final adoption, and that a copy of said advertisement be attached to this ordinance prior to its final adoption by the Council of the City of Atlanta.

SECTION 4: All ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby waived for purposes of this Ordinance only, and only to the extent of said conflict.

ET SEQ., AS AMENDED, SO AS TO AMEND THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA, GEORGIA, 1996 GA LAWS P. 4469, ET SEQ., by AMENDING SUBPART A, ARTICLE 4, COURTS, SECTIONS 4-104 (g) AND 4-105(b) OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA CODE OF ORDINANCES FOR THE PURPOSE OF MODIFYING JUDGE COMPENSATION AND CHIEF JUDGE DUTIES; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, due to the City of Atlanta's ("City") financial constraints in Fiscal Year 2009 the City's Municipal Court went to a four-day work week; and

WHEREAS, the City's improved financial condition and the demands of the general public now require the Municipal Court operate at least five days per week; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the City of Atlanta Charter, 1996 Ga. Laws P. 4469, et seq. (the Charter) Subpart A, Article 4, Courts, Section 4-105(b) ("Section 4-105") the Municipal Court hours of operation are set by the Chief Judge and the City desires to amend Section 4-105 to remove that responsibility; and

WHEREAS, the City, by separate legislation, has added Section 62-48 to Part II, Chapter 62 Courts, Article II Municipal Court, Division 1 of the City of Atlanta Code of Ordinances setting forth hours of operation for the Municipal Court; and

WHEREAS, the Charter Subpart A, Article 4, Courts, Section 4-104 (g) ("Section 4-104") establishes Judge compensation; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to amend Section 4-104 to better align Judge compensation with the newly established Municipal Court hours of operation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA, GEORGIA, as follows:

SECTION 1: That the City of Atlanta Charter Subpart A, Article 4, Courts, Section 4-105(b) is hereby amended by removing the stricken language as shown below:

(b) *Duties.* The chief judge shall be responsible for the general supervision of the municipal court and shall promulgate all rules necessary for the supervision, conduct, and administration of the court, including but not limited to the number of divisions into which the court is divided and the assignment of judges to duty therein; ~~the hours~~

~~of operation of the court~~; the preparation of calendars deemed necessary and proper; and a system for keeping court records and shall require such reports from the judges, solicitor, public defender, clerk/administrator, and other court personnel as deemed necessary and proper. Such rules so promulgated shall be reduced to writing. The chief judge shall be responsible also for the preparation and submittal of budgets of said court to the mayor and city council and appropriate departments, committees, and agencies. He or she shall further perform other duties as the council may provide by ordinance or as required by law.

SECTION 2: That City of Atlanta Charter Subpart A, Article 4, Courts, Section 4-104 (g) which currently reads:

Compensation. The municipal court judges shall be paid an annual salary no less than 90 percent of the total annual compensation of the judges of the Superior Court within the territorial jurisdiction of said court.

Is hereby amended to read:

(g) *Compensation.*

- (1) The municipal court judges presiding over a court calendar at least five days per week shall be paid an annual salary no less than 90 percent of the total annual compensation of the judges of the State Court within the territorial jurisdiction of said court.
- (2) The municipal court judges presiding over a court calendar four days or less per week shall be paid an annual salary no less than 80 percent of the total annual compensation of the judges of the State Court within the territorial jurisdiction of said court.

SECTION 3: That a copy of this proposed amendment to the Charter of the City of Atlanta, Georgia 1996 Ga. L., et seq. as amended, shall be filed in the Office of the Municipal Clerk of the City of Atlanta and in the Offices of the Clerks of the Superior Courts of Fulton and DeKalb Counties and that a "Notice of Proposed Amendment to the Charter of the City of Atlanta, Georgia," attached hereto and marked Exhibit "A" and made a part of this ordinance, be published in the official organ of the county of the legal situs of the City of Atlanta or in a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Atlanta once a week for three weeks within a period of 60 days immediately preceding its final adoption, and that a copy of said advertisement be attached to this ordinance prior to its final adoption by the Council of the City of Atlanta.

SECTION 4: All ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby waived for purposes of this Ordinance only, and only to the extent of said conflict.



AN ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 70-28(b)(2) OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA (“ALARM SYSTEMS”), SO AS TO PROVIDE FOR AUTOMATIC ANNUAL RENEWAL OF THE ALARM PERMIT IF THERE HAS BEEN NO CHANGE OR TRANSFER OF THE PREMISES AFTER THE INITIAL ISSUANCE OF THE PERMIT; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, failure to annually renew the alarm permit under the “False Alarm” Ordinance, will subject “alarm user” to a \$150.00 civil penalty; and

WHEREAS, if there has been no change in the status of the property, the annual renewal should be automatically renewed.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA as follows:

SECTION 1: Section 70-28(b)(2) of the Code of Ordinance of the City of Atlanta (entitled “Alarm Systems”), which currently provides as follows:

(b)

Registration/Renewal.

(2)

After the initial issuance of a permit under this article, application for renewal shall be made annually by the anniversary of the date of initial issuance.

Is hereby amended so as to provide for automatic renewal if there has been no change in the status of the property, so that when amended, said Code Section shall provide as follows:

(b)

Registration/Renewal.

(2)

After the initial issuance of a permit under this article, and if there has been no change in the status of the property or the alarm user, the alarm permit shall automatically renew annually on the anniversary of the date of initial issuance.

SECTION 2: All ordinances and code sections and parts of ordinances and code sections in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of any such conflict.

A RESOLUTION BY COUNCILMEMBER IVORY LEE YOUNG, JR. URGING THE STATE OF GEORGIA GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO PROTECT GEORGIA RESIDENTS FROM THE LAW ENFORCEMENT USE OF DRONES (UNMANNED AERIAL VEHICLES) IN LOCAL AIR SPACE FOR THE PURPOSES OF UNRESTRICTED, ARBITRARY SURVEILLANCE, INVESTIGATION, INFORMATION GATHERING, OR ANY OTHER USE THAT POSES A THREAT TO THE PRIVACY, CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHTS, AND GENERAL WELFARE OF THE RESIDENTS OF GEORGIA; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.(HELD 10/14/14 AT THE REQUEST OF THE LAW DEPARTMENT)

WHEREAS, the implementation and use of drone technology throughout the United States and in the State of Georgia remain unregulated in the area of privacy rights of individuals; and

WHEREAS, the continued absence of legal constraints for the use of drone technology for surveillance and information collection creates a potential for government abuse through the unchecked use of drones; and

WHEREAS, drones have the capacity to continuously monitor and track individuals movements, store images and data, record phone text communications, and take photographs and film individuals without regard to the distinction between public and private spaces; and

WHEREAS, drone capability for surveillance purposes is boundless as technology develops and drones may be equipped with a variety of weapons; and

WHEREAS, armed drones and surveillance drones present an unreasonable and serious threat to the privacy, constitutional rights and general welfare of the residents of Georgia and the American people.

NOW THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA, GEORGIA

HEREBY, calls on the General Assembly of State of Georgia to adopt legislation providing legal restraints for the government and law enforcement's use of drone technology and prohibiting the use of drones for surveillance, information gathering purposes, and acts of aggression and violence against human beings.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of Atlanta calls on the General Assembly of State of Georgia to prohibit the domestic use of drone technology by police departments without a probable cause warrant or in the case of an emergency.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of Atlanta calls on the General Assembly of State of Georgia to exclude the use of information illegally gathered from drones in court such that no part of the information acquired and no evidence derived therefrom may be received in evidence in any trial, hearing, or other proceeding in or before any court, grand jury, department, officer, agency, regulatory body, legislative committee, or other authority of State of Georgia or a political subdivision thereof if the disclosure of that information would be m

violation of this resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that due to the drone's capacity to be equipped with a variety of weapons, the Council of the City of Atlanta call on the General Assembly of State of Georgia to preclude the use of weaponized drones in this state.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that where a warrant is sought to use drone technology in the City of Atlanta, notice shall be given to the person or persons upon whom information is to be collected.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that with the proper authorization, the operation of drones by the Atlanta Police Department shall be limited to collect data only on the target, to avoid data collection on individuals, homes, or areas other than the target, and to prohibit the use of facial recognition or other biometric matching technology on non-targets.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that no data collected by the Atlanta Police Department on an individual, home, or area other than the target that justified deployment may be used, copied, or disclosed for any purpose and that such data must be deleted as soon as possible, and in no event later than 24 hours after collection.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, any use of drones by the Atlanta Police Department, fully comply with all Federal Aviation Administration requirements and guidelines.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of Atlanta shall exercise oversight over the use of drone technology and any implementation of a drone program by any entity in the City of Atlanta.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council of City of Atlanta requires that any entity that intends to acquire and use drone technology in the City of Atlanta must submit for approval to the Council a statement of purpose and guidelines for the use of drone technology.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of Atlanta transmits this resolution to the General Assembly of the State of Georgia for the adoption of legislation that reflects the considerations made herein.

A RESOLUTION URGING THE STATE OF GEORGIA GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO PROTECT GEORGIA RESIDENTS FROM THE LAW ENFORCEMENT USE OF DRONES (UNMANNED AERIAL VEHICLES) IN LOCAL AIR SPACE FOR THE PURPOSES OF UNRESTRICTED, ARBITRARY SURVEILLANCE, INVESTIGATION, INFORMATION GATHERING, OR ANY OTHER USE THAT POSES A THREAT TO THE PRIVACY, CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHTS, AND GENERAL WELFARE OF THE RESIDENTS OF GEORGIA; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the implemenattion and use of drone technology throughout the United States and in the State of Georgia remain unregulated in the area of privacy rights of individuals; and

WHEREAS, the continued absence of legal constriants for the use of drone technology for surveillance and information collection creates a potential for government abuse through the unchecked use of drones; and

WHEREAS, drones have the capacity to continuously monitor and track individulas movements, store images and data, record phonetext communications, and take photographs and film individuals without regard to the distinction between public and private spaces; and

WHEREAS, drone capability for surveillance purposes is boudless as technology develops and drones may be equipped with a variety of weapons; and

WHEREAS, armed drones and surveillance drones present an unreasonable ans seriousthreat to the privacy, unconstitutional rights and general welfare of the residents of Georgia and the American people.

NOW THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA, GEORGIA HEREBY, calls on the General Assembly of State of Georgia to adopt legislation providing legal restraints for the government and law enforcement’s use of drone technology and prohibiting the use of drones for surveillance, information gathering purposes, and acts of aggression and violence against human beings.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of Atlanta calls on the General Assembly of State of Georgia to prohibit the domestic use of drone technology by police departments without a probable cause warrant or in the case of an emergency.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of Atlanta calls on the General Assembly of State of Georgia to exclude the use of inofrmation illegally gathered from drones in court such that no part of the information acquired and no evidence derived therefrom may be received in eveidence in any trail, hearing, or other proceeding in or before any court, grand jury, department, officer, agency, regulatory body, legislative committee, or other authority of State of Georgia or a politica subdivision thereof if the disclosure of that information would be in violation of this resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that due to the drone's capacity to be equipped with a variety of weapons, the the Council of the City of Atlanta call on the General Assembly of State of Georgia to preclude the use of weaponized drones in this state.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that where a warrant is sought to use drone technology in the City of Atlanta, notice shall be given to the person or persons upon whom information is to be collected.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that with the proper authorization, the operationj of drones by the Atlanta Police Department shall be limited to collect data only on the target, to avoid data collection on individuals, homes, or areas other than the target, and to prohibit the use of facial recognition or other biometric matching technology on non-targets.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that no data collected by the Atlanta Police Department on an individual, home, or area other than the target that justified deployment may be used, copied, or disclosed for any purpose and that such data must be deleted must be deleted as soon as possible, and in no event later than 24 hours after collection.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, any use of drones by the Atlanta Police Department, fully comply with all Federal Aviation Administration requirements and guidelines.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of Atlanta shall exercise oversight over the use of drone technology and any implementation of a drone program by any entity in the City of Atlanta.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council of City of Atlanta requires that any entity that intends to acquire and use drone technology in the City of Atlanta must submit for approval to the Council a statement of purpose and guidelines for the use of drone technology.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of Atlanta transmits this resolution to the General Assembly of the State of Georgia for the adoption of legislation that reflects the considerations made herein.

WHEREAS, ATAG II specifically voted to "change the ordinance to include a penalty matrix for violations of the alcohol ordinance, such that for each type of violation there is a prescribed penalty for the first, second and third violation of the ordinance, and that the prescribed penalties increase with each violation of the ordinance;" and

WHEREAS, after ATAG II completed its vote on May 8, 2013, regarding each issue, ATAG II presented a report to the City Council entitled "Alcohol Technical Advisory Group Recommendations and Narrative Explaining Concepts" (hereinafter known as "ATAG II Recommendations"); and

WHEREAS, included within the ATAG II Recommendations was a specific narrative explaining ATAG II's recommendation and the concept that ATAG II envisioned for creating a matrix for assessing penalties for violations of the Alcoholic Beverage Code; and

WHEREAS, in its narrative, ATAG II explained the concept by stating the following:
"[A]s a function of the nature of the violation, the penalty for a first violation may involve only a financial penalty, or a fine and/or a short suspension of the license. A second violation (which may be similar to or different from the first) within a certain time of the first violation, may involve only a larger financial penalty, or a fine and/or a longer suspension of the license. A third violation (which may be similar to or different from the second) within a certain time of the second violation may result in only a very large financial penalty and/or revocation of and loss of the license. This is a conceptual explanation of how the 'progressive' three step or incremental penalty assessment framework should be structured" (a copy of ATAG II's Recommendation and Narrative Explaining Concepts for Concept Number 22 is attached hereto); and

WHEREAS, ATAG II's Recommendation and Narrative Explaining Concepts, including the

above-cited language, was attached to and made a part of a Resolution 13-R-327 1 adopted by the City Council July 1, 20 13; and

WHEREAS, the City Council recognizes that the recently enacted legislation, 12-0- 1734, which set forth specific penalties based on first, second and third violations, imposes a minimum suspension period for each and every violation of the Alcoholic Beverage Code regardless of the severity of the violation; and

WHEREAS, the City Council recognizes that the imposition of a minimum suspension on certain violations of the Alcoholic Beverage Code may have unintended consequences, as some violations are not so severe to warrant the imposition of a minimum suspension period, but rather, should be addressed through the imposition of a financial penalty instead; and

WHEREAS, the City Council recognizes that the Georgia Department of Revenue has had a long-standing policy of utilizing a penalty matrix in regard to the imposition of penalties for violations by alcohol license holders which: categorizes violations by severity, allows for consideration of both mitigating and aggravating circumstances related to violations, imposes only financial penalties for some violations and a mix of financial and suspension and/or revocation penalties for more severe violations, and which utilizes a three (3) year review period to assess the number of violations attributed to a licensee when imposing an adequate penalty for a current violation; and

WHEREAS, in addition to establishing a penalty matrix similar to that described above which is based on the category and severity of the violation, the City Council also desires to implement a finite period of time within which violations by alcohol license holders are calculated, comparable with that of the Georgia Department of Revenue's three (3) year review as referenced immediately above; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA, GEORGIA, as follows:

Section 1: Chapter 1 0, Article II, Division II, Section 10- 109. 1 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Atlanta is hereby amended to delete the current language contained in said section and to insert in lieu thereof the following language:

Sec. 10-109.1 Penalty guidelines for violations of chapter after "due cause" findings by the License Review Board; administrative actions.

(a) Purpose. The purpose of this Subsection is to provide a guide for the License Review Board and mayor in assessing fair and consistent consequences for violations of this chapter. The authority to deviate from these guidelines,

including but not limited to provisions regarding show cause hearings, computation of number of offenses, time periods, and penalties, is expressly reserved to the governing authority, including the License Review Board and mayor. The License Review Board and mayor shall consider any extenuating,

aggravating, and/or mitigating circumstances presented by the licensee, and may consider other extenuating, aggravating and/or mitigating circumstances deemed appropriate by the License Review Board or mayor in deciding upon possible consequences assessed pursuant to this section. The table below calls for increased sanctions for subsequent violations within a thirty-six (36) month period or per increased class or seriousness; thus, within the same class, sanctions increase as the number of violations within a thirty-six (36) month period increase. The table reflects a willingness to give a licensee the benefit of the doubt, with respect to administrative action, for an initial offense on the part of the licensee or the employee of the licensee, but to be less willing to do so upon subsequent violations within a 36 month period.

(b) Guidelines of Penalties for Violations.

(c) **Other Penalties.** When the penalty for violations of this Chapter or an applicable statute, ordinance, or rule regarding alcoholic beverages is not listed in subsection (b) above, the penalty shall be determined by the mayor after consideration of the License Review Board's conclusions and recommendations and any extenuating, aggravating and/or mitigating circumstances presented by the licensee or which the mayor deems to be appropriate. Any such penalty shall be between \$50 and \$1000 and/or a suspension of the alcohol license for a period of 0 – 30 days depending upon the seriousness and/or repeat nature of the violation.

(d) **Multiple Violations Within A Single “Due Cause” Hearing.** Following a “due cause” hearing before the License Review Board, and after consideration of the License Review Board’s conclusions and recommendations, the mayor must act upon all of the violations that have been alleged in the notice letter sent to the licensee and shall dismiss any violation which was not specifically brought before and considered by the License Review Board for hearing.

(e) **Computation of Violations.** In determining the consequences for a current violation, the License Review Board and the mayor may consider any previous violation of the same Class for which due cause has been found within thirty-six (36) months of the date of the current violation being considered for penalty. The date of the due cause finding shall be the date from which the thirty-six (36) month period commences. Offenses in one Class shall not be counted towards the number of offenses in a different Class. Concurrent violations of different sections of this chapter but arising out of a single act shall be deemed as a single violation, but may be considered as an aggravating or mitigating circumstance. Concurrent violations of different sections of this chapter and arising out of separate and distinct acts but presented together at the same due cause hearing shall be considered as separated violations but will not be considered as “subsequent” to each other for the purposes of the penalty guidelines.

(f) **Extenuating, Aggravating and Mitigating Circumstances.** In determining the penalty to impose on a licensee for any violation or for multiple violations of the law by the licensee, the License Review Board and the mayor shall consider extenuating, aggravating and/or mitigating circumstances presented by the licensee or which the License Review Board or mayor otherwise deem appropriate, including but not limited to the following:

6. The number of violations in the same class that occurred concurrent with the violation that resulted in the due cause hearing;
7. The length of time the licensed establishment and/or the licensee has been in business;
8. Whether the compliance check was due to a complaint;
9. Whether identification was requested;

10. Whether the licensee knowingly or recklessly allowed the violation(s) to occur;
11. The financial impact upon the business of any proposed penalty; and
12. Any other facts properly in the record deemed relevant by the License Review Board or mayor.

(g) In addition to the penalties provided herein for violation of this chapter, a licensee may be required, at his own expense, to complete an approved responsible alcohol sales and service training course, at the discretion of the License Review Board and mayor.

(h) **Public notice of "Due Cause" hearing.** A first read notice of a "due cause" charge(s) and hearing date shall appear on one of the two monthly License Review Board meeting agendas and shall serve as notice to the general public. The License Review Board shall not conduct the "due cause" hearing until after the "due cause" charge has been published twice on the License Review Board Agenda.

SECTION 2: This ordinance shall become effective upon the Mayor's signature or as specified by City Charter Section 2-403.

SECTION 3: Should any ordinance or part thereof be found to conflict with this ordinance or the provisions thereof, then the sections contained herein shall be deemed controlling.





AN ORDINANCE

BY COUNCILMAN MICHAEL J. BOND

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 10-109.1 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA CHAPTER 10 (ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES), ARTICLE II (DEALERS AND MANUFACTURER), DIVISION 2 (LICENSE), SUBDIVISION III (RENEWAL, REVOCATION TRANSFER) SO AS TO CREATE MANDATORY PROGRESSIVE PENALTIES FOR “DUE CAUSE” FINDINGS MADE BY THE LICENSE REVIEW BOARD AND PENALTIES IMPOSED BY THE MAYOR; TO WAIVE CONFLICTING ORDINANCES AND CODE SECTIONS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the City of Atlanta has an interest in regulating, through the lawful exercise of its police powers, the sale of alcoholic beverages in order to provide for the safety and welfare of the citizens of the city and its visitors; and,

WHEREAS, the alcoholic beverage laws, ordinances and regulations should be reviewed so as to ascertain and recommend improvements to the city’s system of alcoholic beverage licensing and enforcement; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution #11-R-0936, adopted June 20, 2011 and approved June 29, 2011, ATAG II was established; and,

WHEREAS, ATAG II was populated and held its first meeting on November 30, 2011; and
WHEREAS, ATAG II has held public input hearings in every quadrant of the city, has had experts from government and the private sector appear before its members, and has discussed, deliberated and debated the myriad of issues involved in the licensing and enforcement of alcoholic beverages; and

WHEREAS, one of the issues discussed, deliberated and debated by ATAG II was the imposition of penalties on licensees upon violations of the Alcoholic Beverage Code of Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, on May 8, 2013, ATAG II took a vote on each of myriad issues to determine whether to include a recommendation regarding each specific issue in a final report to the City Council;

WHEREAS, on May 8, 2013, ATAG II took a vote on each of myriad issues to determine whether to include a recommendation regarding each specific issue in a final report to the City Council;

WHEREAS, during the vote on May 8, 2013, ATAG II voted to approve the inclusion of a recommendation to City Council which addressed the imposition of penalties on licensees upon violations of the Alcoholic Beverage Code of Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, ATAG II specifically voted to "change the ordinance to include a penalty matrix for violations of the alcohol ordinance, such that for each type of violation there is a prescribed penalty for the first, second and third violation of the ordinance, and that the prescribed penalties increase with each violation of the ordinance;" and

WHEREAS, after ATAG II completed its vote on May 8, 2013, regarding each issue, ATAG II presented a report to the City Council entitled "Alcohol Technical Advisory Group Recommendations and Narrative Explaining Concepts" (hereinafter known as "ATAG II Recommendations"); and

WHEREAS, included within the ATAG II Recommendations was a specific narrative explaining ATAG II's recommendation and the concept that ATAG II envisioned for creating a matrix for assessing penalties for violations of the Alcoholic Beverage Code; and

WHEREAS, in its narrative, ATAG II explained the concept by stating the following:

"[A]s a function of the nature of the violation, the penalty for a first violation may involve only a financial penalty, or a fine and/or a short suspension of the license. A second violation (which may be similar to or different from the first) within a certain time of the first violation, may involve only a larger financial penalty, or a fine and/or a longer suspension of the license. A third violation (which may be similar to or different from the second) within a certain time of the second violation may result in only a very large financial penalty and/or revocation of and loss of the license. This is a conceptual explanation of how the 'progressive' three step or incremental penalty assessment framework should be structured" (a copy of ATAG II's Recommendation and Narrative Explaining Concepts for Concept Number 22 is attached hereto); and

WHEREAS, ATAG II's Recommendation and Narrative Explaining Concepts, including the above-cited language, was attached to and made a part of a Resolution 13-R-3271 adopted by the City Council July 1, 2013; and

WHEREAS, the City Council recognizes that the recently enacted legislation, 12-O-1734, which set forth specific penalties based on first, second and third violations, imposes a minimum

suspension period for each and every violation of the Alcoholic Beverage Code regardless of the severity of the violation; and

WHEREAS, the City Council recognizes that the imposition of a minimum suspension on certain violations of the Alcoholic Beverage Code may have unintended consequences, as some violations are not so severe to warrant the imposition of a minimum suspension period, but rather, should be addressed through the imposition of a financial penalty instead; and

WHEREAS, the City Council recognizes that the Georgia Department of Revenue has had a long-standing policy of utilizing a penalty matrix in regard to the imposition of penalties for violations by alcohol license holders which: categorizes violations by severity, allows for consideration of both mitigating and aggravating circumstances related to violations, imposes only financial penalties for some violations and a mix of financial and suspension and/or revocation penalties for more severe violations, and which utilizes a three (3) year review period to assess the number of violations attributed to a licensee when imposing an adequate penalty for a current violation; and

WHEREAS, in addition to establishing a penalty matrix similar to that described above which is based on the category and severity of the violation, the City Council also desires to implement a finite period of time within which violations by alcohol license holders are calculated, comparable with that of the Georgia Department of Revenue's three (3) year review as referenced immediately above; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA, GEORGIA, as follows:

Section 1: Chapter 10, Article II, Division II, Section 10-109.1 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Atlanta is hereby amended to delete the current language contained in said section and to insert in lieu thereof the following language:

Sec. 10-109.1 Penalty guidelines for violations of chapter after "due cause" findings by the License Review Board; administrative actions.

- (a) **Purpose.** The purpose of this Subsection is to provide a guide for the License Review Board and mayor in assessing fair and consistent consequences for violations of this chapter. The authority to deviate from these guidelines, including but not limited to provisions regarding show cause hearings, computation of number of offenses, time periods, and penalties, is expressly reserved to the governing authority, including the License Review Board and mayor. The License Review Board and mayor shall consider any extenuating,

aggravating, and/or mitigating circumstances presented by the licensee, and may consider other extenuating, aggravating and/or mitigating circumstances deemed appropriate by the License Review Board or mayor in deciding upon possible consequences assessed pursuant to this section. The table below calls for increased sanctions for subsequent violations within a thirty-six (36) month period or per increased class or seriousness; thus, within the same class, sanctions increase as the number of violations within a thirty-six (36) month period increase. The table reflects a willingness to give a licensee the benefit of the doubt, with respect to administrative action, for an initial offense on the part of the licensee or the employee of the licensee, but to be less willing to do so upon subsequent violations within a 36 month period.

(b) **Guidelines of Penalties for Violations.**

(c) **Other Penalties.** When the penalty for violations of this Chapter or an applicable statute, ordinance, or rule regarding alcoholic beverages is not listed in subsection (b) above, the penalty shall be determined by the mayor after consideration of the License Review Board’s conclusions and recommendations and any extenuating, aggravating and/or mitigating circumstances presented by the licensee or which the mayor deems to be appropriate. Any such penalty shall be between \$50 and \$1000 and/or a suspension of the alcohol license for a period of 0 – 30 days depending upon the seriousness and/or repeat nature of the violation.

(d) **Multiple Violations Within A Single “Due Cause” Hearing.** Following a “due cause” hearing before the License Review Board, and after consideration of the License Review Board’s conclusions and recommendations, the mayor must act upon all of the violations that have been alleged in the notice letter sent to the licensee and shall dismiss any violation which was not specifically brought before and considered by the License Review Board for hearing.

(e) **Computation of Violations.** In determining the consequences for a current violation, the License Review Board and the mayor may consider any previous violation of the same Class for which due cause has been found within thirty-six (36) months of the date of the current violation being considered for penalty. The date of the due cause finding shall be the date from which the thirty-six (36) month period commences. Offenses in one Class shall not be counted towards the number of offenses in a different Class. Concurrent violations of different sections of this chapter but arising out of a single act shall be deemed as a single violation, but may be considered as an aggravating or mitigating circumstance. Concurrent violations of different sections of this chapter and arising out of separate and distinct acts but presented together at the same due cause hearing shall be considered as separated violations but will not be considered as “subsequent” to each other for the purposes of the penalty guidelines.

(f) **Extenuating, Aggravating and Mitigating Circumstances.** In determining the penalty to impose on a licensee for any violation or for multiple violations of the law by the licensee, the License Review Board and the mayor shall consider extenuating, aggravating and/or mitigating circumstances presented by the licensee or which the License Review Board or mayor otherwise deem appropriate, including but not limited to the following:

1. Implementation and components of the licensee’s written responsible alcohol sales and service policies;
2. Implementation, components and results of licensee's engagement in a mystery shopper program and/or other means of monitoring employees for compliance;
3. Implementation and components of licensee's management and employee training program;
4. The number of violations of this chapter by the licensed business in the city of Atlanta within the thirty six (36) months immediately preceding the violation(s) being considered;
5. The number of violations of the licensee in the city of Atlanta within the thirty six (36) months immediately preceding the violation(s) being considered;
6. The number of violations in the same class that occurred concurrent with the violation that resulted in the due cause hearing;
7. The length of time the licensed establishment and/or the licensee has been in business;
8. Whether the compliance check was due to a complaint;
9. Whether identification was requested;

10. Whether the licensee knowingly or recklessly allowed the violation(s) to occur;
11. The financial impact upon the business of any proposed penalty; and
12. Any other facts properly in the record deemed relevant by the License Review Board or mayor.

(g) In addition to the penalties provided herein for violation of this chapter, a licensee may be required, at his own expense, to complete an approved responsible alcohol sales and service training course, at the discretion of the License Review Board and mayor.

(h) **Public notice of “Due Cause” hearing.** A first read notice of a “due cause” charge(s) and hearing date shall appear on one of the two monthly License Review Board meeting agendas and shall serve as notice to the general public. The License Review Board shall not conduct the “due cause” hearing until after the “due cause” charge has been published twice on the License Review Board Agenda.

- (2) Persons permitted on September 1, 2008 by the City of Atlanta as Vendors (not as Assistant Vendors) authorized to vend on public property locations near Turner Field, [such locations described in Section 30-1405(a)(6) of the version of Chapter 30, Article XXIII of the City of Atlanta Code of Ordinances (Vending on Public Property) in effect prior to September, 2008 and officially repealed in Section 2 of Ordinance 13-0-1339], shall be given first right of refusal in the drawings for each of the Temporary Turner Field Valid Vendor Locations described in this Section.
- (3) No individual prospective Vendor may receive the ability to apply for more than one (1) of the Temporary Turner Field Valid Vendor Locations available in the Lottery-type Selection Process.

(c) This Section shall expire in its entirety, and shall have no further effect on December 31, 2016. Following the expiration of this Section:

- (1) the locations contained in subsection (a) shall no longer be designated by the City of Atlanta as Valid Vendor Locations, and no vending shall be authorized thereon;
- (2) Valid Vendor Permits for Temporary Turner Field locations shall expire and shall not be renewable.

Section 2: That all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby waived to the extent of any conflict.

Section 3: This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its approval.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA, GEORGIA HEREBY ORDAINS, as follows:

Section 1: That Chapter 30, Article XXIII, Division 2, Section 30-1437 of the City of Atlanta Code of Ordinances, currently reserved, is hereby amended such that Section 30-1437 shall read as follows:

Sec. 30-1437 – Temporary Turner Field Locations.

(a) Temporary Turner Field Valid Vendor Locations are designated by the City as follows:

[x]

(b) Lottery Type Selection Process for Temporary Turner Field Locations:

- (1) Persons wishing to submit applications for each Temporary Turner Field Valid Vendor Location shall be required to place their names in a separate drawing during the Lottery-type Selection Process for each such location.
- (2) Persons permitted on September 1, 2008 by the City of Atlanta as Vendors (not as Assistant Vendors) authorized to vend on public property locations near Turner Field, [such locations described in Section 30-1405(a)(6) of the version of Chapter 30, Article XXIII of the City of Atlanta Code of Ordinances (Vending on Public Property) in effect prior to September, 2008 and officially repealed in Section 2 of Ordinance 13-O-1339], shall be given first right of refusal in the drawings for each of the Temporary Turner Field Valid Vendor Locations described in this Section.
- (3) No individual prospective Vendor may receive the ability to apply for more than one (1) of the Temporary Turner Field Valid Vendor Locations available in the Lottery-type Selection Process.

(c) This Section shall expire in its entirety, and shall have no further effect on December 31, 2016. Following the expiration of this Section:

- (1) the locations contained in subsection (a) shall no longer be designated by the City of Atlanta as Valid Vendor Locations, and no vending shall be authorized thereon;

(2) Valid Vendor Permits for Temporary Turner Field locations shall expire and shall not be renewable.

Section 2: That all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby waived to the extent of any conflict.

AN ORDINANCE BY COUNCILMEMBER CLETA WINSLOW TO AMEND CHAPTER 106 (OFFENSES AND MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS), ARTICLE III, (OFFENSES AGAINST PUBLIC ORDER), SECTION 106-85 (MONETARY SOLICITATION), SO AS TO ADD SPI-21 (SPECIAL PUBLIC INTEREST DISTRICT: HISTORIC WEST END/ADAIR PARK) AS A LOCATION WHERE MONETARY SOLICITATION IS PROHIBITED; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.(HELD 7/14/15 AT THE REQUEST OF THE LAW DEPARTMENT FOR FURTHER REVIEW.)

WHEREAS, monetary solicitation is the act of making an in-person request of another individual for an immediate distribution of money or anything of monetary value, where such act occurs on property owned or leased by the City of Atlanta (hereinafter, "Monetary Solicitation"); and

WHEREAS, monetary solicitation requires that the person being solicited decide whether to contribute, and may involve a person reaching for a wallet, searching for money, writing a check, or producing a credit card; and

WHEREAS, monetary solicitation in the immediate vicinity of building entrances/exits and other congested locations can slow pedestrian traffic and disrupt the ability of patrons to access the buildings; and

WHEREAS, monetary solicitation can intimidate the person being solicited and lead to public safety risks when occurring in locations where an individual is stationary, including but not limited to at an automatic teller machine, at a parking lot pay box, at a parking pay station or kiosk, at a public transit platform or station, or in a stopped vehicle; and

WHEREAS, monetary solicitation is speech or expression protected by the First Amendment of the United States Constitution; and

WHEREAS, Federal law provides that, even in a public forum, the City of Atlanta may enforce regulations of the time, place, and manner of expression, if the regulations 1) are contentneutral, 2) are narrowly tailored to serve a significant government interest, and 3) leave open ample alternative channels of communication, *see Smith v. City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida*, 177 F.3d 954, 956 (11th Cir. 1999); and

WHEREAS, Federal law provides specifically that the City may enforce such time, place and manner regulations on Monetary Solicitation to alleviate public safety, disruption and intimidation concerns; and

WHEREAS, Historic West End/ Adair Park is nestled in Atlanta's southwestern section of the city, at the crossroads of the Atlanta Beltline, MARTA, and the Peachtree Streetcar corridor; and

WHEREAS, due to the recent adoption of 15-0-1267 (adopted by Atlanta City Council on June 15, 2015) which prohibits Monetary Solicitation in the Auburn Avenue Corridor and the Midtown Theatre District, certain areas of the City have seen an increase in persons being solicited; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the City of Atlanta to prohibit Monetary Solicitation within SPI-21 (Special Public Interest District: Historic West End/Adair Park) in order to serve the City's interest in providing a safe and pleasant environment and alleviating disruptive and intimidating activity therein.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA, GEORGIA, HEREBY ORDAINS as follows:

SECTION 1: That Chapter 106, (Offenses and Miscellaneous Provisions), Article III, (Offenses Against Public Order), Section 106-85 (Monetary Solicitation) subsection (b) (Monetary Solicitation in Certain Areas) of the Code shall be amended by:

(i) Adding a subsection (b)(13) that prohibits Monetary Solicitation in SPI-21 (Special Public Interest District: Historic West End/ Adair Park).

Specifically, Atlanta Code of Ordinances Chapter 106 (Offenses and Miscellaneous Provisions), Article III, (Offenses Against Public Order), Section 106-85 Monetary Solicitation) subsection (b) (Monetary Solicitation in Certain Areas), shall be amended to read as follows:

Sec. 106-85 -Monetary solicitation.

(b) *Monetary solicitation in certain areas.* It shall be unlawful for any person to monetarily solicit in any of the following places:

- (1) Within 15 feet of the entrance to or exit from any public toilet facility, which includes any temporary use site (port-a-toilet);
- (2) Within 15 feet of an automated teller machine (ATM), provided that when an ATM is located within an ATM facility, such distance shall be measured from the entrance or exit of the ATM facility;
- (3) Within 15 feet of any parking lot pay box, on-street parking pay station or kiosk;
- (4) Within 15 feet of any pay telephone, provided that when a pay telephone is located within a telephone booth or other facility, such distance shall be measured from the entrance or exit of the telephone booth or facility;
- (5) In any public transportation vehicle; in or on any bus, rail, subway or Atlanta Streetcar platform or station or taxi stand, including without limitation entryways, exits, queuing areas and pay stations connected therewith; within 15 feet of any bus, rail, subway or Atlanta Streetcar platform or outdoor station or taxi stand; and within 15 feet of the entrance or exit of a station located in an enclosed building;
- (6) Within 15 feet of the entrance or exit of a building, whether publicly or privately owned, including without limitation any residence, business, event venue or athletic facility. Nothing in this subsection (6) shall prohibit monetary solicitation within 15 feet of any other portion of a building other than its exit(s) and entrance(s);
- (7) Within 15 feet of or within a line for entry to any building, whether the building is publicly or privately owned, including without limitation any residence, business, event venue or athletic facility;
- (8) In a parking lot or garage owned or operated by the City of Atlanta, including entryways or exits and pay stations connected therewith;
- (9) Within 15 feet of any public property "valid vendor location" where a "vendor" is operating, as defined in the Atlanta City Code, Chapter 30, Article XXIII, Division 1, Section 30-1401; or
- (10) Within 15 feet of any private property "valid vendor location" where a

"vending business" is in operation, as defined in the Atlanta City Code, Article XXIV, Division 1, Section 30-1461.

(11) Within the Restricted Monetary Solicitation Zone, defined as the area between the boundaries of the following named streets, including both sides of each named street and each corner of intersecting named streets:

Martin Luther King Jr. Drive SW from Courtland Street SE to Peachtree Street SW; Peachtree Street SW from Martin Luther King Jr. Drive SW to Alabama Street SW; Alabama Street SW from Peachtree Street SW to Forsyth Street SW; Forsyth Street SW from Alabama Street SW to Marietta Street NW; Marietta Street NW from Forsyth Street NW to Ivan Allen Jr. Boulevard; Ivan Allen Jr. Boulevard from Marietta Street NW to Peachtree Street NE; Peachtree Street NE from Ivan Allen Jr. Boulevard to Peachtree Center Avenue NE; Peachtree Center Avenue NE from Peachtree Street NE to Baker Street NE; Baker Street NE from Peachtree Center Avenue NE to Piedmont Avenue NE; Piedmont Avenue NE from Baker Street NE to Edgewood Avenue NE; Edgewood Avenue NE from

Piedmont Avenue NE from John Wesley Dobbs Avenue NE to Edgewood Avenue SE; Edgewood Avenue SE from Piedmont Avenue NE to Boulevard NE; Boulevard NE from Edgewood Avenue SE to Auburn Avenue NE; Auburn Avenue NE from Boulevard NE to Jackson Street NE; Jackson Street NE from Auburn Avenue NE to Irwin Street NE; Irwin Street NE from Jackson Street NE to Fort Street NE; John Wesley Dobbs Avenue NE from Fort Street NE to Piedmont Avenue NE

Auburn Avenue NE from Boulevard NE to Jackson Street NE; Jackson Street NE from Auburn Avenue NE to Irwin Street NE; Irwin Street NE from Jackson Street NE to Boulevard NE; Boulevard NE from Irwin Street NE to Auburn Avenue NE.

(12) Within the Midtown Theatre District Zone, defined as the area between the boundaries of the following named streets, including both sides of each named street and each corner of intersecting named streets:

Spring Street NW from 3rd Street NW to Ponce de Leon Avenue NE; Ponce de Leon Avenue from Springs Street to W Peachtree Street NW; W Peachtree Street NW from Ponce de Leon Avenue NE to North Avenue NE; North Avenue NE

from W Peachtree Street NW to Piedmont Avenue NE; Piedmont Avenue NE from North Avenue NE to 4th Street NE; 4th Street NE from Piedmont Avenue NE to W Peachtree Street NW; W Peachtree Street NW from 4th Street NE to 3rd Street NW; 3rd Street NW from W Peachtree Street NW to Spring Street NW.

(13) Within SPI-21 (Special Public Interest District: Historic West End/Adair Park), defined as the area between the boundaries of the following named streets, including both sides of each named street and each corner of intersecting named streets:

THIS SECTION WILL BE UPDATED

SECTION 2: This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon the signature of the Mayor or approval by operation of law.

SECTION 3: All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby waived to the extent of the conflict.

**AN ORDINANCE BY

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 106 (OFFENSES AND MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS), ARTICLE III, (OFFENSES AGAINST PUBLIC ORDER), SECTION 106-85 (MONETARY SOLICITATION), SO AS TO ADD SPI-21 (SPECIAL PUBLIC INTEREST DISTRICT: HISTORIC WEST END/ADAIR PARK) AS A LOCATION WHERE MONETARY SOLICITATION IS PROHIBITED; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, monetary solicitation is the act of making an in-person request of another individual for an immediate distribution of money or anything of monetary value, where such act occurs on property owned or leased by the City of Atlanta (hereinafter, “**Monetary Solicitation**”); and

WHEREAS, monetary solicitation requires that the person being solicited decide whether to contribute, and may involve a person reaching for a wallet, searching for money, writing a check, or producing a credit card; and

WHEREAS, monetary solicitation in the immediate vicinity of building entrances/exits and other congested locations can slow pedestrian traffic and disrupt the ability of patrons to access the buildings; and

WHEREAS, monetary solicitation can intimidate the person being solicited and lead to public safety risks when occurring in locations where an individual is stationary, including but not limited to at an automatic teller machine, at a parking lot pay box, at a parking pay station or kiosk, at a public transit platform or station, or in a stopped vehicle; and

WHEREAS, monetary solicitation is speech or expression protected by the First Amendment of the United States Constitution; and

WHEREAS, Federal law provides that, even in a public forum, the City of Atlanta may enforce regulations of the time, place, and manner of expression, if the regulations 1) are content-neutral, 2) are narrowly tailored to serve a significant government interest, and 3) leave open ample alternative channels of communication, *see Smith v. City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida*, 177 F.3d 954, 956 (11th Cir. 1999); and

WHEREAS, Federal law provides specifically that the City may enforce such time, place and manner regulations on Monetary Solicitation to alleviate public safety, disruption and intimidation concerns; and

WHEREAS, Historic West End/Adair Park is nestled in Atlanta’s southwestern section of the city, at the crossroads of the Atlanta Beltline, MARTA, and the Peachtree Streetcar corridor; and

WHEREAS, due to the recent adoption of 15-O-1267 (adopted by Atlanta City Council on June 15, 2015) which prohibits Monetary Solicitation in the Auburn Avenue Corridor and the Midtown Theatre District, certain areas of the City have seen an increase in persons being solicited; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the City of Atlanta to prohibit Monetary Solicitation within SPI-21 (Special Public Interest District: Historic West End/Adair Park) in order to serve the City's interest in providing a safe and pleasant environment and alleviating disruptive and intimidating activity therein.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA, GEORGIA, HEREBY ORDAINS as follows:

SECTION 1: That Chapter 106, (Offenses and Miscellaneous Provisions), Article III, (Offenses Against Public Order), Section 106-85 (Monetary Solicitation) subsection (b) (Monetary Solicitation in Certain Areas) of the Code shall be amended by:

- (i) Adding a subsection (b)(13) that prohibits Monetary Solicitation in SPI-21 (Special Public Interest District: Historic West End/Adair Park).

Specifically, Atlanta Code of Ordinances Chapter 106 (Offenses and Miscellaneous Provisions), Article III, (Offenses Against Public Order), Section 106-85 Monetary Solicitation) subsection (b) (Monetary Solicitation in Certain Areas), shall be amended to read as follows:

Sec. 106-85 – Monetary solicitation.

- (b) *Monetary solicitation in certain areas.* It shall be unlawful for any person to monetarily solicit in any of the following places:
 - (1) Within 15 feet of the entrance to or exit from any public toilet facility, which includes any temporary use site (port-a-toilet);
 - (2) Within 15 feet of an automated teller machine (ATM), provided that when an ATM is located within an ATM facility, such distance shall be measured from the entrance or exit of the ATM facility;
 - (3) Within 15 feet of any parking lot pay box, on-street parking pay station or kiosk;
 - (4) Within 15 feet of any pay telephone, provided that when a pay telephone is located within a telephone booth or other facility, such distance shall be measured from the entrance or exit of the telephone booth or facility;
 - (5) In any public transportation vehicle; in or on any bus, rail, subway or Atlanta Streetcar platform or station or taxi stand, including without limitation entryways, exits, queuing areas and pay stations connected therewith; within 15 feet of any bus, rail, subway or Atlanta Streetcar platform or outdoor station or taxi stand; and within 15 feet of the entrance or exit of a station located in an enclosed building;
 - (6) Within 15 feet of the entrance or exit of a building, whether publicly or privately owned, including without limitation any residence, business, event venue or athletic facility. Nothing in this subsection (6) shall prohibit monetary solicitation within 15 feet of any other portion of a building other than its exit(s) and entrance(s);

- (7) Within 15 feet of or within a line for entry to any building, whether the building is publicly or privately owned, including without limitation any residence, business, event venue or athletic facility;
- (8) In a parking lot or garage owned or operated by the City of Atlanta, including entryways or exits and pay stations connected therewith;
- (9) Within 15 feet of any public property "valid vendor location" where a "vendor" is operating, as defined in the Atlanta City Code, Chapter 30, Article XXIII, Division 1, Section 30-1401; or
- (10) Within 15 feet of any private property "valid vendor location" where a "vending business" is in operation, as defined in the Atlanta City Code, Article XXIV, Division 1, Section 30-1461.
- (11) Within the Restricted Monetary Solicitation Zone, defined as the area between the boundaries of the following named streets, including both sides of each named street and each corner of intersecting named streets:

Martin Luther King Jr. Drive SW from Courtland Street SE to Peachtree Street SW; Peachtree Street SW from Martin Luther King Jr. Drive SW to Alabama Street SW; Alabama Street SW from Peachtree Street SW to Forsyth Street SW; Forsyth Street SW from Alabama Street SW to Marietta Street NW; Marietta Street NW from Forsyth Street NW to Ivan Allen Jr. Boulevard; Ivan Allen Jr. Boulevard from Marietta Street NW to Peachtree Street NE; Peachtree Street NE from Ivan Allen Jr. Boulevard to Peachtree Center Avenue NE; Peachtree Center Avenue NE from Peachtree Street NE to Baker Street NE; Baker Street NE from Peachtree Center Avenue NE to Piedmont Avenue NE; Piedmont Avenue NE from Baker Street NE to Edgewood Avenue NE; Edgewood Avenue NE from Piedmont Avenue NE to Courtland Street SE; Courtland Street SE from Edgewood Avenue NE to Martin Luther King Jr. Drive SW; and

Piedmont Avenue NE from John Wesley Dobbs Avenue NE to Edgewood Avenue SE; Edgewood Avenue SE from Piedmont Avenue NE to Boulevard NE; Boulevard NE from Edgewood Avenue SE to Auburn Avenue NE; Auburn Avenue NE from Boulevard NE to Jackson Street NE; Jackson Street NE from Auburn Avenue NE to Irwin Street NE; Irwin Street NE from Jackson Street NE to Fort Street NE; John Wesley Dobbs Avenue NE from Fort Street NE to Piedmont Avenue NE

Auburn Avenue NE from Boulevard NE to Jackson Street NE; Jackson Street NE from Auburn Avenue NE to Irwin Street NE; Irwin Street NE from Jackson Street NE to Boulevard NE; Boulevard NE from Irwin Street NE to Auburn Avenue NE.

- (12) Within the Midtown Theatre District Zone, defined as the area between the boundaries of the following named streets, including both sides of each named street and each corner of intersecting named streets:

Spring Street NW from 3rd Street NW to Ponce de Leon Avenue NE; Ponce de Leon Avenue from Springs Street to W Peachtree Street NW; W Peachtree Street

NW from Ponce de Leon Avenue NE to North Avenue NE; North Avenue NE from W Peachtree Street NW to Piedmont Avenue NE; Piedmont Avenue NE from North Avenue NE to 4th Street NE; 4th Street NE from Piedmont Avenue NE to W Peachtree Street NW; W Peachtree Street NW from 4th Street NE to 3rd Street NW; 3rd Street NW from W Peachtree Street NW to Spring Street NW.

- (13) **Within SPI-21 (Special Public Interest District: Historic West End/Adair Park), defined as the area between the boundaries of the following named streets, including both sides of each named street and each corner of intersecting named streets:**

SECTION 2: This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon the signature of the Mayor or approval by operation of law.

A RESOLUTION BY COUNCILMEMBER MARY NORWOOD AS AMENDED BY PUBLIC SAFETY AND LEGAL ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE AND SUBSTITUTED BY THE ATLANTA CITY COUNCIL A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING THE METRO ATLANTA TASK FORCE TO PREVENT GANG VIOLENCE; TO ESTABLISH RULES DEFINING A QUORUM OF THE METRO ATLANTA TASKFORCE TO PREVENT GANG VIOLENCE FOR THE PURPOSE OF TAKING ANY OFFICIAL ACTION OTHER THAN THE CONVENING OF A MEETING THEREOF IN ORDER TO RECEIVE INFORMATION AND TO CONDUCT DISCUSSIONS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.(HELD IN COMMITTEE 8/25/15.)

WHEREAS, In the past 5 years, the United States has seen an 8% increase in the number of gangs, and 11% increase in members and a 23% increase in gang-related Homicides; and

WHEREAS, in Fulton County alone for the year 2004, 4 defendants were charged with “participation in criminal street gang activity.”, but in 2014, 89 defendants were charged with “participation in criminal street gang activity,” which represents a 2,125% increase in criminal street gang activity; and

WHEREAS, similarly in Fulton County in 2004, only 1 defendant was charged with a gang related homicide, but by 2014, 24 defendants were charged with gang-related homicides; and

WHEREAS, ten years from now if this same pattern persists, 1,891 defendants could be charged with “gang activity” and 596 defendants will be charged with a gang-related murder; and

WHEREAS, according to cases indicted by the Office of Fulton county District Attorney, 17% of all Fulton County Homicides are Gang-Related; and

WHEREAS, the City of Atlanta along with its partners from the county, state, and federal government need to work together in a collaborative forum to address the multi-jurisdictional issues of gang-related issues that are terrorizing our community; and

WHEREAS, this legislation will direct the City of Atlanta’s Police Department, as convener, to request that the following jurisdictions participate in the Metro Atlanta Task Force: Fulton, Dekalb, Cobb, Gwinnett, and Clayton; and

WHEREAS, the City of Atlanta, as convener, will participate with a City representative from all of the entities, as applicable.

WHEREAS, each of these counties will be asked to designate a representative from the following itemized list to participate in the Metro Atlanta Task Force;

WHEREAS, due to the size of the membership of the Metro Atlanta Task Force, solely for the purposes of convening a meeting, receiving information, (including public comment), and conducting a discussion, a quorum shall consist of those members attending a meeting thereof; and

WHEREAS, for the purposes of taking all other official action, a quorum of the Metro Atlanta Task Force shall consist of one Chief of Police, District Attorney, Public Defender, School Superintendent, Chief Judge, Chief of Corrections/Jailer or their designees from no less than three of the member jurisdictions.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA, GEORGIA, that the Metro Atlanta Task Force to Eradicate Gang Violence is hereby established.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Metro Atlanta Task Force to Eradicate Gang Violence shall include the following members:

- The Chief of Police for each jurisdiction or Designee
- The Chief of Police for the Metropolitan Atlanta Rapid Transit Authority Police or Designee
- The Superintendent of each jurisdiction's Public School System or Designee
- The Director of Security for each jurisdiction's Public School System or Designee
- Each jurisdiction's District Attorney or Designee
- Each jurisdiction's Public Defender or Designee
- The Chief Judge of each jurisdiction's Juvenile Justice System or Designee
- The Chief Judge of each jurisdiction's Courts or Designee
- Special Agent in Charge of the Federal Bureau of Investigation Atlanta Bureau or Designee
- A representative of the Georgia Department of Corrections
- A representative of each jurisdiction's Jail or Detention Center
- A member of each jurisdiction's Police Department's Gang Unit or designee in a similar capacity
- A Gang Unit Prosecutor from each jurisdiction
- A representative from United Youth-Adult Conference II
- A representative of a Non-Profit involved in gang-related prevention activities

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, solely for the purposes of convening a meeting, receiving information, (including public comment), and conducting a discussion, a quorum of the Metro Atlanta Task Force shall consist of those members attending a meeting thereof.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, for the purposes of taking all other official action, a quorum of the Metro Atlanta Task Force shall consist of one Chief of Police, District Attorney, Public Defender,

School Superintendent, Chief Judge, Chief of Corrections/Jailer or their designees from no less than three of the member jurisdictions.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Office of Municipal Clerk is hereby directed to notify the above individuals and organizations to request that the names of their nominees be submitted to the Office of Municipal Clerk.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that members of The Metro Atlanta Task Force to Eradicate Gang Violence do not require confirmation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Atlanta Police Department and the Atlanta Police Foundation shall provide technical assistance and staffing to the Task Force.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Task Force shall elect a Chairman to preside over meetings and other officers as needed by the Task Force to conduct business.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Task Force shall submit a report to the full Atlanta City Council through an official communication to the Municipal Clerk that shall be read and filed;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this report shall be to the Mayor, President and Members of the Atlanta City Council and should address youth crime, gang violence, programming and policy changes of local jurisdictions, as well as any recommendations to submit to the District Attorney of each participating county.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this task force shall terminate in two years and shall terminate upon two years from the date of final passage by Council, unless otherwise extended by a Resolution of the Atlanta City Council.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that all resolutions and parts of resolutions in conflict are hereby rescinded.

WHEREAS, similarly in Fulton County in 2004, only 1 defendant was charged with a gang related homicide, but by 2014, 24 defendants were charged with gang-related homicides; and

WHEREAS, ten years from now if this same pattern persists, 1,891 defendants could be charged with “gang activity” and 596 defendants will be charged with a gang-related murder; and

WHEREAS, according to cases indicted by the Office of Fulton county District Attorney, 17% of all Fulton County Homicides are Gang-Related; and

WHEREAS, the City of Atlanta along with its partners from the county, state, and federal government need to work together in a collaborative forum to address the multi-jurisdictional issues of gang-related issues that are terrorizing our community; and

WHEREAS, this legislation will direct the City of Atlanta’s Police Department, as convener, to request that the following jurisdictions participate in the Metro Atlanta Task Force: Fulton, Dekalb, Cobb, Gwinnett, and Clayton; and

WHEREAS, the City of Atlanta, as convener, will participate with a City representative from all of the entities, as applicable.

WHEREAS, each of these counties will be asked to designate a representative from the following itemized list to participate in the Metro Atlanta Task Force;

WHEREAS, due to the size of the membership of the Metro Atlanta Task Force, solely for the purposes of convening a meeting, receiving information, (including public comment), and conducting a discussion, a quorum shall consist of those members attending a meeting thereof; and

WHEREAS, for the purposes of taking all other official action, a quorum of the Metro Atlanta Task Force shall consist of one Chief of Police, District Attorney, Public Defender, School Superintendent, Chief Judge, Chief of Corrections/Jailer or their designees from no less than three of the member jurisdictions.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA, GEORGIA, that the Metro Atlanta Task Force to Eradicate Gang Violence is hereby established.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Metro Atlanta Task Force to Eradicate Gang Violence shall include the following members:

- The Chief of Police for each jurisdiction or Designee
- The Chief of Police for the Metropolitan Atlanta Rapid Transit Authority Police or Designee
- The Superintendent of each jurisdiction's Public School System or Designee
- The Director of Security for each jurisdiction's Public School System or Designee
- Each jurisdiction's District Attorney or Designee
- Each jurisdiction's Public Defender or Designee
- The Chief Judge of each jurisdiction's Juvenile Justice System or Designee
- The Chief Judge of each jurisdiction's Courts or Designee
- Special Agent in Charge of the Federal Bureau of Investigation Atlanta Bureau or Designee
- A representative of the Georgia Department of Corrections
- A representative of each jurisdiction's Jail or Detention Center
- A member of each jurisdiction's Police Department's Gang Unit or designee in a similar capacity
- A Gang Unit Prosecutor from each jurisdiction
- A representative from United Youth-Adult Conference II
- A representative of a Non-Profit involved in gang-related prevention activities

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, solely for the purposes of convening a meeting, receiving information, (including public comment), and conducting a discussion, a quorum of the Metro Atlanta Task Force shall consist of those members attending a meeting thereof.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, for the purposes of taking all other official action, a quorum of the Metro Atlanta Task Force shall consist of one Chief of Police, District Attorney, Public Defender, School Superintendent, Chief Judge, Chief of Corrections/Jailer or their designees from no less than three of the member jurisdictions.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Office of Municipal Clerk is hereby directed to notify the above individuals and organizations to request that the names of their nominees be submitted to the Office of Municipal Clerk.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that members of The Metro Atlanta Task Force to Eradicate Gang Violence do not require confirmation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Atlanta Police Department and the Atlanta Police Foundation shall provide technical assistance and staffing to the Task Force.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Task Force shall elect a Chairman to preside over meetings and other officers as needed by the Task Force to conduct business.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Task Force shall submit a report to the full Atlanta City Council through an official communication to the Municipal Clerk that shall be read and filed;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this report shall be to the Mayor, President and Members of the Atlanta City Council and should address youth crime, gang violence, programming and policy changes of local jurisdictions, as well as any recommendations to **submit to the District Attorney of each participating county.**

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this task force shall terminate in two years and shall terminate upon two years from the date of final passage by Council, unless otherwise extended by a Resolution of the Atlanta City Council.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that all resolutions and parts of resolutions in conflict are hereby rescinded.



THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA, GEORGIA HEREBY ORDAINS, as follows:

Section 1: That Chapter 122, Article III, (Pawnbrokers), Division 1, Section 122-61 of the City of Atlanta Code of Ordinances which currently reads as follows:

Sec. 122-61. - Records required.

All pawnbrokers shall keep books wherein shall be entered an accurate description of all property pledged or sold to them. The description shall include the name of the maker of the article, any identifying mark or number and a statement of the kind of material of which it is made. In these books shall also be entered the name of the person by whom the article was deposited or sold and the time when the deposit or sale was done. These entries shall be made as soon after the transaction as is possible, in no event more than one hour thereafter. The books and the articles themselves so pledged or sold shall at all times be subject to inspection and examination by the police. Any person engaged in the business of a pawnbroker who shall fail or refuse to keep books as provided in this section or who shall make false entries concerning the transactions named or who shall fail or refuse to permit an inspection and examination by any police officer of the books and of the property pledged with or sold to them shall be guilty of an offense.

Shall be deleted in its entirety and replaces such that it shall read as follows:

Sec. 122-61. – Records required; electronic automated reporting system use required.

- (a) All pawnbrokers shall maintain books or records documenting accurate descriptions of all property pledged, traded, pawned, exchanged, or sold to the pawnbroker. Such description shall include, if reasonably available, the manufacturer, model, serial number, style, material, kind, color, design, number of stones if

jewelry, and all other identifying names, marks, and numbers. The pawnbroker shall assign a unique pawnshop transaction number documenting each transaction.

- (b) Each item received, excluding audio and video recordings, shall be tagged with the pawnshop transaction number. The tag bearing the pawnshop transaction number must remain attached to the item until the property is disposed of by sale, trade, or other lawful means.
- (c) ~~The pawnbroker shall require all persons pledging, trading, pawning, exchanging, or selling property to show proper identification prior to conducting a pawnshop transaction. Proper identification is defined as a government issued photo identification card such as a driver's license, military identification card, state identification card, or passport.~~
- (d) The pawnbroker shall document the name, address, telephone number, race, sex, height, weight, drivers license number, and date of birth of the person pledging, trading, pawning, exchanging, or selling the property, along with the date and time of transaction, the price paid or amount loaned, and the maturity date of the transaction. This documentation shall be made at the time of the transaction.
- (e) The pawnbroker shall photograph, with a digital camera, at the time of each transaction, the person pledging, trading, pawning, exchanging, or selling the property. The photograph shall clearly show a frontal view of the subject's face along with the pawnbroker's ticket transaction number. The pawnbroker shall also clearly photograph the property being pledged, traded, pawned, exchanged, or sold. Digital images shall be labeled and stored in such a manner that they are safe from corruption, readily identifiable, and readily available for review.
- (f) The pawnbroker shall obtain from each person pledging, trading, pawning, exchanging, or selling any property, the fingerprint of the right hand index finger, unless such finger is missing, in which event the print of the next finger in existence on the right hand shall be obtained with a notation as to the exact finger printed. The electronic digital fingerprint scanner will be the primary method of entry required. The fingerprint shall be imprinted onto the pawn transaction form in the designated area along with the signature of the person pawning, trading, pledging, exchanging, or selling the property. The fingerprint must be clear and legible. In the event that more than one pawn transaction form is required, a fingerprint and signature should be obtained for each form. Fingerprints and

the information required herein shall be obtained each time such person pledges, trades, pawns, exchanges, or sells any property.

- (g) Property that appears to be new, unused, and in its original packaging cannot be accepted by the pawnbroker unless the customer can supply a copy of the original sales receipt, or other proof of purchase from the place of purchase, to the pawnbroker who shall retain the receipt or proof of purchase on file.
- (h) The pawnbroker shall store the above records, digital images, and fingerprints for a period of four years and make them available to law enforcement personnel upon request.
- (i) Every pawnbroker shall enter each transaction, including all information, digital images and fingerprints required in subsections (a), (d), (e), and (f) above, as it occurs into the electronic automated reporting system via the internet, or upload electronically, via the internet, a batch file of all transactions for each business day, to the administrator of the electronic automated reporting system, immediately at the conclusion of each business day. The administrator of the electronic automated reporting system will electronically transmit all transactions to the department of police.
- (j) It shall be due cause for the suspension, a fine issued in lieu thereof, or revocation of a pawnshop license for any person engaged in the business of a pawnbroker to fail or refuse to keep books as provided in this section or to make false entries concerning the transactions named or to fail or refuse to permit an inspection and examination by any police officer of the books and of the property pledged with or sold to them.

Section 2: That Chapter 122, Article III, (Pawnbrokers), Division 1, Section 122-62 of the City of Atlanta Code of Ordinances which currently reads as follows:

Sec. 122-62. - Daily report to police; fingerprints and information required from persons pawning property.

- (a) *Contents of daily report.* Every pawnbroker shall make a daily report in writing to the department of police in the form prescribed by the police chief of all property pledged to or bought by the pawnbroker during the 24 hours ending at 8:00 p.m. on the date of the report. The reports shall be typewritten. In addition to any other information required by the police chief, the reports shall show the name and address of the pawnbroker; the time of the transaction; the serial number of pawn tickets; the amount paid or advanced; a full description of the articles, including kind, style, material, color, design, kind and number of stones in jewelry and all identifying

names, marks and numbers; and a description of person selling or pawning, including name, address, weight and height. Insufficient reports shall be rejected, and any pawnbroker making them shall be deemed guilty of an offense. In addition, pawnbrokers shall make daily reports of all typewriters, adding machines and radios coming into and going out of their places of business. The daily report shall be in such form and shall contain such information as may be required by the police chief, but shall contain sufficient information to identify each of the articles.

- (b) *Fingerprints and information required.* In addition to the owner records and information called for in subsection (a) of this section, each pawnbroker shall obtain from each person pawning any article with that pawnbroker the fingerprint of the right hand index finger, unless that finger is missing in which event the print of the next finger in existence on the right hand of the person pawning the article shall be obtained with a notation as to the exact finger printed. All prints shall be made on forms to be furnished by the department of police, and the pawnbroker shall obtain all other information called for on the form furnished. Fingerprints and the information as required in this section shall be obtained from all persons each time the persons pawn any article with a pawnbroker, regardless of whether or not that person may have previously pawned an article with the pawnbroker and been fingerprinted.
- (c) *Exception.* Subsection (b) of this section need not be complied with where the pawnbroker knows personally the person pawning the article or can identify within 90 days after the transaction the person pawning the article.
- (d) *Effect of failure to comply.* Failure to fingerprint or, in the alternative, to know personally or to be able to identify when called upon within 90 days after an article has been pawned the person pawning the article shall constitute an offense.

Shall be deleted in its entirety and replaces such that it shall read as follows:

Sec. 122-62. - Daily report to police.

- (a) Every pawnbroker shall make a daily report to the department of police in the form prescribed by the police chief of all property pledged to or bought by the pawnbroker during the 24 hours ending at 8:00 p.m. on the date of the report. The requirements of Section 122-61(i) shall satisfy the pawnbroker's daily reporting requirements.

- (b) In the event that the electronic automated reporting system becomes temporarily or permanently disabled, pawnbrokers will be notified as soon as possible by the department of police. Pawnshops that incur electronic system failures or other events that would cause partial or complete loss of electronic reporting should notify the department of police immediately with the reason for the failure. In either event, the pawnbrokers will be required to make records of transactions on paper forms. The records will include all of the information required in Section 122-61. Pawnbrokers shall maintain a minimum three-day supply of these paper forms.
- (c) The City of Atlanta shall select the required automated reporting system. There shall be no fees charged to the pawnbroker per transaction reported to the electronic automated reporting system. Any costs of the system shall be covered as part of the annual permit fee.
- (d) It shall be due cause for the suspension, a fine issued in lieu thereof, or revocation of a pawnshop license for any person engaged in the business of a pawnbroker to fail to provide the daily report to the department of police in accordance with this section.

Section 3: That Chapter 122, Article III, (Pawnbrokers), Division 1, Section 122-65 of the City of Atlanta Code of Ordinances shall be amended so that it shall read as follows (with permanent additions in underline font and permanent deletions in strikethrough font):

Sec. 122-65. - Time period for holding articles; police hold.

- (a) Any pawnbroker or person operating under a pawnbroker's license who takes ~~goods~~ property on pawn, buys ~~goods~~ property, taking full title thereto, ~~or otherwise acquires property~~ shall hold the ~~goods~~ property so taken in pawn or purchased for 30 days before disposing of them by sale, transfer, shipment or otherwise. This 30 day hold requirement shall not be applicable in instances where the property is redeemed as per a pawn transaction contract.
- (b) The department of police has the authority to place property that is the subject of police investigation on "police hold." In that event, the department of police shall notify the pawnbroker of the need of the police hold and identify all property subject to the police hold. Upon notification, it shall be the responsibility of the pawnbroker to maintain the subject property until such time as the property is released from police hold status, confiscated as evidence or returned to its rightful owner. As used in this section, the term "~~goods~~ property" shall be used in the broadest sense and shall include all kinds of personal property.

Section 4: That Chapter 122, Article III, (Pawnbrokers), Division 2, Section 122-85 of the City of Atlanta Code of Ordinances shall be amended so that it shall read as follows

(with permanent additions in underline font and permanent deletions in strikethrough font):

Sec. 122-85. - Renewal.

Licenses to operate a pawnshop shall be issued and renewed annually as of the date of the original issuance of the license for a fee of \$4000.00~~750.00~~. All applications for renewal licenses shall furnish all data, information and records requested by the license review board or the department of police. The chief of police or designee shall have the authority to renew the license, and such decision may be appealed to the license review board for a hearing and recommendation to the mayor for final action.

Section 5: That Chapter 122, Article IV, (Precious Metals Dealers), Division 1, Section 122-108 of the City of Atlanta Code of Ordinances which currently reads as follows:

Sec. 122-108. - Records required.

- (a) Every precious metals dealer shall maintain a book, in permanent form, in which shall be entered in legible English at the time of each purchase of precious metals or goods containing precious metals, the following information:
- (1) The date of the purchase transaction.
 - (2) The name of the person making the purchase from the seller.
 - (3) The name, age and address of the seller of the items purchased; a description of the general appearance of such seller or a photograph of the seller; and the number from such seller's driver's license or other similar identification.
 - (4) An identification and description of the purchased goods, including the serial numbers, model numbers or other numbers, and any identifying marks inscribed therein.
 - (5) The signature of the seller.
- (b) The permanent record book required in this section shall be maintained for each purchase of precious metals or goods for a period of four years.
- (c) Entries shall appear in chronological order in ink. No blank lines may be left between the entries. No obliterations, alterations or erasures may be made. Corrections shall be made by drawing a line of ink through the entry without destroying its legibility. The book and all precious metals and goods containing precious metals shall

be open to the inspection of any duly authorized law enforcement officer at all times.

Shall be deleted in its entirety and replaces such that it shall read as follows:

Sec. 122-108. – Records required; electronic automated reporting system use required.

- (a) All precious metals dealers shall maintain books or records documenting accurate descriptions of all precious metals sold to the precious metals dealer. Such description shall include, if reasonably available, the manufacturer, model, serial number, style, material, kind, color, design, number of stones if jewelry, and all other identifying names, marks, and numbers. The precious metals dealer shall assign a unique transaction number documenting each transaction.
- (b) Each item received, shall be tagged with the transaction number. The tag bearing the transaction number must remain attached to the item until the precious metals are disposed of by sale, trade, or other lawful means.
- (c) The precious metals dealer shall require all persons selling precious metals to show proper identification prior to conducting a transaction. Proper identification is defined as a government issued photo identification card such as a driver's license, military identification card, state identification card, or passport.
- (d) The precious metals dealer shall document the name, address, telephone number, race, sex, height, weight, drivers license number, and date of birth of the person selling the precious metals, along with the date and time of transaction, the price paid or amount loaned, and the maturity date of the transaction. This documentation shall be made at the time of the transaction.
- (e) The precious metals dealer shall photograph, with a digital camera, at the time of each transaction, the person selling the precious metals. The photograph shall clearly show a frontal view of the subject's face along with the precious metals dealer's ticket transaction number. The precious metals dealer shall also clearly photograph the precious metals being sold. Digital images shall be labeled and stored in such a manner that they are safe from corruption, readily identifiable, and readily available for review.
- (f) The precious metals dealer shall obtain from each person selling any precious metals, the fingerprint of the right hand index finger, unless such finger is missing, in which event the print of the next

finger in existence on the right hand shall be obtained with a notation as to the exact finger printed. The electronic digital fingerprint scanner will be the primary method of entry required. The fingerprint shall be imprinted onto the transaction form in the designated area along with the signature of the person selling the precious metals. The fingerprint must be clear and legible. In the event that more than one transaction form is required, a fingerprint and signature should be obtained for each form. Fingerprints and the information required herein shall be obtained each time such sells any precious metals.

-
- (g) Precious metals that appear to be new, unused, and in its original packaging cannot be accepted by the precious metals dealer unless the customer can supply a copy of the original sales receipt, or other proof of purchase from the place of purchase, to the precious metals dealer who shall retain the receipt or proof of purchase on file.
 - (h) The precious metals dealer shall store the above records, digital images, and fingerprints for a period of four years and make them available to law enforcement personnel upon request.
 - (i) Every precious metals dealer shall enter each transaction, including all information, digital images and fingerprints required in subsections (a), (d), (e), and (f) above, as it occurs into the electronic automated reporting system via the internet, or upload electronically, via the internet, a batch file of all transactions for each business day, to the administrator of the electronic automated reporting system, immediately at the conclusion of each business day. The administrator of the electronic automated reporting system will electronically transmit all transactions to the department of police.
 - (j) It shall be due cause for the suspension, a fine issued in lieu thereof, or revocation of a precious metals dealer license for any person engaged in the business of a precious metals dealer to fail or refuse to keep books as provided in this section or to make false entries concerning the transactions named or to fail or refuse to permit an inspection and examination by any police officer of the books and of the precious metals sold to them.

Section 6: That Chapter 122, Article IV, (Precious Metals Dealers), Division 1, Section 122-109 of the City of Atlanta Code of Ordinances which currently reads as follows:

Sec. 122-109. - Daily written report to police.

- (a) Every precious metals dealer shall make a daily report in writing to the department of police of all precious metals or goods containing

precious metals purchased during the 24 hours ending at 8:00 p.m. on the date of the report. The reports shall be on forms or on duplicate invoices as may be prescribed or approved by the department of police. The reports shall be typewritten and mailed or delivered to the department of police prior to 10:00 a.m. on the day following the date of the report. In addition to any other information required by the department of police, the reports shall include the name and address of the permittee, date of transaction, description and amount of the precious metals or goods containing precious metals purchased and the name and address of the person from whom purchased.

- (b) The department of police may promulgate rules and regulations consistent with this section to require the proper enforcement of this section.

Shall be deleted in its entirety and replaces such that it shall read as follows:

Sec. 122-109. - Daily report to police.

- (a) Every precious metals dealer shall make a daily report to the department of police in the form prescribed by the police chief of all precious metals pledged to or bought by the precious metals dealer during the 24 hours ending at 8:00 p.m. on the date of the report. The requirements of Section 122-108(i) shall satisfy the precious metals dealer's daily reporting requirements.
- (b) In the event that the electronic automated reporting system becomes temporarily or permanently disabled, precious metals dealers will be notified as soon as possible by the department of police. Precious metals dealers that incur electronic system failures or other events that would cause partial or complete loss of electronic reporting should notify the department of police immediately with the reason for the failure. In either event, the precious metals dealer will be required to make records of transactions on paper forms. The records will include all of the information required in Section 122-61. Precious metals dealers shall maintain a minimum three-day supply of these paper forms.
- (c) The City of Atlanta shall select the required automated reporting system. There shall be no fees charged to the precious metals dealer per transaction reported to the electronic automated reporting system. Any costs of the system shall be covered as part of the annual permit fee.
- (d) It shall be due cause for the suspension, a fine issued in lieu thereof, or revocation of a precious metals dealer license for any person

engaged in the business of a precious metals dealer to fail to provide the daily report to the department of police in accordance with this section.

Section 7: That Chapter 122, Article IV, (Precious Metals Dealers), Division 1, Section 122-110 of the City of Atlanta Code of Ordinances shall be amended so that it shall read as follows (with permanent additions in underline font and permanent deletions in strikethrough font):

Sec. 122-110. - Time period for retention; police hold.

- (a) For a period of 30 days, excluding Sundays and legal holidays, after the purchase or receipt of any precious metals or goods containing precious metals, every precious metals dealer shall retain upon the licensed premises or in a sealed vault off the premises, provided such a precaution is necessary for safekeeping, all such precious metals or goods containing precious metals purchased or received and shall not alter the original form, shape or condition of such metals or goods until that time shall have elapsed.
- (b) The department of police has the authority to place precious metals or goods containing precious metals that is the subject of police investigation on "police hold." In that event, the department of police shall notify the precious metals dealer of the need of the police hold and identify all precious metals subject to the police hold. Upon notification, it shall be the responsibility of the precious metals dealer to maintain the subject precious metals until such time as the precious metals are released from police hold status, confiscated as evidence or returned to its rightful owner.

Section 8: That Chapter 122, Article IV, (Precious Metals Dealers), Division 2, Section 122-127(c) of the City of Atlanta Code of Ordinances shall be amended so that it shall read as follows (with permanent additions in underline font and permanent deletions in strikethrough font):

- (c) Upon the issuance or renewal of a permit to engage in business as a precious metals dealer, the permit holder shall submit an annual permit fee in the amount of ~~\$750.00~~4000.00.

Section 9: That the Municipal Clerk is instructed to retain all legislative history references in the codified version of Chapter 122, including Editor's notes, and shall not delete any such references, but shall amend them to include this ordinance.

Section 10: That all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby waived to the extent of the conflict.

Section 11: This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its approval.

AN ORDINANCE BY COUNCILMEMBER KWANZA HALL REPEALING CERTAIN OFFENSES AGAINST PUBLIC ORDER LISTED IN CHAPTER 106, ARTICLE I, SECTION 106 OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA CODE OF ORDINANCES TO END BROKEN WINDOWS POLICING, AND BUILD TRUST BETWEEN LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICIALS AND COMMUNITIES; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.(HELD ON 7/26/16)

WHEREAS, recent violent events involving police officers and citizens throughout the US have sparked widespread protests in the City of Atlanta; and

WHEREAS, a myriad of policies have contributed to the conflict, distrust and tension between law enforcement and certain communities; and

WHEREAS, policies such as "broken windows" policing, financially driven court systems, and "debtors jails," concentrate law enforcement not on preventing violence and harm, but instead target and profile the most vulnerable members of our communities for arrests and jail time; and

WHEREAS, these policies have made our communities less safe as many view police as threat rather than protection; and

WHEREAS, the current crisis in confidence of the public towards police officers nationally and locally is one that must be addressed swiftly and holistically; and

WHEREAS, Atlanta Municipal Code contains 85 "quality of life" offenses which encourages pretextual stops, racial and gender bias in policing and often result in harassment; and

WHEREAS, many offenses regulated by the Atlanta Municipal Code are duplicative of State law and which often result in the over-criminalization of individuals in the Atlanta City Detention Center charged with a variety of municipal violations; and

WHEREAS, the 400 people in the Atlanta City Detention Center on any given day are overwhelmingly Black and poor and taken to jail for offenses such as spitting, jay walking, and idling and loitering; and

WHEREAS, the manner in which our criminal justice system operates has created a backlog of individuals in jails and prisons, and these facilities are not the proper place for many people; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Atlanta City Council to repeal certain Sections of Chapter 106 Offenses and Miscellaneous Provisions of Municipal Code of the City of Atlanta.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA, GEORGIA
HEREBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: The following sections of Chapter 106 are hereby repealed.

ARTICLE I. -IN GENERAL

- Sec. 106-1. - Loitering around railroad tracks or shops; swinging onto trains.
- Sec. 106-2. - Solicitation of defense of prisoners or legal business.

- Sec. 106-10. - Distribution of free tobacco products in public places prohibited.
- Sec. 106-11. - Use of drinking water reservoir prohibited.
- Sec. 106-12.- Urban camping and improper use of public places.

- Sec. 106-51. - Theft by shoplifting.
- Sec. 106-53.- Destruction of property.
- Sec. 106-54. - Defacing buildings.
- Sec. 106-55.- Injuring or interfering with public service property.
- Sec. 106-56. - Unauthorized persons entering vacant buildings.
- Sec. 106-57.- Unauthorized interference or attempted interference with parked vehicles.
- Sec. 106-58. - Transportation passes and nontransferable tickets.
- Sec. 106-59. - Resale of entertainment tickets restricted.

ARTICLE III. - OFFENSES AGAINST PUBLIC ORDER

- Sec. 106-81. - Disorderly conduct.
- Sec. 106-82. - Unauthorized persons entering school buildings.
- Sec. 106-83.- Unauthorized persons not to remain in school buildings when requested to leave.

- Sec. 106-85.- Monetary solicitation.
- Sec. 106-86.- Reserved.
- Sec. 106-87.- Treasure hunts.
- Sec. 106-88.- Moving household goods at night.
- Sec. 106-89. - Residential picketing.

- Sec. 106-126.- House of ill fame.

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING CERTAIN OFFENSES AGAINST PUBLIC ORDER LISTED IN CHAPTER 106, ARTICLE I, SECTION 106 OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA CODE OF ORDINANCES TO END BROKEN WINDOWS POLICING, AND BUILD TRUST BETWEEN LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICIALS AND COMMUNITIES; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, recent violent events involving police officers and citizens throughout the US have sparked widespread protests in the City of Atlanta; and

WHEREAS, a myriad of policies have contributed to the conflict, distrust and tension between law enforcement and certain communities; and

WHEREAS, policies such as “broken windows” policing, financially driven court systems, and “debtors jails,” concentrate law enforcement not on preventing violence and harm, but instead target and profile the most vulnerable members of our communities for arrests and jail time; and

WHEREAS, these policies have made our communities less safe as many view police as threat rather than protection; and

WHEREAS, the current crisis in confidence of the public towards police officers nationally and locally is one that must be addressed swiftly and holistically; and

WHEREAS, Atlanta Municipal Code contains 85 “quality of life” offenses which encourages pretextual stops, racial and gender bias in policing and often result in harassment; and

WHEREAS, many offenses regulated by the Atlanta Municipal Code are duplicative of State law and which often result in the over-criminalization of individuals in the Atlanta City Detention Center charged with a variety of municipal violations; and

WHEREAS, the 400 people in the Atlanta City Detention Center on any given day are overwhelmingly Black and poor and taken to jail for offenses such as spitting, jay walking, and idling and loitering; and

WHEREAS, the manner in which our criminal justice system operates has created a backlog of individuals in jails and prisons, and these facilities are not the proper place for many people; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Atlanta City Council to repeal certain Sections of Chapter 106 Offenses and Miscellaneous Provisions of Municipal Code of the City of Atlanta.

WHEREAS, on December 18, 2014, President Barack Obama signed an executive order establishing the Task Force on 21st Century Policing; and

WHEREAS, the President charged the Task Force with identifying best practices and offering recommendations on how policing practices can promote effective crime reduction while building public trust; and

WHEREAS, the final report was published in May 2015 and is organized around six main topic areas or "pillars:" Building Trust and Legitimacy, Policy and Oversight, Technology and Social Media, Community Policing and Crime Reduction, Officer Training and Education, and Officer Safety and Wellness; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the Task Force recommendations Georgia Bureau of Investigation (GBI) agreed to the requests made by Chiefs of Police of Atlanta and DeKalb County to conduct all such investigations where the involved officer was from either of those police forces and today there is external and independent criminal investigation of such uses of force by members of Atlanta Police Department; and

WHEREAS, Atlanta Police Department is part of the Advancing 21st Century Policing Initiative that provides hands-on assessments and technical assistance to a cohort of law enforcement agencies that have already made strides in advancing task force recommendation implementation; and

WHEREAS, the Atlanta Police Department is also a Police Data Initiative participant.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA, GEORGIA, that continued study and implementations of the 21st Century Policing Task Force Recommendations should be undertaken by Atlanta Police Department, the Atlanta City Council and Atlanta communities.

A RESOLUTION BY COUNCILMEMBER KWANZA HALL ESTABLISHING A CITY OF ATLANTA 21ST CENTURY POLICING TASK FORCE TO FURTHER IMPLEMENTATION OF PRESIDENT BARACK OBAMA'S 21ST CENTURY POLICING TASK FORCE RECOMMENDATIONS,; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

WHEREAS, on December 18, 2014, President Barack Obama signed an executive order establishing the Task Force on 21st Century Policing; and

WHEREAS, the President charged the Task Force with identifying best practices and offering recommendations on how policing practices can promote effective crime reduction while building public trust; and

WHEREAS, the final report was published in May 2015 and is organized around six main topic areas or "pillars:" Building Trust and Legitimacy, Policy and Oversight, Technology and Social Media, Community Policing and Crime Reduction, Officer Training and Education, and Officer Safety and Wellness; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the Task Force recommendations Georgia Bureau of Investigation (GBI) agreed to the requests made by Chiefs of Police of Atlanta and DeKalb County to conduct all such investigations where the involved officer was from either of those police forces and today there is external and independent criminal investigation of such uses of force by members of Atlanta Police Department; and

WHEREAS, Atlanta Police Department is part of the Advancing 21st Century Policing Initiative that provides hands-on assessments and technical assistance to a cohort of law enforcement agencies that have already made strides in advancing task force recommendation implementation; and

WHEREAS, the Atlanta Police Department is also a Police Data Initiative participant.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA, GEORGIA, that continued study and implementations of the 21st Century Policing Task Force Recommendations should be undertaken by Atlanta Police Department, the Atlanta City Council and Atlanta communities.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Atlanta Police Department, Atlanta City Council, and in concert with expert stakeholders, shall create a city-wide task force to review and evaluate our criminal justice system as it operates in Atlanta and its effects on communities. The Task Force shall be encharged with (1) providing comprehensive, regular review of how our city is policed, (2) supporting reform so that people of color and poor people in particular encounter law enforcement in ways that do not infringe on their civil rights and liberties, and (3) committing expert opinion and resources to implementation of Atlanta being a 21st Century Policing site.
