The City of Atlanta is requesting comment on the 2015 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program from residence of the City of Atlanta.

The Edward Byrne Memorial Assistance Grant (JAG) Program is the primary provider of federal criminal justice funding to state and local jurisdictions. The JAG Program provides states and units of local governments with critical funding necessary to support a range of program areas including law enforcement, prosecution and court programs, prevention and education programs, corrections and community correction, drug treatment and enforcement, crime victim and witness initiatives, and planning, evaluation, and technology improvement programs. This is a joint venture between City of Atlanta and Fulton County. The total funding is in the amount of \$565,626.00, 75% will go to City of Atlanta and 25% to Fulton County.

The City of Atlanta has proposed to use its award of \$424,219 for Part One Crime Suppression as well as to partially fund the position of a Financial Analyst, Sr., who will be responsible for managing the grant.
