








Produce positive outcomes for
Atlanta's youth by providing youth
programs in a safe, structured learning
environment that collectively focuses
on five pillars: Academic Enrichment,
Character and Leadership
Development, Health and Fitness,
Technology Skills Development, and
Community Engagement & Service

Program Pillar	Positive Youth Outcome
Academic Enrichment	Youth are at current or above grade level in reading and math
Character/Leadership Development	Youth are positive about their futures and are productive citizens
Health & Fitness	Youth are healthy
Technology Skills Development	Youth are engaging responsibly in modern technology
Community Engagement & Service	Youth contribute positively to their community



CENTERS OF HOPE AFTERSCHOOL PROGRAM & CAMP(us) BEST FRIENDS 2018




Expanded Centers of Hope afterschool programming to **21 current sites** (including partners) by 2018;

Hot Meals program currently serves ~1,100 youth and ~200 seniors per day; **550,000+ hot meals** served to date (since 2013)

Focus on affordability enabled through sliding scale rates based on income; approximately half of participants leverage sliding scale discounts

Working with key partnerships to continue invest in amenities:

- Coca Cola provided initial programming support and PlayMobile activation
- Google computer labs at several Recreation Centers
- Atlanta Hawks basketball court renovation at 6 locations and teen room at Pittman











ATLANTA TEEN LEADERS

\$5/year reduced from \$50/year in 2016 for accessibility

Youth athletics program serving **5,300+ YTD in FY18** across **10 programs**, including new soccer, futsal, water polo and rugby programs

Offer **sliding scale fees** (like afterschool and CBF) for families who qualify based on income; in FY18 YTD at least **60%+ of participating youth paid less than half of the full price** of participation, with 33% paying no fee






- West End playground is nearing completion


