

Watershed Matters

- Regulatory compliance consent decrees, NPDES permits

DWM's Flexible Levels, Options, & Affordable Terms (F.L.O.A.T.) Initiative



- DOL's Watershed Team assisted DWM in establishing an amnesty-like program to assist customers with outstanding bills.
- Authorized by City Council approved code amendments in
 21-O-0883 & 22-O-1779
- Program runs from July 28, 2022 January 1, 2023 and provides:
 - Account adjustments, interest-free payment plans, one-time grants and credits, and service requests to correct meter issues.
 - Customers can discuss account at FLOAT events on multiple dates at locations across the city.

DWM's Flexible Levels, Options, & Affordable Terms (F.L.O.A.T.) Initiative



DOL Attorneys provided advice/counsel on:

- Legal authority to create initiative;
- Day-to-day operations, including Standard Operating Procedures;
- Collectability of outstanding accounts;
- Drafting legislation to expand power to adjust accounts; and
- Council communications, and public outreach/engagement.





Office of Sustainability and Resilience

Carbon Credit Program



- First of its kind in Georgia and only third known for a municipal urban forest.
- Uses the carbon captured by the Lake Charlotte Nature Preserve to create marketable carbon credits.
- Carbon credits may be sold on the open market to generate income for the City.



Chattahoochee Brick Site

- Advising Watershed Management, Enterprise
 Asset Management, and Parks and Recreation
 on environmental site issues, including clean-up
 requirements.
- Assisted with closing process by negotiating environmental documentation and drafting environmental clauses for the sale contract.
- Ongoing advice on processes for remediation of the site to enable the contemplated end uses.
