Intown Cares is a longtime champion and ally to intown Atlantans in great need. We were founded in 2010 as Intown Collaborative Ministries, a cohort of congregations that provided and operated a food pantry.

Over the years, our mission expanded - we began helping those who have long lived on Atlanta's streets find permanent housing.

Today, we still receive vital support from our original congregations, as well as from government grants, foundations, businesses, community partners, and individual donors.

Helping neighbors move to food security

- Operates one of the largest most innovative low-barrier food pantries in Atlanta
- No requirements for ID, proof of citizenship, or pay stubs, and no limits on how often people can visit
- An expanded grocery delivery service for people who cannot travel to the pantry to pick up food, supported by volunteers and our partnership with Amazon
