The PAD Initiative

PAD takes a comprehensive approach to **reduce arrest and incarceration** and **increase the accessibility of supportive services** to more effectively address quality-of-life concerns

Community First Response


ATL311 line dispatches PAD community responder teams for concerns related to substance use, mental health or extreme poverty

Diversion

People with needs related to substance use, mental health or extreme poverty may be diverted to PAD by law enforcement or prosecutors

Care Navigation

Reduce barriers to stability and increase community connections through care navigation, emergency housing, and direct supports



Reducing police contact & incarceration

Reduce calls to 911

- Community members have more options with 311
- Appropriate 911 calls transferred to 311
- Potential for 988 for 24/7 coverage


Reduce police contact

- Calls to 311 and transfers from 911 reduce police dispatch
- Community responders offer appropriate support

Reduce incarceration


- People are connected to resources instead of arrest
- People are diverted from jail to resources

There were 227 pre-arrest diversions and 37 partner agency diversions last fiscal year




The average diversion response time was 21 minutes


Most pre-arrest diversions come from council districts 2-4.




PAD received 1,333 requests through ATL 311 last fiscal year



311 requests came from all council districts




PAD made over 460 housing placements in the last fiscal year



Additionally, 6 people were placed in private housing over the course of the year, and 1 person was placed in transitional housing.
