- Afterschool programming began August 1st: Mon-Fri 2:30-6pm
- 1,100 enrollees currently for Aug./ Sept.; serving students 5-12 years
- Includes APS, Police Athletic League, and At Promise students
- 12 approved vendors offering STEAM and athletic programs

Atlanta Teen Leaders

- ATL Teen Leaders focuses on development and safety of Atlanta Youth Ages 13-18
- Launched summer Boys Academy (ages 13-15); teaching life, social + professional skills
- Renovated teen rooms at Dunbar and Adams Rec Centers
- (2) ATL Teen Leaders have earned a paid internship with Historically Black University of Content
- 30 Teens received an exclusive all-access tour of Tyler Perry Studios

Summer Food Program

- DPR Summer Mobile Food Program from 6/5-7/21
- Snacks and hot meals for afterschool programming
- 17,000+ snacks and meals served in August to afterschool students
- Serving 19 recreation centers with meals Monday-Friday
- Increased program reimbursement 211% from FY22 to FY23
- Increased from 26 sites in 2022 to 38 sites in 2023

Aquatics

- DPR established a process for tracking outdoor visitor pools
- Approximately 1,746 daily patrons served at outdoor pools in July 2023
- DPR continues management and lifeguard operations over the outdoor pools
- 80 new lifeguards received their National Lifeguard Certifications
- Fall Programs: Learn 2 Swim, Dolphins, Water Aerobics, Senior Aerobics





Pickleball Pilot Happening Now

- Pickleball overlay courts will be painted (across all Council Districts) as part of an ongoing pilot program
- 47 total pickleball courts: 14 are dedicated courts + 33 are shared overlays
- Goal is to learn what works well and what needs to be improved to make pickleball successful in Atlanta
- Pilot will inform future strategy re: additional overlays, dedicated courts, or a combination of both
- DPR offers free use of pickleball equipment including net, paddles, and drop-down lines at all 5 tennis centers



City in a Forest:

Urban Forestry Grant <u>Awarded!</u>

Protecting Atlanta's Legacy Grant will create:

- The City's first comprehensive Urban Forest Master Plan;
- Establishing a strategy and standards for systematic, equitable, and effective management of the urban forest
- In disadvantaged areas making up 49.6% of the city, the project will complete comprehensive urban forest assessments;
- Oversee risk reduction maintenance of trees
- Restore forested areas
- Install signage to connect people with natural environment
 - \$5,000,000 DPR
 - \$10,000,000 Trees Atlanta
 - \$2,000,000 Partnership for Southern Equity
 - \$439,100 ECO-Action

Grant submitted in collaboration with DCP, in alignment with Trees Atlanta.

Millage Increase Next Steps City Council increased the dedicated Park Millage and allocated \$16 million for Parks & Recreation Improvements and other needs: build + repair parks and rec facilities, expand rec opportunities, install cameras, establish a Park Ranger program, and provide training and equipment.

DPR will host a series of (3) Community Meetings starting 9/25 to share about the Millage Increase, plan for allocating these funds in alignment with community + staff input + progress made to Activate ATL!




Atlantans supportive of improving and upgrading parks and outdoor recreation facilities
