### WorkSource Atlanta Grant

## Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA)





#### Grantor

- U.S. Department of Labor, Employment and Training Administration
- Pass through entity is Technical College System of Georgia , Office of Workforce Development

#### Population Served

- Adults, age 18 or older who are unemployed or underemployed
- Dislocated Workers, age 18 or older who have been laid off
- Youth, ages 14-24 who are at-risk

#### **Award**

- Three funding streams (Adult, Dislocated Worker, and Youth)
- Formula funds that incorporate the Local Workforce
   Development Area's poverty level, unemployment rate, and overall population.

#### Funding Period


- Adult and Dislocated Worker funds are awarded 2x a year (July/October)
- Youth funds are awarded 1x a year (April)
- These funds are awarded for a period of two (2) years.
- Eighty (80) percent of each year's total grant award must be obligated or spent by June 30 of the following year.






## WIOA Customer Groups Served (Caseload)


