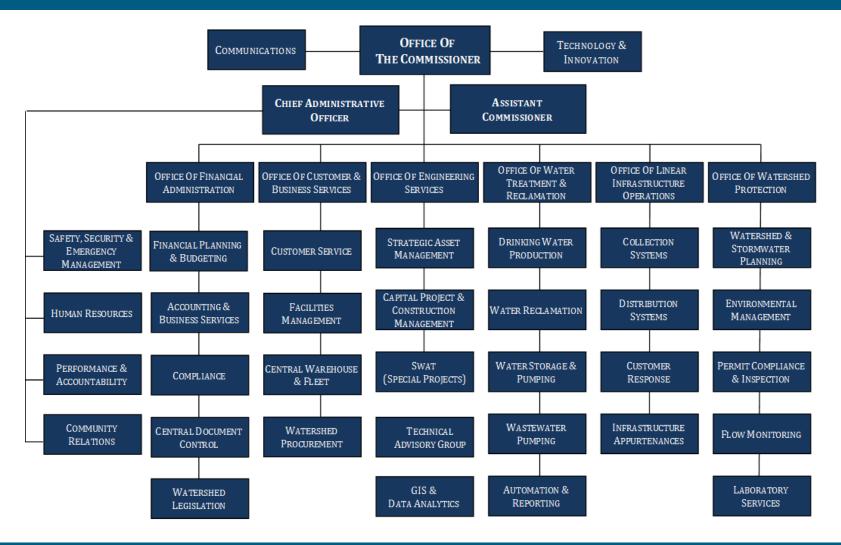

FY25 Budget Considerations O&M (5051 & 5052)

- DWM anticipates an increase of roughly \$38M in operating budget for FY25 that reflects:
 - Increases to salary and benefits to remain at parity with other employers and retain critical employees
 - The department funded all vacant positions
 - Inflation of contractor and supplies expenses due to inflation and supply chain impacts
 - o Increase in fuel and chemical costs
 - Additional bank fees as more customers move to on-line payments
 - 5051 and 5052 combined for total DWM O&M budget

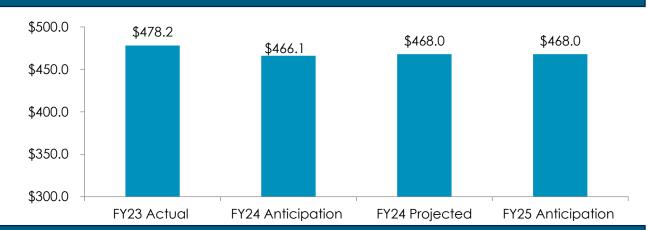

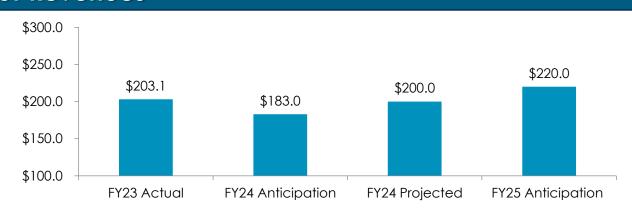
Water and Sewer Service Revenue

MOST Revenues

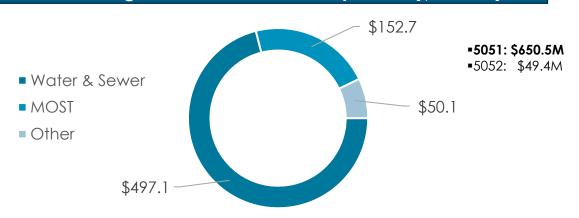
- Anticipated revenues of \$220.0M for MOST; increase over prior year's revenue projection

FY24 Budget Total Revenue Anticipations (\$699.9M)



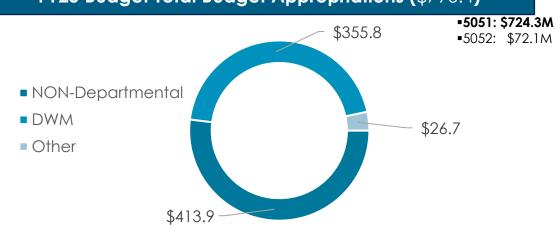
FY24 Budget Total Budget Appropriations (\$699.9M)



FY25 Budget Total Revenue Anticipations (\$796.4)



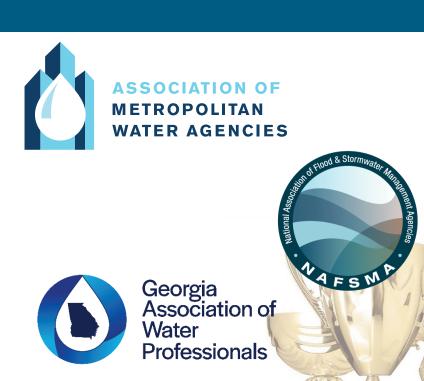
