Impact

\$10M commitment under a \$40M federal grant to support grocery attraction, enable workforce development, accelerate job creation, and direct small business investment.



<u>Impact</u>

\$12.5M NMTC to support renovation of a 43,000 sq ft HQ with commercial kitchen for production of medically tailored meals.



Impact

Up to **\$200K** to enable the delivery of specialized technical assistance for independent grocery businesses.



Impact

\$100K Atlanta Recovery Loan Program and **\$50K** CPIG grant



Impact

\$750K for CPIG fresh food access grants.



Impact

\$1M EOF grant to support food access point design, buildout, inventory, and operations for 2 years at iVillage.






Economic Development Program Funding
