- -DGCD solicited applications to address eligible needs of low to moderate income residents, homeless residents, and community development for the FY 2024 Entitlement Grant allocations for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG), HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME), and Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA).
- -DFGCD is currently reviewing applications for forthcoming award recommendations and Annual Action Plan submission.
