Objective

About the Data

This report analyzed <u>180 incidents</u>, assigned to the Office of the Public Defender, occurring in a neighborhood planning unit in <u>July 2023</u>.







Case Rates by NPU vs. City of Atlanta

Rates of cases in July 2023 assigned to Office of the Public Defender



Higher case rates inform priority NPUs

The City of Atlanta case rate is 3.8 per 10,000 residents. Some NPU case rates exceed the City of Atlanta Rate.



Data-Informed Strategies

Some considerations from the data and next steps for engaging NPU leaders



Defensive driving interventions

The largest share of incidents were traffic-related. Encouraging clients to complete defensive driving courses may reduce the number of overall incidents.



Documentation support for residents

Almost 1 in 5 cases involved a lack of documentation. Broadening programs helping NPU residents obtain or renew legal documentation could be helpful.



Policing diversion

Many cases involved disorderly conduct or substance use. We may consider working with NPU leaders to

- (1) encourage residents to use non-police responses
- (2) expand holistic service programs
- (3) identify community partners
