




- Celebrating 43 years of CBF!

 - 24 overlays + 20 dedicated courts remaining in pilot to be built (In April 2023, there were only 4 pickleball overlays + 0 dedicated courts)



- Ongoing: Piedmont, Selena Butler, Adams, A. Flanagan, Deerwood, William



NATURAL AREAS

- Invasive removal in Tree Trust Fund (TTF) acquired preserves - Lake Charlotte Nature Preserve, Southwest Nature Preserve, and Utoy Creek Nature Preserve.
 - Millage funded invasive removal at more sites.
- 48 invasive plant control volunteer projects over 2
 years as part of the Community Based Forestry
 Contract, starting in FY25 (funded via TTF).
- Natural Areas Team + Director of Natural Resources to be hired by DPR.
- Urban and Community Forestry Grant \$1.2M from Inflation Reduction Act grant allocated for invasive removal in South Bend Park + Swann Nature Preserve to start FY26.
