






REDUCE GREENHOUSE GAS (GHG) EMISSIONS BY 40% BY 2030

GHG INVENTORY

- Total Metric Tons CO2e 2021 = 7,454,199
 ➤ 31% reduction in 2021 from 2009 baseline
- REDUCTION NEEDED TO MEET THE GOAL
 = 905,400 mT CO2e (by 2030)



Climate Resilience Action Plan Roadmap


