

City of Atlanta Recovery Fund for Small Business

Grants to eligible small businesses to support Atlanta's communities, trade, industry and commerce.


As this is a unique situation in which the City has declared a state of emergency, these grants are to help small businesses recover from the disruption in water service.



- 1) Data Analysis
- 2) Direct Outreach to Businesses on Impact

Sample actions in last week:

- Small Business Mixer at Pittsburgh Yards with 100+ businesses
- Executed 6 Mayoral visits to affected businesses in various corridors
- Consulted with organizations, including: GMSDC, 100 Black Men, Our Village United, Atlanta BeltLine, Central Atlanta Progress, and Metro Atlanta Chamber, among others





Two Step Process

Step 1:

Prioritization of Businesses

- 1. Businesses located within the Impacted Areas
 - June 3rd
 - May 31
- 2. Priority NAICS/Industry codes


Step 2:


Award Amount

- 1. Revenue of the business
- 2. Number of days closed/impacted

Each application will be reviewed on a case by case with an appeals process.









- Only businesses with verified addresses within the impacted BWA areas will be approved.
- Priority will be given to industries most directly impacted, including restaurants, beauty salons spas, and daycares
- Application ranking will also consider the number of days the business was impacted
- Businesses must be registered with the Georgia
 Secretary of State and have an active City of
 Atlanta business license

Criterion 1:

Businesses closed/impacted for 4 days or more receive more funding

Criterion 2:

Funding based on the revenue of the business

Revenue brackets are recommended as follows:

- < \$500,000</p>
- **\$500,000 \$1,000,000**
- **>** \$1,000,000

Combined, we have the following structure:

- Closed/Impacted 1-3 days, revenue < \$500,000 ~ \$2,000
- Closed/Impacted 1-3 days, revenue \$500,000 \$1,000,000 ~ \$4,000
- Closed/Impacted 1-3 days, revenue > \$1,000,000 ~ \$5,000
- Closed/Impacted 4+ days, revenue < \$500,000 ~ \$6,000
- Closed/Impacted 4+ days, revenue \$500,000 \$1,000,000 ~ \$8,000
- Closed/Impacted 4+ days, revenue > \$1,000,000 ~ \$10,000

Most of the items needed for the application:

- Active business license
- Articles of Incorporation
- Operating Agreement for the corporate bylaws
- Secretary of State registration
- Proof of Revenue: Point of Sale Report for the week prior and the impacted week
- Impact Statement
- Save Affidavit
- Insurance policy
- Proof of damage and/or revenue loss
- Reporting/Compliance affidavit



Ineligibility

Expenses:

Costs already covered through insurance claims

Business Types:

- Non-profit organizations without for-profit activities
- Businesses that derive any part of their annual gross income (including rental income) (or any of its principal owners) from gambling activities, except in those cases where an otherwise eligible small business concerns obtains less than 1/3 of its annual gross income from its income or commissions from the sale of official state lottery tickets under a state license
- Individuals or organizations who hold real property for passive sale or investment with no active ties to a for profit business with activities at the location
- Home-based businesses
- Businesses from the following industries or types: pawn shops, liquor stores, night clubs, CBD stores, adult business as defined by City Code Section 16-29.001(3)
- Businesses owned or operated by officials or employees of the City of Atlanta or Invest Atlanta
- Corporate-owned franchises
