

ENGLEWOOD APARTMENTS

In partnership with Invest Atlanta, The Benoit Group and Atlanta Housing

\$3M TAD Increment Fund Grant to help bring 160 new units of senior affordable housing to Chosewood Park

Located adjacent to Atlanta BeltLine Southside Trail

1 & 2 BR units for seniors 62 and above earning 60% AMI and below





MURPHY CROSSING

Culdesac in partnership with Urban Oasis Development officially selected by Invest Atlanta and ABI

1,100 new affordable housing units when complete

- 30% of rental will be 60-80% AMI for 30+ years
- 5% permanently affordable
- Affordable commercial space





AFFORDABLE HOUSING PRODUCTION

2006-2018:

 1,638 units created or preserved in TAD

2021:

 366 units created or preserved, exceeding goal of 320 units

2022:


- 2022 Goal of 320 units
- Actual units: 421 units
- Exceed goal by 31.5%

2023:

- 2023 goal of 310 units
- Actual units: 407 units
- Exceed goal by 31.3%

2024

- ~300 units/year to meet 5,600 unit goal (219 so far)
- 318 units in pipeline





PROTECTING LEGACY RESIDENTS

10-year tax relief program for legacy residents in BeltLine Equity Priority Subareas


Covers property tax increases through 2030

228 homeowners currently approved

Average years in home: 22 years

Average Age of homeowner: 61

68% of homeowners earn <50% Area Median Income



8 segments of the mainline trail are under construction


In Q3, 85% of the loop will be delivered or under construction

Southside Trail -Segments 2 +3

1.9 miles between Pittsburgh Yards and Boulevard

Officially closed for construction

Signs posted at closed locations with suggested detour routes

Target Completion Early 2026





SOUTHSIDE TRAIL SEGMENTS 4+5

Southside Trail -Segments 4+5

1.2 miles between Boulevard and Glenwood Avenue

Closed for construction

Target Completion Summer 2025





Single Lane Closures: June 14th — Mid September







Vehicle Availability
