

## **Challenges and Threats**

- 1. Continued decreases in federal allocations will continue to impact high performing states like GA.
  - 3% reduction in funding for FY 2025 for WIOA programs, including youth-based programs.
  - More than 40% reduction in overall funding for federal WIOA programs since 2014
- 2. Proposed federal re-authorization poses challenges
  - A Stronger Workforce for America Act proposed the following changes:
    - Additional 10% holdback to state labor departments for industry initiatives
    - Less flexibility will make it more difficult to provide supportive services such as childcare and transportation assistance, tools, uniforms, or other work required items.

### Strategy

- Identify philanthropy solutions for ancillary services and enhance Mayor's Signature programs
- Facilitated 1<sup>st</sup> philanthropy roundtable with local, state, and national funders on June 6, 2024. Those in attendance:
  - JP Morgan Chase Global Philanthropies
  - The Annie E Casey Foundation
  - The Arthur M. Blank Family Foundation
  - The United Way of Greater Atlanta

- Partnership with the Annie E. Casey Foundation
  - Identify and assist up to 50 SYEP participants in obtaining permanent employment
    - Will also focus on City of Atlanta job openings for up to 30 additional SYEP participants.
  - Paid training and on-the-job (OJT) training.
  - Industry focus on Healthcare and IT.
  - \$330,000 total award (Cash and In-kind) from Annie E Casey Foundation.

#### Labor Services

- Labor Education and Awareness-
  - Starting in July 2024, ADOLES will facilitate a labor awareness and education campaign, in partnership with selected vendors. Topics will include items such as identifying wage theft, worker mis-classification, etc.
  - Campaign will provide services to both employers and employees.
  - Goal: training 10 employers (small businesses) and 125 workers in the initial program offering.

#### Labor Services

- Internal Ethics and OIG training
  - ADOLES will partner with HR and Law department, respectively, to provide internal training for COA employees on topics that relate directly to the Mayor's pillar of Effective and Ethical government.
  - ADOLES will collaborate with HR and Law to educate COA employees on the topic of rights and responsibilities related to COA Office of Ethics and Office of Inspector General requests.
  - Focus on proper protocols and communication. Being responsive to requests.
  - Partner with HR and Law to develop policy and procedural guidelines for all employees from the lens of communication and cooperation.

## **WorkForce Services**

- TCSG Monitoring was held on March 4<sup>th</sup> 8<sup>th</sup>, and there were zero findings.
- Hired Adult/Dislocated Worker and Youth staff to enhance the overall program efficiency and continuous improvement of program outcomes.
- Quest Grant Award \$700K has been extended to September 2025; 50 homeless or background-challenged customers have been served.
- Added 15 new Training Providers to include but not limited to construction, CDL training and IT programs that offer nationally recognized credentials.
