



Policing Alternatives & Diversion

PAD is an Atlanta-based non-profit organization that improves community safety and wellness by:

- Addressing the needs of people experiencing concerns related to substance use, mental health and extreme poverty
- 2. Reducing police engagement and incarceration of people experiencing these concerns
- 3. Increasing connections to supportive services, shelter, and other resources



Diversions to PAD, May-July 2024

54 Diversions Top diverted charges: Criminal Trespass, Shoplifting, Public Indecency, and Pedestrian in Roadway

25 people (46%) were arrested but diverted by prosecutors postbooking because they were eligible for PAD

19-minute average response time

Community Response, May-July 2024


488 Calls to 311

91 calls deflected from 911

389 calls (80%) were designated as requiring immediate assistance

17-minute average response time to calls designated as requiring an immediate response

Top 311 Caller Concerns Among Successful Engagements






Trans women

64 New participants enrolled




Care Navigation, May-July 2024
