Continued partnership with the Mayor's Office of Emergency Preparedness by providing meals, linen, and hygiene items for the Bridge Detail initiative.

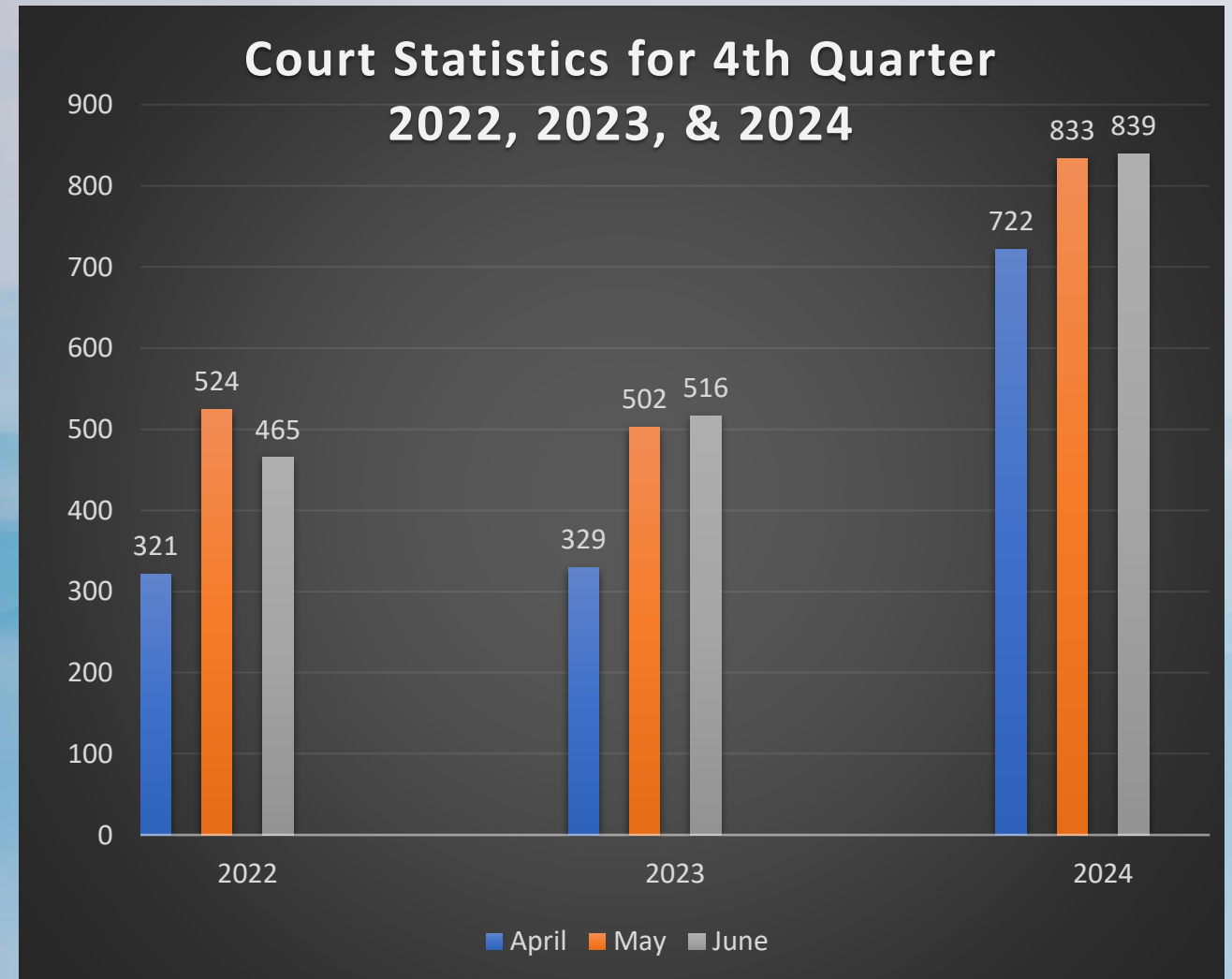

Virtual Court Statistics



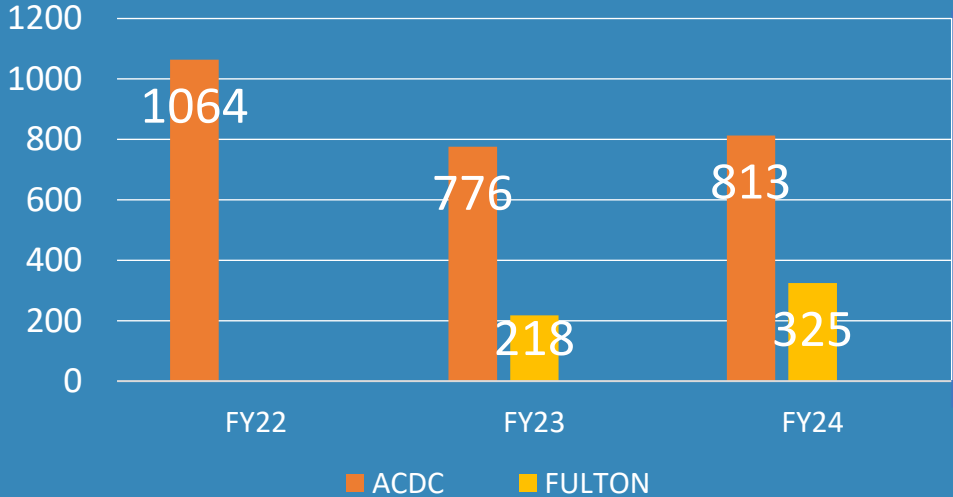
Brings the courtroom to detainees when transport poses challenges.



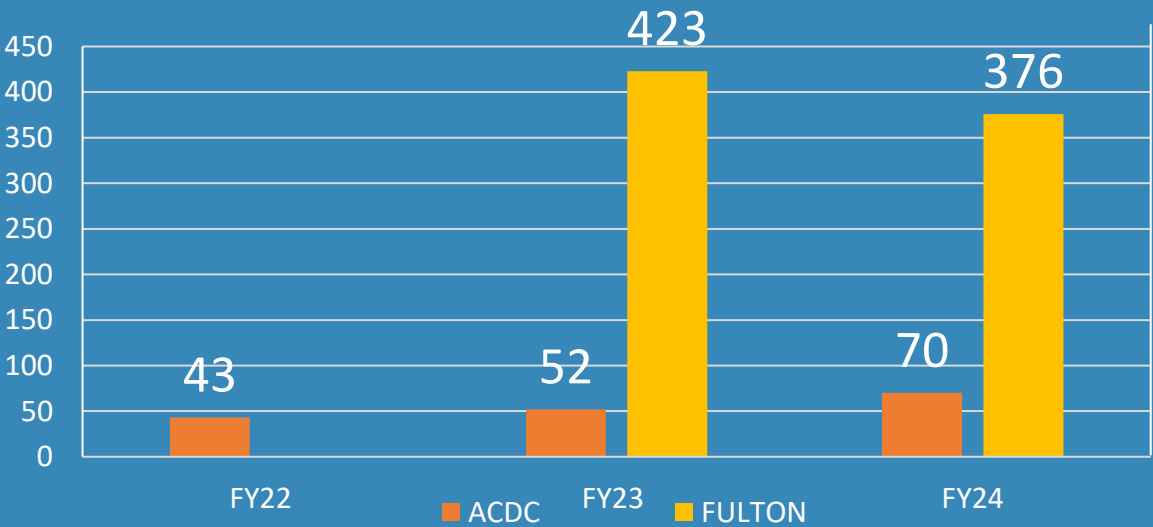
Total 4th Quarter FY24: 2,394 In-Custody Court Count

Career Fair "Hiring Blitz" was held on June 3rd, 2024, for Food Services.

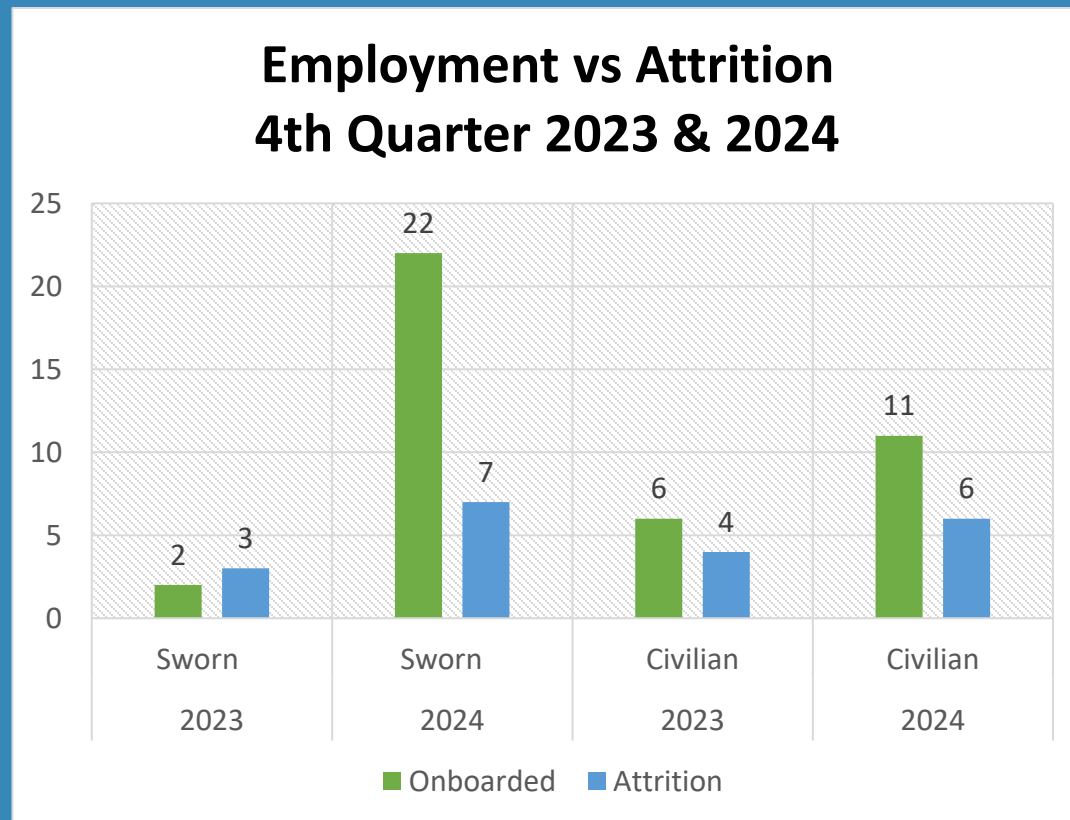
One of the highlights of the Summer Internship was their contribution to start and design our Corrections website.

April - June 2024



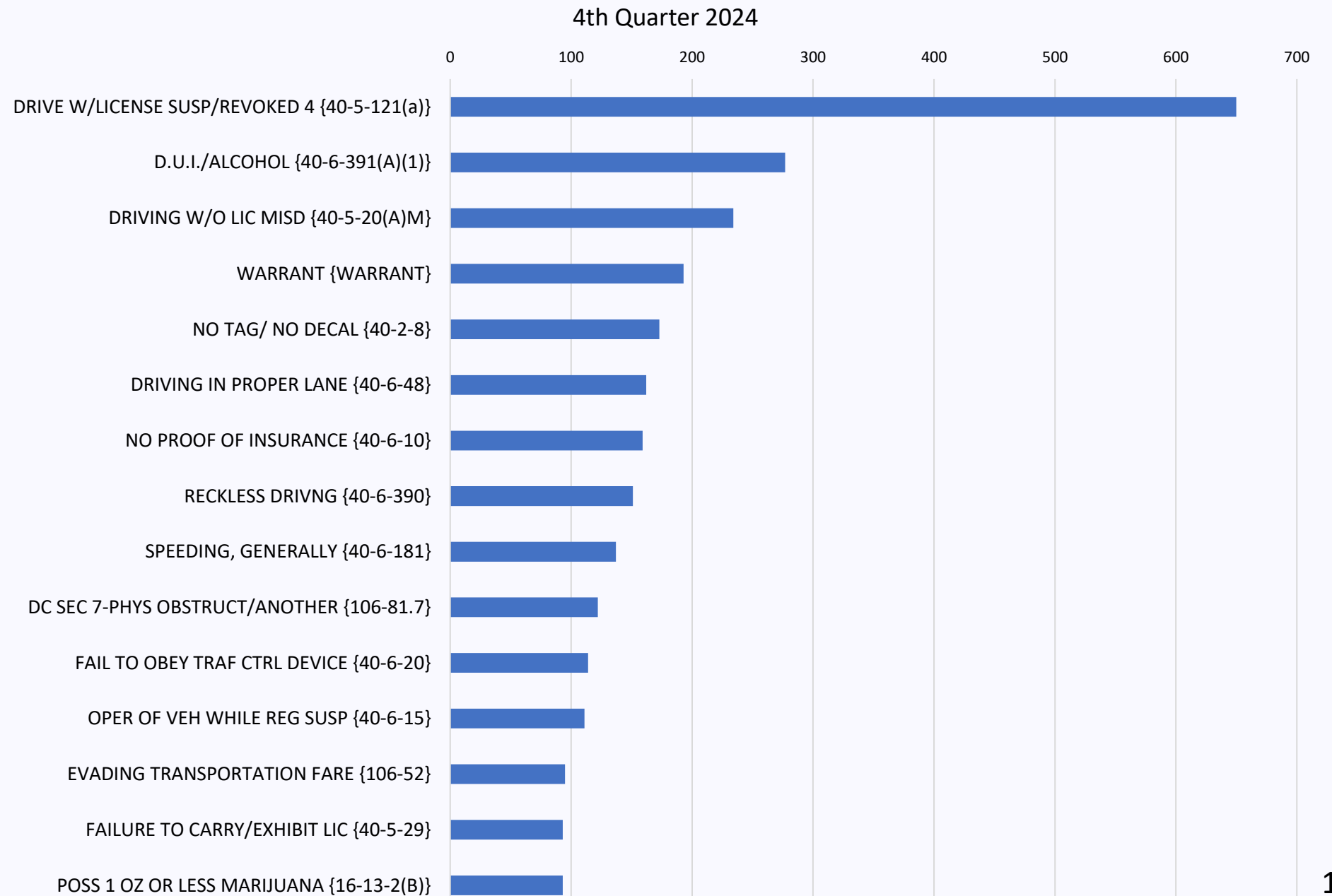

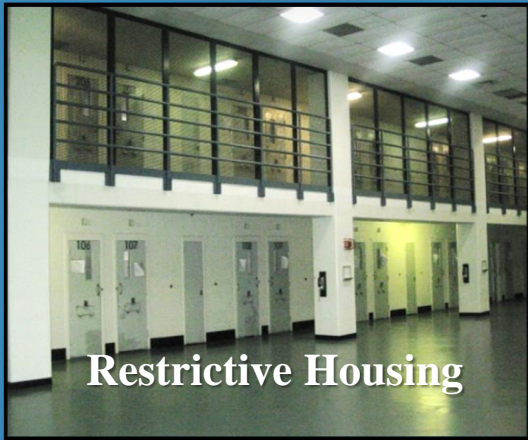

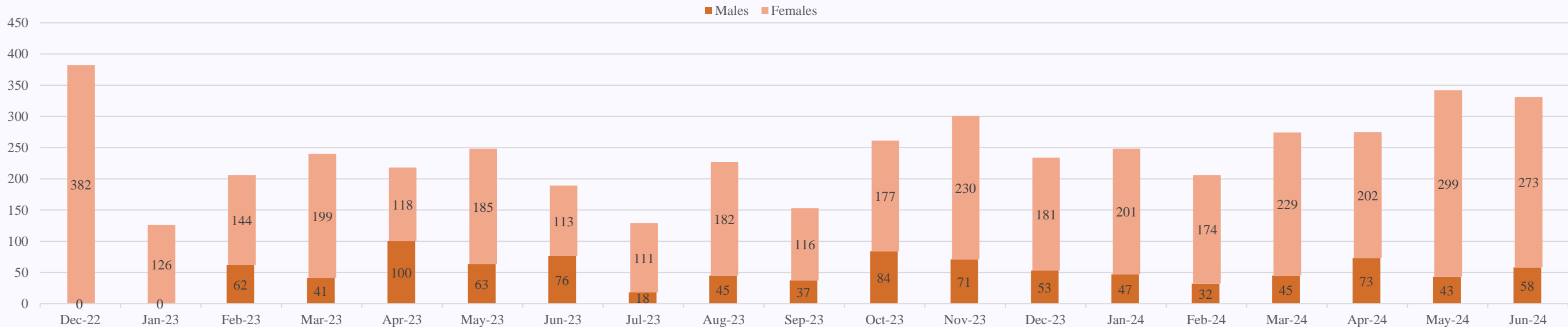
