






Volume by Workstream


Projects over 10,000 sq.ft.; New construction, multi-family alterations/additions

Light Commercial




Projects under 10,000 sq.ft; Multi-family alterations/additions

Residential





Types of Inspections







Planning Atlanta Together Initiative Mapping Neighborhood Assets

Neighborhood mapping tool using data layers to assist NPUs and neighborhoods with mapping out neighborhood resources, including:

Neighborhood economic assets

- Restaurants, bars, convenience stores, groceries, farmers markets;
- Educational institutions, libraries, childcare and adult care facilities
- Religious institutions
- Fire and police stations
- Neighborhood organizations
- Community improvement districts
- Parks and recreation facilities
- Waterways
- MARTA stops and stations



Love Our Places 2.0

Overview

Overall focus on transforming street space and City-owned property into active, vibrant and safer public places that can be used for events, relaxation, and everyday activities.

2017 - started as the "Placemaking Program"

- Worked with residents to design and implement functional, safe, and attractive infrastructure to address transportation safety as an integral part of their neighborhood.
- Partnered with ATLDOT to improve pedestrian and cyclist infrastructure.
- Resulted in Bus Shelter Enhancement and several Transportation Safety Designs.

2020 - Program shifted to include public space design

- Added Tactical Urbanism approach.
- Provided opportunities for economic and social activity during the pandemic.
- Resulted in 20 parklets and 12 bike amenity projects.

2025- Implement LOP 2.0

- Create vibrant and sustainable public environments through design assistance.
- Collaborative pre-permitting process for external community partners and stakeholders.
- "Experience 404" the community engagement function for LOP 2.0.

Potential Projects

Eligible project types would include:

- Plaza Activation/Design
- Pocket Parks
- Vacant Lot Activation/Design
- Bus Shelter Enhancement
- Signage/Wayfinding
- Parklets
- Physical Story-telling / History
- Public Art Elements

Project sizes could vary based on the location, property ownership, and potential program.

Riverlands Current Happenings

The Riverlands Segment 1 Trail

- Will build out a 1.1-mile portion of the Atlanta riverfront corridor that will connect to many regional trails like the Atlanta BeltLine, the Silver Comet Trail, the Whetstone Creek Trail and the Proctor Creek Greenway through Cobb County.
- RFP process is underway.
- Construction will start in January 2025 and be completed by FIFA World Cup in 2026.

Standing Peachtree Kayak Launch

- Installation began in September 2024
- Site will open in early December once construction is completed.

Whetstone Wetlands Greenspace

- Site of the PATH Whetstone trail that connects to the existing and planned network of Chattahoochee trails.
- Construction completion expected before the 2026 World Cup.

Chattahoochee Brick Company (CBC)

CBC EPA Brownfield Grant

- Awarded \$2 million EPA grant.
- Project period from October 1, 2023 to September 30, 2027.
- Total cost will be determined once additional soil testing is completed.
- Hosted EPA press conference on-site in August; generated positive local press coverage.
- CHA Consulting has been selected to manage the contract.

CBC Board

- Board final appointments made for a total of 11 members.
- Board meets quarterly to receive updates from the city, take public comment, and establish the board's vision for the site and its role as a conduit between the city and the public.





CBC Engagement and Collaboration

Partnership with NCCHR

- Being formalized to share resources and research.
- Project period from October 1, 2023 to September 30, 2027.
- Total cost will be determined once additional soil testing is completed.
- Hosted EPA press conference on-site in August.

CBC Lecture Series

 Engaged dialogue over the history and legacy of forced labor.

CBC Virtual Site Tour

 Collaborated with DWM to develop a virtual tour video, capturing the beauty and vastness of the site.


Affordable Housing

Welcome H.O.M.E.

- Transparent and streamlined approach to permitting affordable housing (AH) developments.
- Pre-submission program along with a dedicated coordination team to assist customers through all processes for approval and permitting.
- Depending on the project's scope, affordable housing project workflow can take one of two routes: Conventional or Entitlement.
- Reduced time from application to permit issuance.
