

Sources of Funding

FEMA

- March 13th COVID 19 Declared a National Emergency
- Funds Became Available to Assist
 Jurisdictions to Respond and Recover, 50%
 Advance Projection for Next 90 Days
- WTW/Landmark will Assist with Navigating and Managing the Complex Process Associated With Responding and Recovering
- Only Eligible Costs Associated With Responding and Recovery are Eligible for Reimbursement
- Documentation is Critical in the Recovery Process

CARES Act

- Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act
- Supplemental Funding for COVID-19
- Provides for Direct Payments to Eligible Local Governments
- The City of Atlanta was Deemed Eligible
- Funds Can only be Used For:
 - Necessary Expenditure-COVID 19;
 - Cost Not Accounted for in the Most
 - Recent Budget as of March 27, 2020
 - Cost Incurred between March 27, 2020 and December 30, 2020
- City has received its allocation
