AFCRA is a State Created Authority

- Established by Georgia State legislature in 1960 with House Bill 999
- AFCRA was created to acquire, construct, equip, maintain and operate athletic facilities and related facilities in connection with athletic stadiums, recreational centers, athletic fields, club houses, and gymnasiums for events related to sports, religious, political, musical, educational and other recreational purposes.
- Since inception, AFCRA has evolved to expand its scope of services beyond managing the assets of the Atlanta Fulton County Stadium and surrounding lots. Today, AFCRA manages the following assets on behalf of the City of Atlanta and Fulton County:
 - State Farm Arena
 - Zoo Atlanta
 - Gateway Parking Deck at Grant Park
 - John A. White Park Golf Course
 - FanPlex – 768 Hank Aaron Drive
 - Parking Lots and Billboards Surrounding Old Turner Field Stadium
 - Stadium Neighborhood Community Trust Fund

AFCRA manages the payment and fund accounting for the funds on deposit, which includes insuring fund requests are properly documented and the City's investment in the community is protected.
