THE GOAL OF ONE ATLANTA:

To provide a pathway to affordable and equitable housing opportunities for all who desire to call Atlanta home.

Create or preserve 20,000 affordable homes by 2026 and increase overall supply.

- 1. Leverage vacant land for public housing
- 2. Create and expand housing affordability tools
- 3. Revise the zoning code

Invest \$1B from public, private, and philanthropic sources to produce and preserve affordable housing

- 4. Maximize existing funding sources
- 5. Develop new funding sources
- **6.** Increase philanthropic and private investment in affordable housing



Ensure equitable growth for all Atlantans and minimize displacement

- 7. Prevent involuntary displacement
- **8.** Explore expansion of property tax programs for creation and preservation of affordable housing

On October 19, 2020, Mayor Bottoms Issued an Administrative Order Calling for the Creation of a City-wide Anti-Displacement Tax Fund Program

Context



- Homeowners fear displacement in anticipation of community revitalization efforts driving higher home appraisals, property appreciation and ultimately higher property taxes.
- Proposed Goal: No current homeowners will be displaced due to the inability to pay a rise in property taxes.

Approach



- Deploy \$4.6M of the Gulch Housing Trust Fund
- The Anti-Displacement Tax Fund Program will help pay for increases to homeowners' existing property tax bills.
- The fund may operate as a grant to individuals and may not require participants to pay back any funds received.

Owner Households by Income, 2014 - 2018




Table 1: Number of Owner Households by Income, 2014-18
