Planning Dept's Tree Ordinance Draft

 Some additions are positive and Planning Dept team worked with Citizens Group

But important parts are regressive with loopholes

Some parts are complicated and unworkable

In some ways the current TPO works better

The Citizens Blended Draft

 Citizens Group takes best of the Planning Dept draft, but fixes the loopholes and has clearer, simpler language

 Blended Draft protects trees and makes a more consistent process for builders

Appeals

 Planning Dept eliminates public appeals, with only a private process for immediate neighbors

 Blended Draft restores tree appeals to any citizen within the NPU or an adjacent NPU

Protection for Existing Trees

 Planning Dept draft allows Priority trees to be cut before any protections apply, even if a builder doesn't need to cut them

 Blended draft removes this loophole and equally protects all Priority Trees

Pre-Application Conference

 Planning Dept draft mentions the Pre-Application Conference but includes limited vague criteria

- Blended Draft has clear, consistent standards to ensure a smooth and practical use of the Pre-Application Conference
- Pre-Application Conference helps most builders and developers, and reduces appeals

Multifamily, Commercial, Subdivisions

- Planning Dept draft has zero tree protection for multifamily, commercial or subdivision sites
- Blended draft includes minimum protection for trees on all properties, especially residential
- Blended draft includes innovative concepts of "cluster design" and "cap and trade" to encourage permanent protection of trees and greenspace while allowing flexibility in site plans

Penalties for Illegal Tree Removal

 Planning Dept. draft includes registering tree cutters to work in the City, but gives only a written warning for the first illegal tree removal

 Blended Draft adds stronger penalties for illegal tree cutting, including revoking a license to cut trees in the City for 3-5 years for repeat violators

Priority Tree Values

 Planning Dept draft undervalues trees – so even champion trees of some species would not qualify as Priority trees

 Blended Draft tree values are science-based, in a comprehensive, easy-to-use chart

Trees in Setbacks

 Planning Dept draft removes protection for trees in setbacks, including Priority Trees

 Blended Draft restores current protections for trees in setbacks

Recompense and Replanting

 Planning Dept. has complicated planting requirements, including planting trees on private property that cannot be tracked, and allows no recompense to be paid

 Blended Draft is much simpler: recompense is paid for trees cut, trees are replanted where there's room, discounts given for new trees
