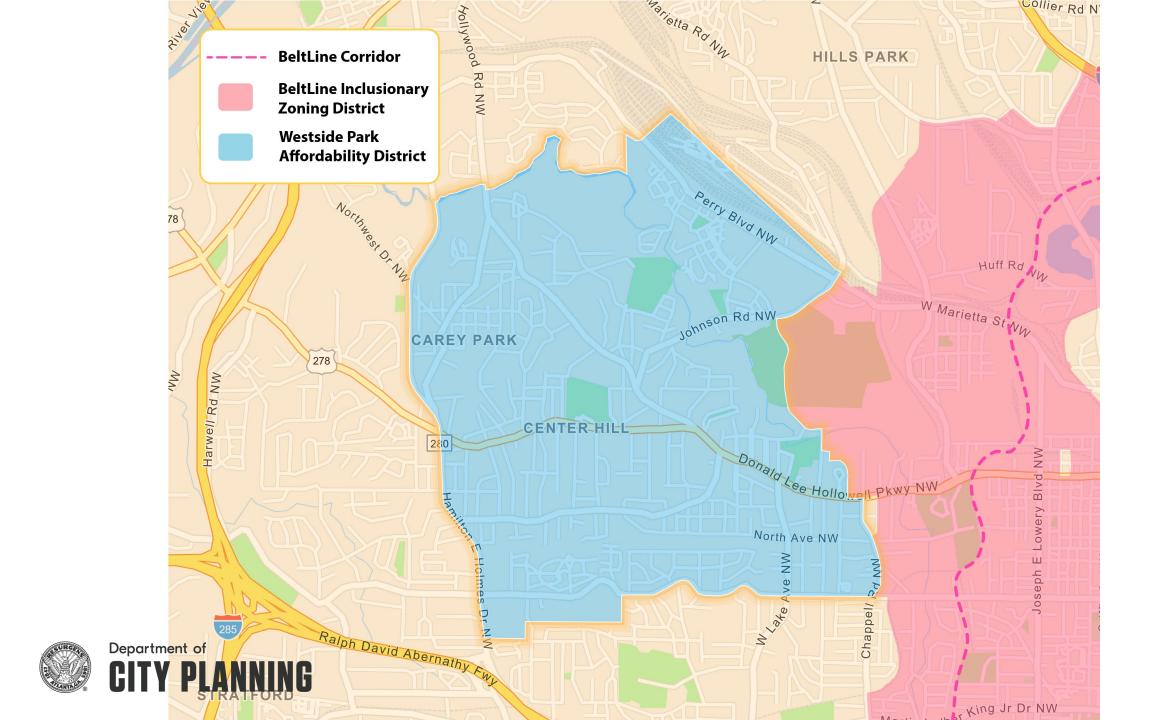

## Purpose of Legislation

- Growing concerns around housing affordability in the neighborhoods surrounding the new Westside Park
- Significant investment may drive development that increases the cost of housing
- The Affordability District would ensure that a portion of new housing is affordable to middle-income workforce residents as residential development continues
- Mixed-income communities increase access to quality schools, jobs, and amenities for people across the economic spectrum





## **Affordability Requirements**

- For new developments with at least 10 units
- 20-year affordability requirement or option for an in-lieu fee (funds would be used to construct affordable housing)
- Rental Housing
  - Set aside 15% of units to be affordable to households at or below 80% AMI
  - Set aside 10% of units to be affordable to households at or below 60% AMI
- For-sale developments will be required to set aside 10% of units as affordable, with an even mixture of households at 80% and 120% of Area Median Income (AMI).
  - For example, a development with 40 units would have 2 units at 80% of AMI and 2 units at 120% of AMI.
