Current ERA Program

- City entered into an agreement with United Way of Greater Atlanta,
 Inc. for \$22M for an Emergency Housing Assistance Program
- Recap of assistance from August 21, 2020 February 26, 2021
 - Over 5,900 households approved and provided funding support
 - Over \$17.4M Disbursed
 - \$15.6M for rental assistance
 - \$755k for mortgage assistance
 - \$1M for utilities
 - \$95k for security deposits
 - All funds will be disbursed before March 31, 2021





Lessons Learned

- An on-line solution only works for a segment of the population
- In-person outreach is important
- A smaller cohort of nonprofit partners are essential to reaching families and coordinate services
- Ramp up time must not be underestimated
- Eligibility requirements varied across jurisdictions and the stringent documentation requirements were barriers to families who needed the resources
- Eligibility and documentation needs must be finalized before the program begins
- Begin Compliance early on in the program





The "New" ERA Program

- City received \$15.2M for the United States Department of Treasury Emergency Rental Assistance Program
- Program limits eligibility to households with income that does not exceed 80% of AMI

Maximum Income Limits – 80% AMI (HUD FY2020)					
# of persons in household	1	2	3	4	5
Maximum annual income limits	\$46,320	\$52,960	\$59,600	\$66,160	\$71,520
Est maxi monthly income limits	\$3,860	\$4,413	\$4,966	\$5,513	\$5,960

 Residents affected by unemployment for 90 days or more, and households with incomes at or below the 50% of AMI, will be prioritized





The "New" ERA Program

- Continue the partnership with United Way of Greater Atlanta (and they will partner with 8 Service Providers)
- Program Period: April 1, 2021 December 31, 2021
- Launch of in-person applicants April 1
- Launch of the online portal May 1
- Providers will target 4,000 Applicants @ \$3,000 average payment with a max of \$15,000





The "New" ERA Program

- ERA funds may be used for **rent and rental arrears** back to March 13, 2020
- Landlords can apply directly
- Mortgage assistance is not permissible
- ERA funds may be used for utilities (water, gas, power) and home energy costs
- Payments will be made directly to landlords and utility companies
