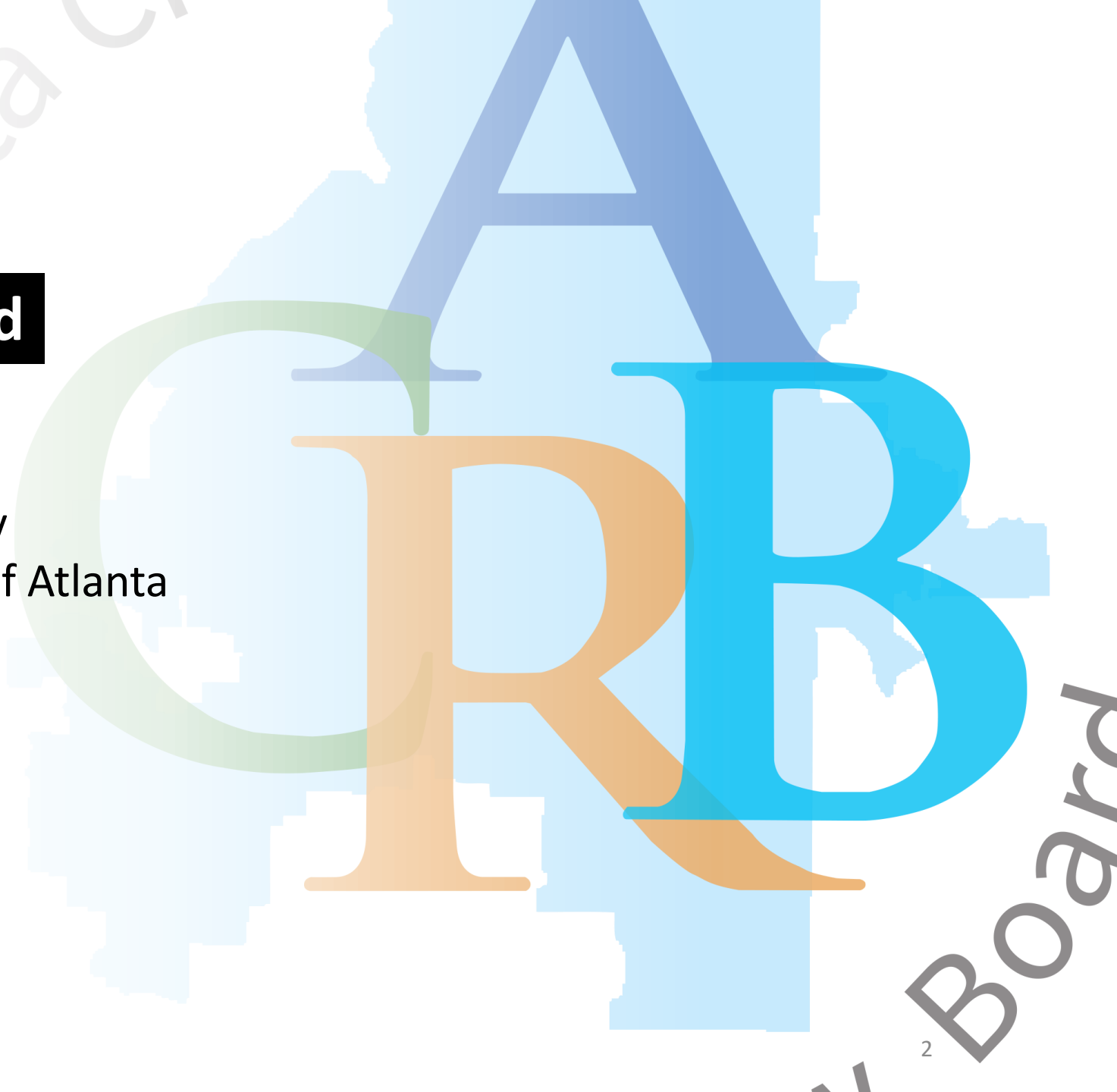

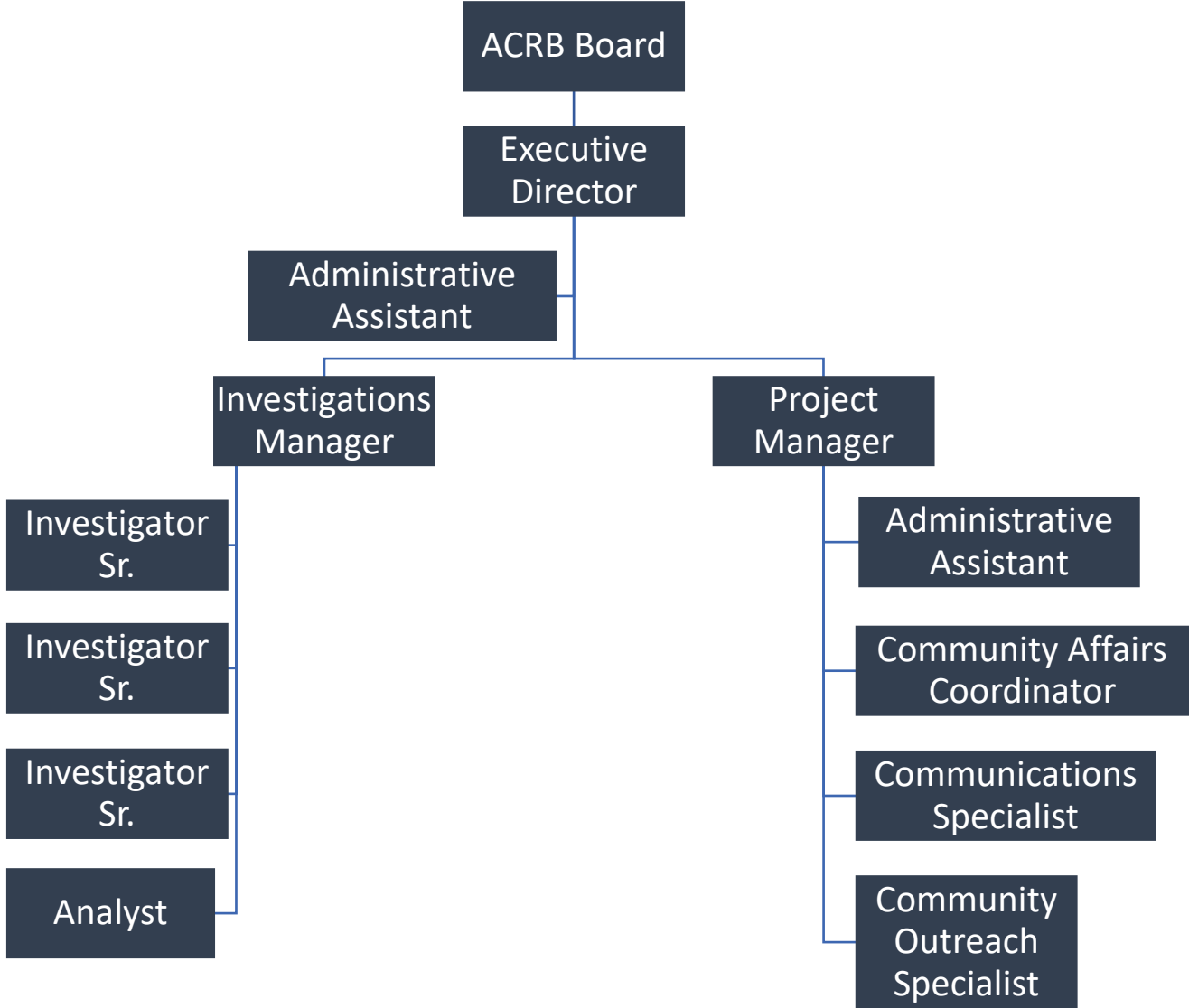

Complaint Data

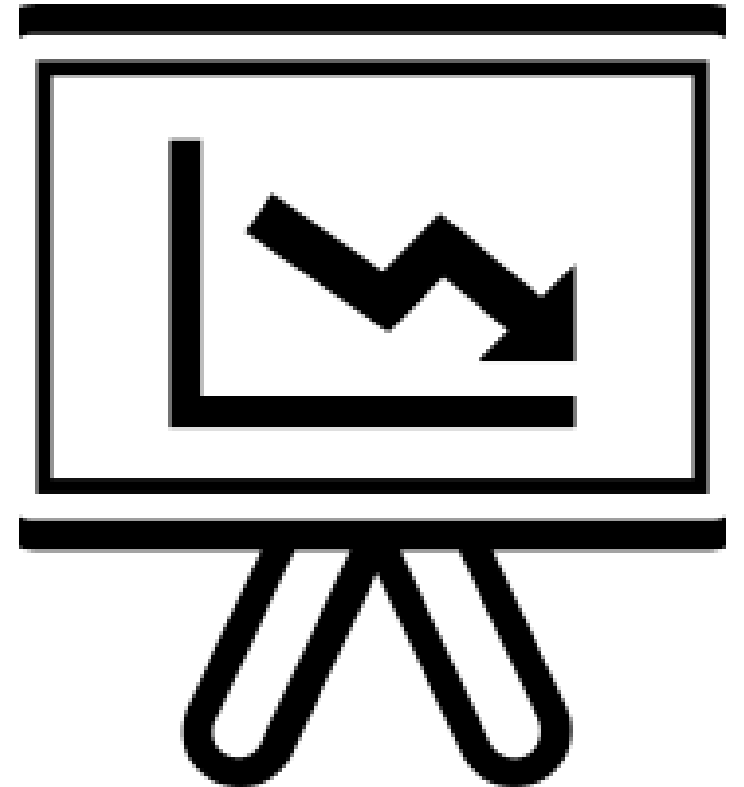
January through December 2020 Data:

- Special Call Meetings – 4

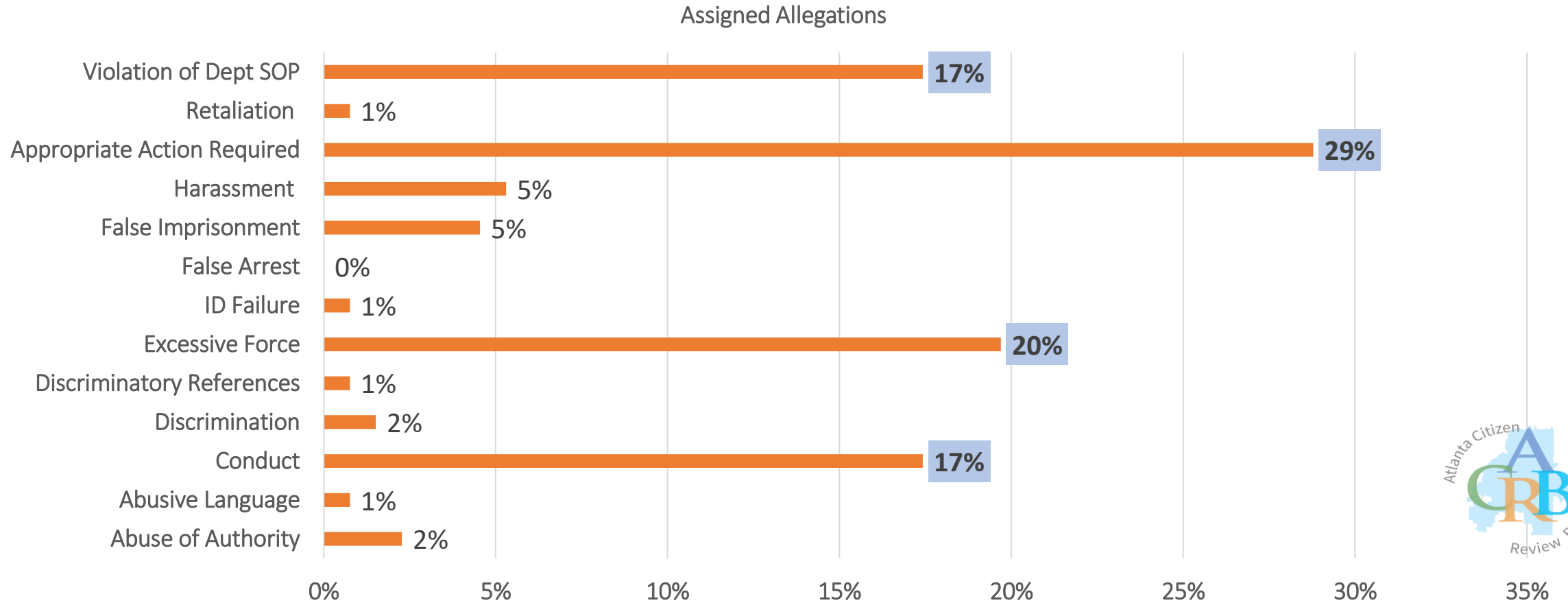

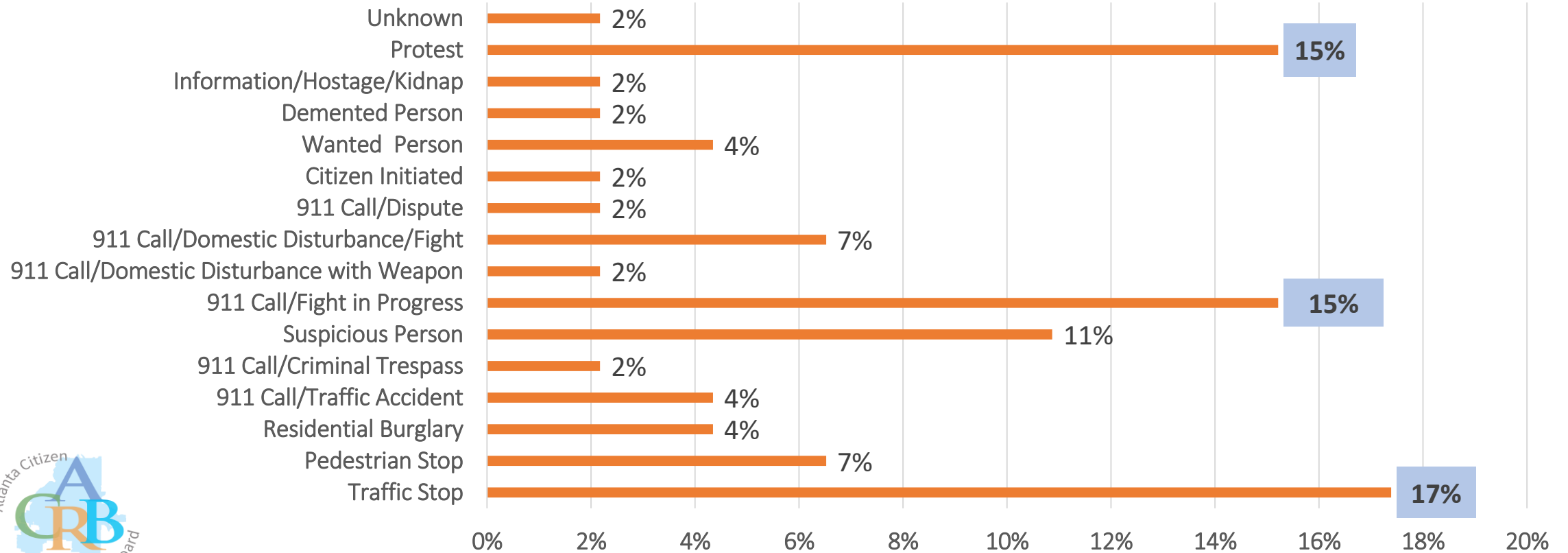


2020 ACRB Select Data

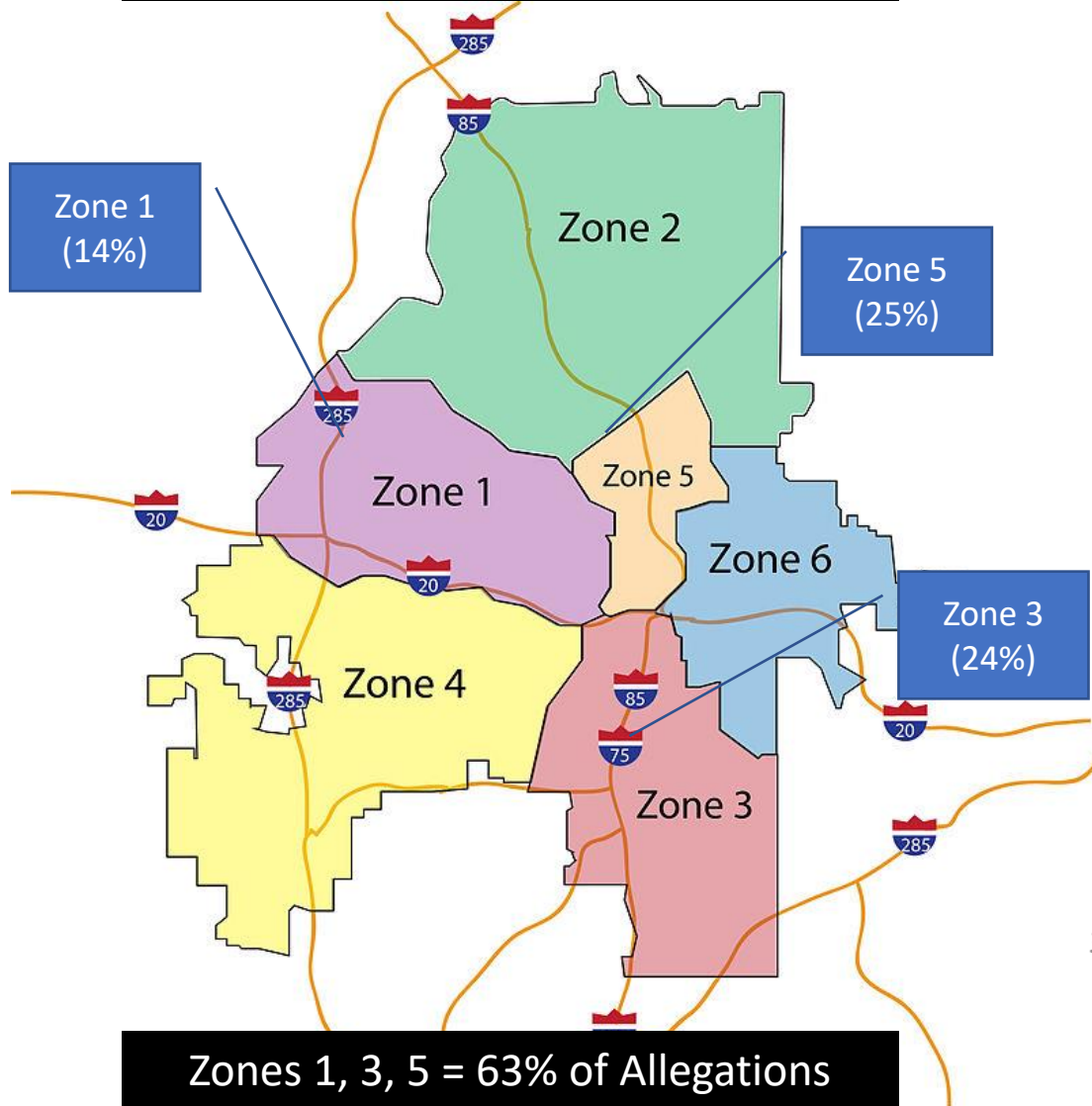

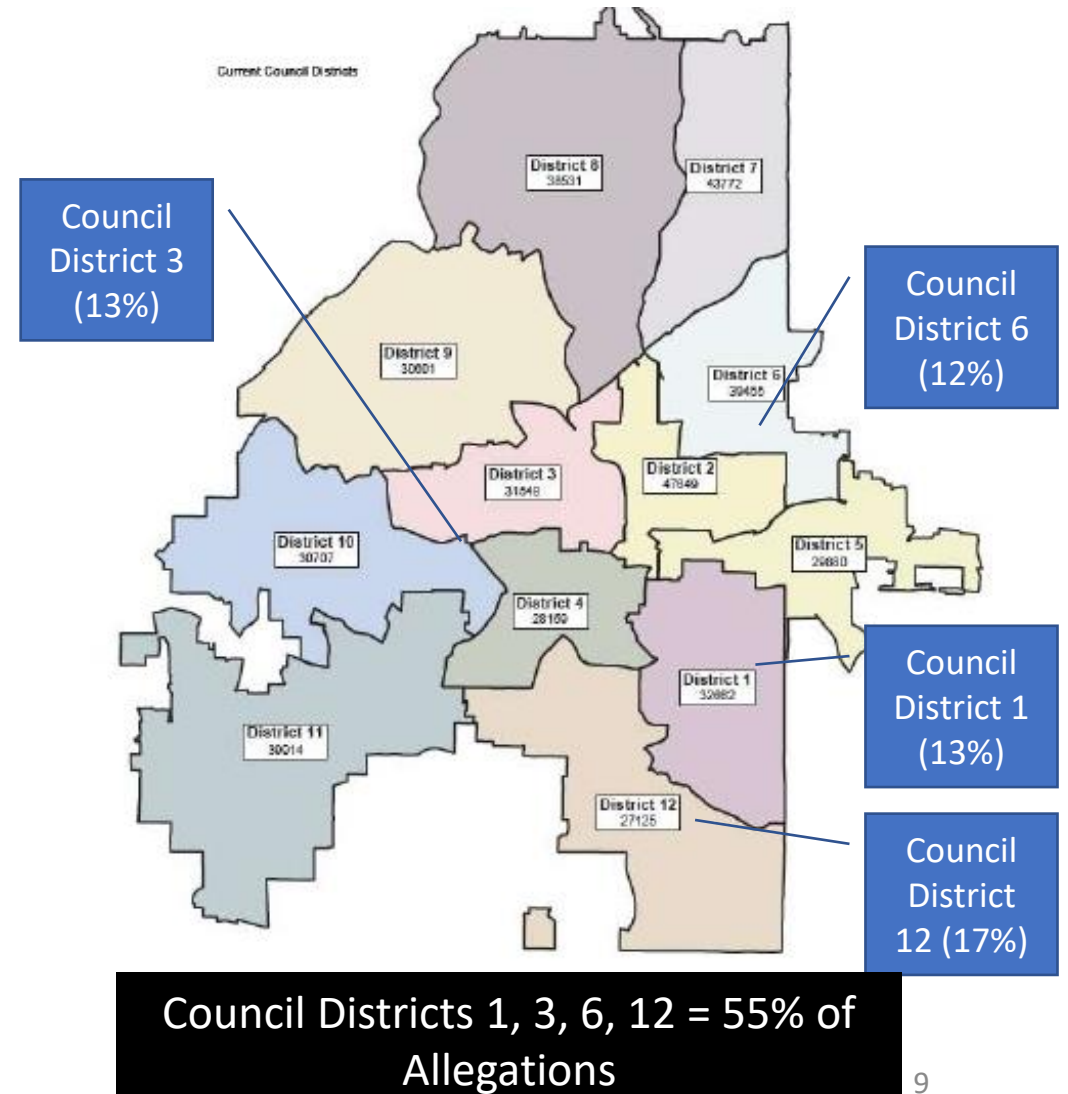

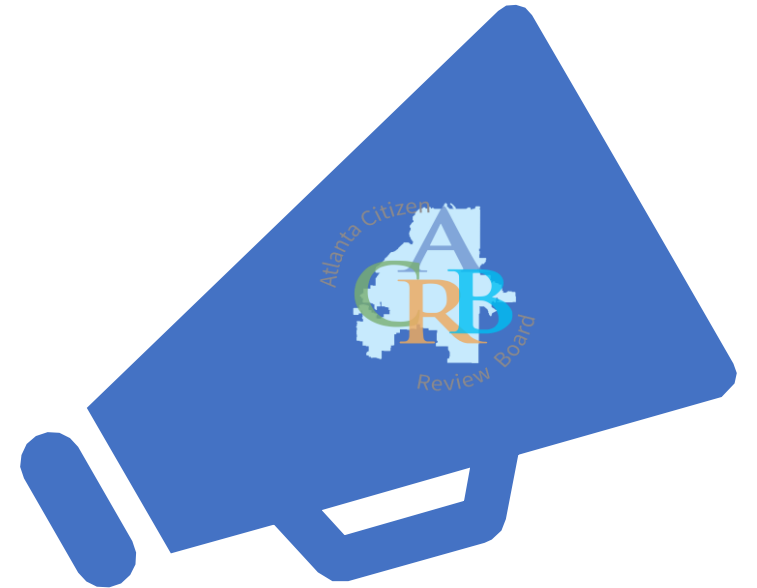
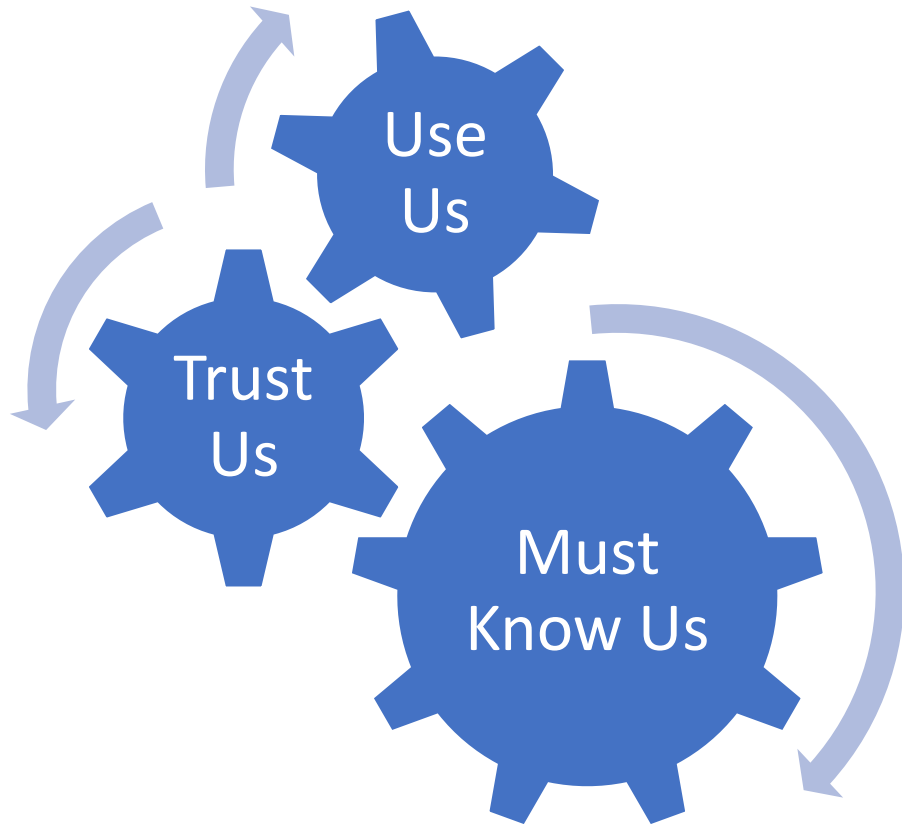
2020 Pending Decisions on ACRB Sustained Allegations as of March 3, 2021

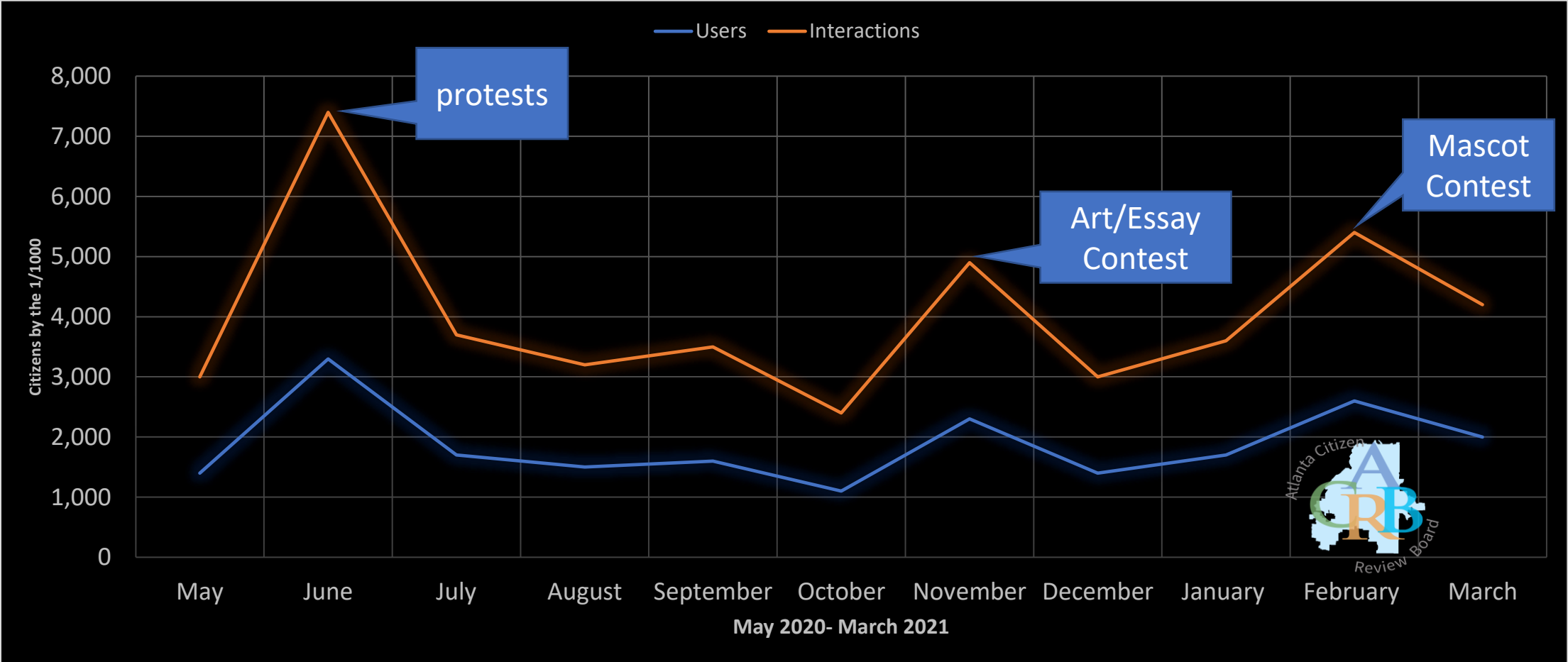
