Westside Trail Grand Opening – September 29, 2017

- 3-mile multi-use corridor
- Connects greenspace, schools
- 14 access points, 11 of which are ADA accessible
- Largest Atlanta BeltLine trail opened to date





Eastside Trail extension

- Phase I – Irwin St. to Kirkwood Ave.
- Adds 1 mile to Eastside Trail
