- v. Slow draw down process for federal funds
- b. Service Providers / Non-Profits
 - i. Slow expenditure rates
 - ii. Limited service provider capacity to manage federal grants

Plan of Action to Address Challenges



- a. Hire and retain qualified staff
- b. Retain third-party consultants
- c. Resolve backlog of reimbursements

 Pay oldest reimbursement requests fully received in 2019 and 2020

 by April 1, 2022 and remaining 2021 outstanding reimbursement
 requests by June 30, 2022
- d. Transitioned to a monitoring-based approach for reimbursement submission January 31, 2022 and comply with 30-day payment requirement
- e. Conduct ongoing training for service providers
- f. Issue improved notices of funding availability (NOFA)
- g. Conduct draw downs monthly
- h. Procure and implement an improved grant management system
