




Permitting

The Construction Value of projects in the city is the highest in the City's history, even when adjusted for


inflation.




The Department issued the most permits in FY17 than ever before.





Average Express Permit Time (Minutes)




Average Express Permit Process Time as of October 2017




Permit Volume per Work Stream per Month Fiscal **Year** 17 – October 2017

Zoning Diagnostics

The City of Atlanta Zoning Ordinance divides the City into zones or districts that regulate the physical development of land and prescribes the uses that are allowed. Zoning districts further regulate the height, overall size, and placement of buildings on a lot, the density at which buildings may be constructed, and the number of parking spaces that must accompany a new building.

The full rewrite of the zoning code is an extensive multi-year process. In 2016, a consultant team studied the Zoning Ordinance and proposed "Quick Fix" changes that would be implemented sooner. Examples of some of these proposed short-term and longer-term changes are listed below.















The City of Atlanta Department of City Planning invites you to participate in the following opportunities to align our zoning regulations more closely to the Atlanta City Design. The Atlanta Zoning Ordinance Update "Quick Fixes" is a project conducted by the Office of Zoning and Development to make a series of improvements to the current Zoning Ordinance.
