#### MUNICIPAL COURT OF ATLANTA CORE PURPOSE

- To provide a fair and impartial forum for cases to be decided and all parties, including residents to participate and be heard;
- To hear cases regarding laws passed by the city (ordinances) that are specific to the city;
- To provide attention to matters directly concerning the city and its communities; and
  - To require accountability for conduct within the city's jurisdiction to manage outcomes.

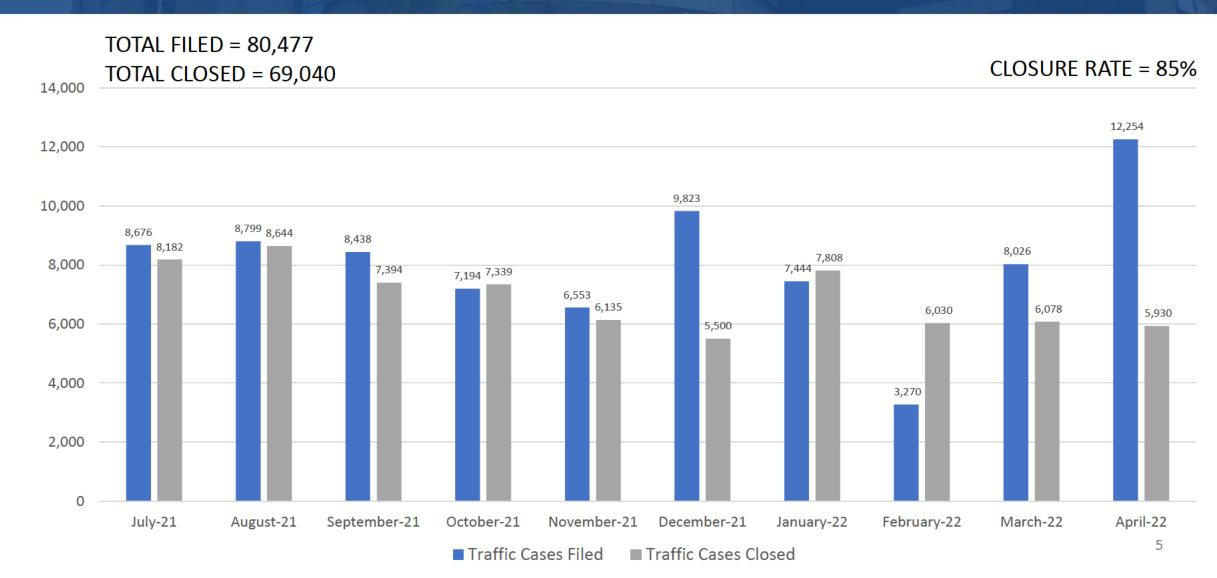

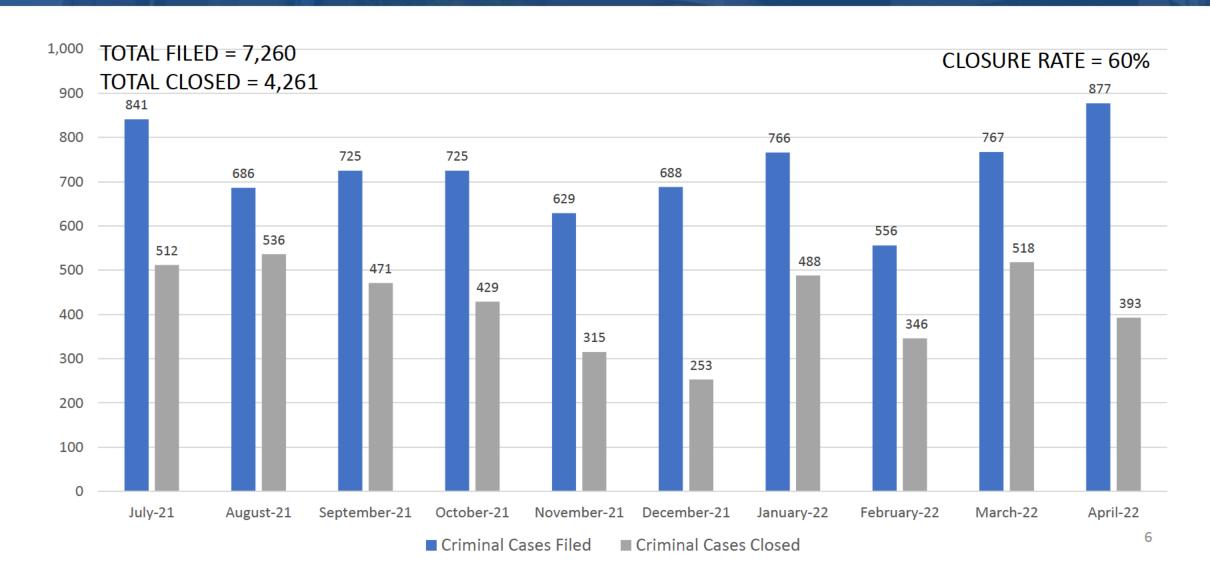

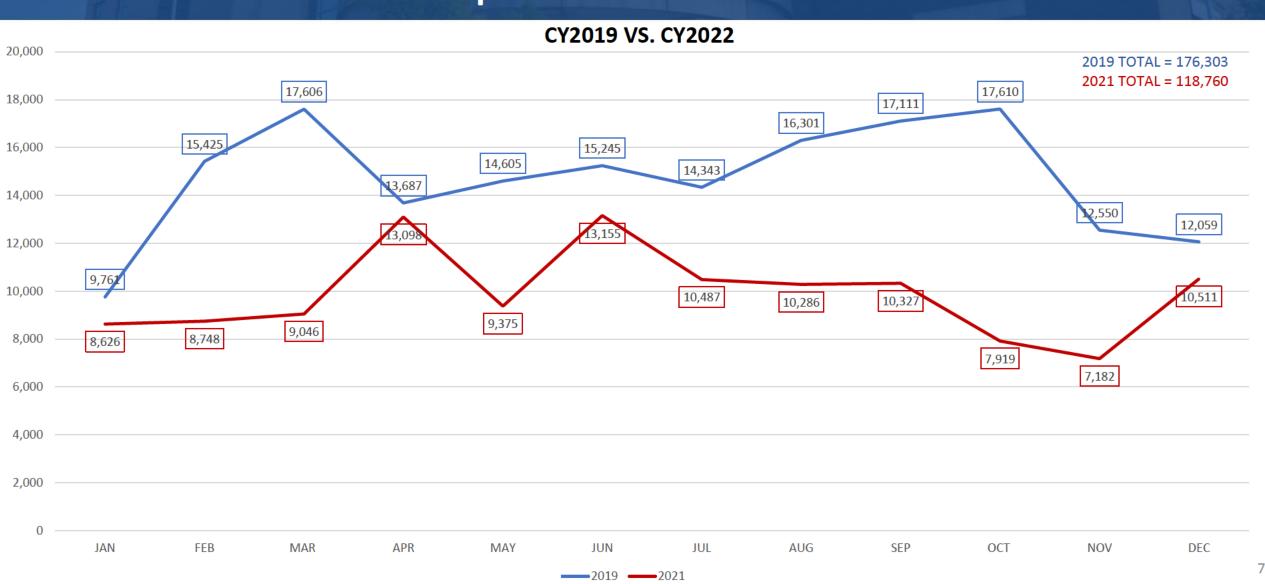
# COURT OPERATIONS | FY22 TRAFFIC CASE METRICS



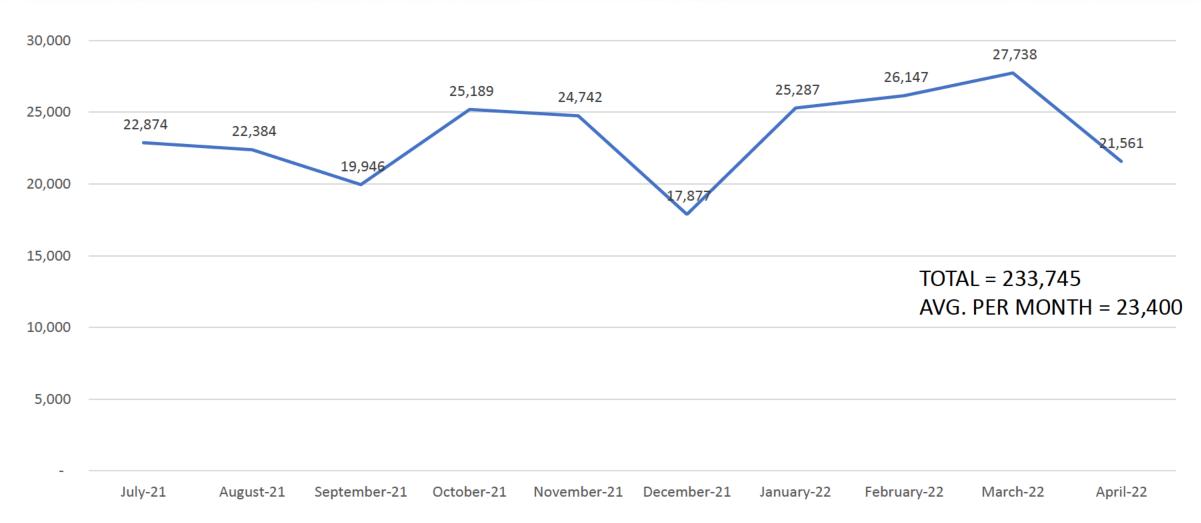
# COURT OPERATIONS | FY22 CRIMINAL CASE METRICS

<u>TLC (Teens Learning Control)</u>: an alternative sentencing program that provides offenders under the age of 25 an opportunity to learn about Georgia traffic laws in order to improve driving skills and decision-making skills.

<u>Restorative Justice</u>: an alternative sentencing program for individuals under the age of 25 meant to provide defendants with opportunities for further education and resources to learn meaningful coping and decision-making skills to prevent future offenses.

<u>Homeless Court Program</u>: an alternative, court-based program that connects individuals experiencing homelessness with needed services as a mandatory means of case resolution.
